**NOTES:** Greenville clinched their 1st South Atlantic League Championship in franchise history on Friday, September 15th, by defeating Kannapolis, 8-3...**3B Bobby Dalbec** (2-for-4, 2 R, RBI) gave the Drive a 1-0 lead in the 1st, and the club added 2 more runs on an Intimidators' fielding error later in the frame...After starter **RHP Hildemaro Requena** (4.2 IP, 9 H, 3 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO) squandered the lead by allowing 1 run in the 3rd and 2 runs in the 4th, Greenville plated 5 runs in the bottom of the 6th inning...**2B Brett Netzer** (2-for-3, BB, 2, 3 RBI) hit a 3-run double in the frame, putting the Drive ahead by the final margin, 8-3...Netzer led the league with a .429 postseason batting average (12-for-28) while driving in 8 runs...**RHP Hunter Smith** earned the win after striking out 4 Intimidators over 2.1 no-hit relief innings.
