BALTIMORE ORIOLES (5-10) at BOSTON RED SOX (12-2)

RHP Dylan Bundy (0-1, 1.35) vs. LHP Chris Sale (1-0, 1.06)

42: Today, all of baseball will commemorate the 71st anniversary of Jackie Robinson's first Major League game for the Brooklyn Dodgers on April 15, 1947...Robinson's uniform No. 42 was retired by the Dodgers in 1972 and in 1997, the 50th anniversary of his breaking of baseball's color barrier, Major League Baseball permanently retired his uniform number league-wide...Jackie Robinson Day has been celebrated throughout baseball on April 15 each year since 2004 and every player and all on-field personnel has celebrated Robinson's legacy by wearing his No. 42 during games scheduled on Jackie Robinson Day since 2009...Each player's game-worn No. 42 jersey will be authenticated, autographed, and auctioned to benefit the Jackie Robinson Foundation.

EXIT STRATEGY: Pedro Álvarez went 2-for-3 on Saturday with a walk and his second home run of the season...He has a .423 (11-for-26) average in 10 career games against the Red Sox with six runs, two doubles, three home runs, and five RBI...According to Statcast, the exit velocity (115.9 mph) on Álvarez's home run on Saturday at Boston is tied for ninth-highest in the majors this season.

MAKE MINE A DOUBLE: In the 12th inning of last Sunday's game at New York, the Orioles turned a 1-2-5 double play when a bases-loaded grounder to RHP Brad Brach was thrown to C Caleb Joseph and was completed with a throw by Joseph to 3B Tim Beckham...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 1-2-5 double play was the first of its kind in the majors since September 7, 2012 when the Houston Astros (RHP Lucas Harrell, C Chris Snyder, 3B Matt Dominguez) did so against the Cincinnati Reds...Also, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Sunday's 12th-inning two-out play marked the first 1-2-5 double play in Orioles history.

GRAND CENTRAL STATION: OF Adam Jones hit his 250th career home run as a center fielder last Thursday night at Yankee Stadium...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 250 homers hit while playing center field rank 13th all-time in Major League history...He also ranks fifth all-time among American League hitters...Among AL hitters, he trails Mickey Mantle (432), Ken Griffey, Jr. (382), Fred Lynn (266), and Bernie Williams (261)...Willie Mays is the all-time leader with 640 home runs as a center fielder.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 2000, Cal Ripken, Jr. notched his 3,000th career hit, a single at Minnesota off RHP Hector Carrasco...Playing in his 2,800th game, Ripken became the 24th player to reach the 3,000 career hit milestone and the seventh player to amass 3,000 hits and 400 home runs in Major League history.

VS. BOSTON: The Orioles and Red Sox play the third game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The Red Sox lead the season series, 2-0...The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 10-9...Baltimore trails Boston in the all-time series, 489-565, with the O's trailing 249-280 at home and trailing 240-285 at Boston.

OPENING DAY: The Orioles defeated the Twins, 3-2, in 11 innings on Opening Day at Oriole Park...The O's have won eight consecutive Opening Day games (since 2011) and have won 15 of their last 18 openers...The O's are now 43-22 all-time on Opening Day...According to STATS, LLC., the O's eight consecutive Opening Day wins are tied for sixth all-time and rank first in Orioles history...The Orioles won seven straight Opening Day games from 1970-76...Adam Jones hit a walk-off home run in the 11th inning in the season opener...Last year, Mark Trumbo also hit an 11th-inning walk-off homer in the Orioles season opener...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Orioles are the first team in Major League history to hit an Opening Day walk-off home run in consecutive seasons...The Orioles also won in walk-off fashion on Opening Day in 2016 when Matt Wieters hit a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth inning on April 4, 2016 vs. Minnesota.

DISABLED LIST: Five Orioles are currently on the disabled list...INF/OF Mark Trumbo (right quad strain, retroactive to 3/26), RHP Gabriel Ynoa (right shin stress reaction, retroactive to 3/26), OF Colby Rasmus (left hip flexor strain, since 4/7), and 2B Jonathan Schoop (right oblique strain, since 4/14) are on the 10-day disabled list...LHP Zach Britton (right Achilles surgery, since 2/15) is on the 60-day disabled list.

