SHELTER FROM THE STORM—With Hurricane Irma bearing down on the Tampa Bay area, Major League Baseball has moved the 3-game series against the Yankees (Mon–Wed) to Citi Field, home of the New York Mets... the Rays will be the home team and bat last...fans holding tickets to Rays-Yankees games at Tropicana Field should check RaysBaseball.com/Irma and all social media channels for info on exchanges and refunds...all 3 games will air on Fox Sports Sun and the Rays Radio Network...tickets for the Citi Field games are on sale at Mets.com/Irma, by phone at (718) 507-TIXX or in person at the Citi Field box office...Field Level reserved seating is \$25...ticket fees will be waived.

UNITED FOR A CAUSE—The Red Sox, Rays, Boston Bruins and Florida Panthers have partnered to raise funds for Florida relief...donations will be collected at all Fenway Park gates today, before and during the game...players from all four teams, including Rays RH Jake Odorizzi and RH Steve Cishek, will help with the collection when gates open at 12:05...donations will support Red Cross relief efforts that may be needed in the Florida area...the Panthers were moved to the Boston area to wait out the hurricane near their AHL affiliate where the team plans to practice.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost 3 straight games and have yielded 9-plus runs in all 3 games, only the second time in the Rays era (since 2008) they have allowed at least 9 runs in 3 straight games (also June 12-14, 2012 vs. NYM)...they lost 9-0 last night, 9-3 on Friday and 10-6 on Wed vs. MIN...only once in club history have they yielded 9 or more in 4 straight games: June 4-8, 1999 vs. FLA/at ATL (5 straight)...last night was the Rays 11th shutout loss of the season, tied with Seattle for 2nd most in the majors behind KC (15)...it was their third shutout loss this year when recording 8 hits or more, most in the majors (June 29 at PIT, Aug 4 vs. MIL)...of the 11 shutouts, it was only their second to occur on the road (June 29 at PIT)...last night was the Rays worst shutout loss (9-0) since April 18, 2015 vs. NYY (also 9-0) and their worst on the road since April 15, 2005 at BOS, when LH David Wells defeated RH Hideo Nomo, 10-0...it tied for the largest margin of defeat this season (June 16 at DET, 13-4).

- + Before losing the last 3 games, they had won 10 of 15 games since Aug 20...according to FanGraphs, this 3-game skid has lowered their chances of reaching the postseason from 10.0 pct. to 3.3 pct., including a 1.6 chance of reaching the ALDS.
+ In losing the last 2 games to LH Drew Pomeranz and LH Chris Sale, the Rays dropped to 16-24 (.400) vs. LH starters this season...they will face four lefties in 6 games on this road trip...they are 54-49 vs. RHP.
+ Today the Rays look to avoid being swept for the fifth time this season, fourth of 3 or more games...their last time being swept was Aug 8-9 vs. BOS (2 games) and their last 3-game sweep was July 21-23 vs. TEX.

TAKE A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE—

With last night's loss, the Rays missed a chance to gain a game on the top four teams chasing the second AL Wild Card position...although only 4.5 GB of the second Wild Card, they have six teams ahead of them with 19 games remaining...17 of those 19 games are vs. AL East foes ahead of them in the standings, and the other 2 vs. the defending World Champion Chicago Cubs...this is their sixth of 14 consecutive games vs. teams currently positioned to reach the postseason (2-3).

- + The Rays need to finish at least 11-8 to achieve Kevin Cash's best record as Rays manager, 12-7 to finish with a winning record and 15-4 to reach 85 wins...for context, their best 19-game stretch in Cash's tenure is 14-5 (June 2–21, 2015).

RAYS vs. RED SOX—Last night's 9-0 loss was their most lopsided to Boston since Sep 25, 2014 at Fenway (11-1)...the Rays have a 4-game losing streak vs. Boston after starting the season 6-5...they are 6-9 overall (3-3 home, 3-6 road) and would need to win all 4 remaining games to avoid losing back-to-back season series to Boston for the first time since 2006-07 (7-12 in 2016)...they play a 3-game set at Tropicana Field next weekend (Sep 15-17)...Tampa Bay is 91-90 (.503) vs. Boston since becoming the Rays in 2008.

57—Strikeouts by LH Chris Sale against the Rays this year, most by any pitcher against the Rays in one season...Sale already held this record before his 8 SO last night, ahead of NYY Roger Clemens (46) in 2001 and BOS Rick Porcello (46) in 2016...the Elias Sports Bureau found that this is

the highest strikeout total by any pitcher vs. any opponent since ARI Randy Johnson (68) in 2001 vs. SD.

- + Red Sox PR notes that Sale has 134 SO in 90 IP lifetime vs. the Rays...this 13.40 SO/9 IP ratio is the highest by any pitcher vs. any opponent in the live ball era (since 1920; min. 75 IP).

POWER SURGE—The Rays rank 6th in the AL with 202 HR, already the 2nd-highest total in club history (216 in 2016)...they are on pace for 229...Strangely, the Rays have lost 7 of their 10 games since the All-Star break when hitting at least 3 HR; before the All-Star break, they were 17-3 when hitting at least 3 HR...the Rays lead the majors with a club-record 12 back-to-back home runs, ahead of the Orioles and D-backs (11 each).

STREAK ENDS AT 18—Last night's shutout ended the Rays streak of 18 games with a home run, the longest in club history within one season and 2nd longest overall (21, Sep 20, 2015–April 12, 2016)...they fell one shy of the longest streak in the majors this season (19 by Houston, May 23–June 11)...during these 18 games, the Rays scored 86 runs and hit 35 HR, averaging 4.78 R/G and 1.94 HR/G...over the previous 14 games (Aug 4-18), they scored 24 runs and hit 8 HR (1.71 R/G, 0.57 HR/G).

ROAD RAGER—1B/DH Logan Morrison has a club-record 26 HR on the road, tops in the AL and one shy of MIA Giancarlo Stanton for the major league lead...Morrison has 26 HR in 240 AB on the road (9.23 AB/HR); Stanton has 27 HR in 277 AB (10.26 AB/HR)...his current 9.23 AB/HR ratio is the best of any player (min. 20 HR on road) since BOS David Ortiz in 2003 (9.09; 32 HR in 291 AB)...he is on pace for 29 HR on the road, a mark not reached since 2006 when Ortiz (32) and PHI Ryan Howard (29) both did it...the AL record of 32 is shared by Ortiz and NYY Babe Ruth (1927).

- + Morrison's career-high 36 HR overall are tied with Evan Longoria (2016) for 3rd most in club history behind Carlos Peña in 2007 (46) and 2009 (39)...he has 7 HR and 14 RBI in his last 11 games (10 starts)...prior to these last 10 games, he totaled 1 HR and 2 RBI over 20 games from Aug 3-25