SIX PACK: Since the beginning of the 2012 season, Orioles hitters lead the majors with 1,353 home runs hit and also lead the majors in fewest number of errors committed with 508...Several current hitters rank among Major League leaders in home runs since 2012...Chris Davis ranks second with 224, Adam Jones ranks seventh with 179, and Mark Trumbo is tied for 11th with 172 home runs...Also since 2012, the Orioles rank first among American League clubs with 288 wins at home.

HOMER HAPPY: The Orioles hit 232 home runs in 2017 to rank fifth in the majors...The Orioles were tied for the Major League lead in homers after the All-Star break with 109...The O's have led the majors in home runs in three of the past six seasons (2016, 2014, 2013), finishing second in 2012, third in 2015, and fifth in 2017...For four of the past five seasons, the Major League leader in home runs was an Oriole (Chris Davis in 2013, Nelson Cruz in 2014, Chris Davis in 2015, and Mark Trumbo in 2016).

FEEL THE DRAFT: The Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft will be held from Monday, June 4 through Wednesday, June 6 at MLB Network's Studio 42 in Secaucus, NJ...Rounds one and two and both competitive balance rounds will take place on Monday, with rounds 3-10 on Tuesday, and rounds 11-40 on Wednesday...The draft will air on MLB Network and MLB.com...The Orioles own three picks in the top 100 of the 2018 Draft; the No. 11, 37, and 87 overall selections.

SIZING UP THE SLATE: The 2018 Interleague schedule features visits to Baltimore by the Philadelphia Phillies (May 15-16), Washington Nationals (May 28-30), New York Mets (August 14-15), and Miami Marlins (June 15-17)...The Orioles' road schedule against NL opponents includes visits to the Mets (June 5-6), as well as a series in Washington to play the Nationals (June 19-21), Atlanta Braves (June 22-24), and Phillies (July 3-4) as part of Interleague Play...The O's home schedule also consists of four games played on national holidays including Easter (April 1 vs. MIN), Mother's Day (May 13 vs. TB), Memorial Day (May 28 vs. WSH), and Father's Day (June 17 vs. MIA)...Other important dates this season include a two-game series between the Twins and Indians in San Juan, Puerto Rico on April 17-18; the first day of the 2018 MLB Draft on Monday, June 4; and All-Star Week at Nationals Park in Washington, DC from July 15-17, culminating with the 89th Midsummer Classic...The final day of the 2018 regular season, featuring 12 divisional games, is scheduled for Sunday, September 30.

ORIOLES HALL OF FAME: Former 2B Brian Roberts has been elected to the Orioles Hall of Fame...Additionally, long-time Orioles Radio broadcaster Fred Manfra will be inducted as this year's Herb Armstrong Award winner...Roberts and Manfra will be honored at a luncheon at Oriole Park on August 10, as well as during an on-field ceremony prior to the August 11 game...Roberts played 13 seasons with the Orioles from 2001-13, compiling a .278 batting average and 1,452 hits...He ranks first in O's history among second baseman in all major offensive categories...Drafted by Baltimore in the first round of the 1999 First-Year Player Draft (No. 50 overall), Roberts was a two-time All-Star (2005 and 2007)...Roberts will provide analysis for select games on the Orioles Radio Network this season...Before retiring in 2017, Manfra spent 24 years with the Orioles Radio Network...The East Baltimore native and Patterson High School graduate joined Orioles Radio broadcasts in 1993...In his 47-year broadcasting career, Manfra covered numerous O's highlights and other marquee sporting events.

COACHING STAFF: The O's welcomed back each member of the coaching staff from 2017...2018 marks the second season for Howie Clark (assistant hitting), Roger McDowell (pitching), and Alan Mills (bullpen); the fourth for Scott Coolbaugh (hitting); and sixth season for Bobby Dickerson (third base) and Einar Diaz (coach); while Wayne Kirby (first base) and John Russell (bench) return for their eighth years on the staff.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), Buck Showalter is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (627-579, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,509 career wins rank 23rd all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy and Mike Scioscia...His 627 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Will be making his fourth start of the 2018 season...Made a career-high 28 starts last season and won a career-high 13 games...The Orioles went 16-12, the only Orioles starter with a winning record in his starts (minimum two starts)...Threw 90-or-more pitches in 26 of his 28 starts (threw 89 and 76 in his last two starts respectively)...Made 19 Quality Starts last season, tied for the eighth-most in the AL and tied for 16th-most in MLB... **Bundy has struck out eight-or-more batters in four consecutive road starts dating back to last season, the first pitcher in Orioles history to accomplish that feat.**

LAST START: Bundy was dealt his first loss of the season on April 9 vs. Toronto...Surrendered two earned runs on four hits, one home run, with two walks and a season-high 10 strikeouts in 7.0 innings...Marked his fourth career start with 10-or-more strikeouts, and first since striking out a career-high 12 batters on August 29, 2017 vs. Seattle...Both runs allowed came on a two-run homer by Steve Pearce in the third inning; was the first home run Bundy has allowed in 2018 and snapped a streak of four starts without allowing a home run dating back to September 4, 2017...Threw 101 pitches, 66 strikes.

CAREER VS. BOSTON: Bundy will be making his ninth career start (13th appearance) against the Red Sox...He has gone 3-4 with a 5.01 ERA (28 ER/50.1 IP) in his previous 12 games against Boston...Last faced the Red Sox on September 18, 2017 and took the loss after allowing six runs on seven hits in 4.1 innings...As a starter, Bundy is 3-4 with a 5.28 ERA (26 ER/44.1 IP) with three Quality Starts and a .291 average against (50-for-172) in eight starts against Boston.

VS. AL EAST: This will be Bundy's second consecutive start against a divisional opponent...He will be making his 23rd career start (34th appearance) against an AL East opponent; he owns a career record of 9-10 with a 4.48 ERA (69 ER/138.2 IP) against them, including 8-10 and a 4.75 ERA (64 ER/122.1 IP) in his 22 starts...Last season, Bundy went 6-5 and posted a 3.80 ERA (35 ER/83.0 IP) with 10 Quality Starts in 14 games against the division; the Orioles went 7-7 in those games.

ON THE ROAD: Tonight marks Bundy's second road start of 2018...He made 12 road starts last season, and went 6-4 with a 4.30 ERA (35 ER/73.1 IP)...In 31 career road appearances, he has gone 11-7 with a 4.48 ERA (63 ER/126.2 IP), 53 walks, and 128 strikeouts...He has gone 9-6 with a 4.70 ERA (56 ER/107.1 IP) in his 19 career road starts, making Quality Starts in 11 of those games...He is averaging 9.09 strikeouts-per-9.0 innings on the road, and has struck out six-or-more batters in 11 of his 19 road starts.

AT FENWAY PARK: Bundy has made three career starts (six appearances) at Fenway Park; he is 2-1 with a 3.57 ERA (9 ER/22.2 IP) at this ballpark...He has made Quality Starts in two of his three starts here...Last pitched at Fenway Park on May 1, 2017 and earned the win after limiting the Red Sox to two runs on five hits in 7.0 innings.

MOWING THEM DOWN: Bundy has struck out eight-or-more batters in two of his three starts this year and 12 times overall in his career...Eight of those games came in 2017; he went an undefeated 5-0 with a 2.50 ERA (15 ER/54.0 IP) and the Orioles went 6-2 in those eight starts...For his career, he's posted a record of 6-2 with a 2.63 ERA (23 ER/79.2 IP) when striking out eight-or-more batters.

THE DAY MAN: This will be Bundy's third day start of 2018...Bundy owns a career record of 5-5 with a 5.03 ERA (51 ER/91.1 IP) in 22 career day games (14 starts); including 3-3 with a 6.15 ERA (31 ER/45.1 IP) in eight days starts last season.

JUMPING ON HIM EARLY: During the 2017 season, opponents hit .327 (54-for-165) when leading off an inning...Opponents hit .343 (23-for-67) with seven home runs and 18 RBI on the first pitch, .327 (18-for-55) with two home runs and nine RBI in a 0-1 count, .340 (16-for-47) with four home runs and 11 RBI in a 1-0 count, and .357 (15-for-42) with four home runs and six RBI with a 1-1 count...Through his first three starts of 2018, opponents have hit .316 (6-for-19) when leading off an inning.

SPRING NOTES: Made five starts during 2018 Spring Training, going 2-2 with a 7.20 ERA (16 ER/20.0 IP), five walks, and 17 strikeouts...He earned his first win of the spring on March 12 at Pittsburgh when he tossed 5.0 innings, allowing one run on seven hits with five strikeouts...He tossed a spring-high 5.2 innings on March 18 vs. New York-NL, and suffered the loss after allowing five runs, four earned, on five hits, one home run, with one walk, two hit batsmen, and a spring-high-tying six strikeouts.
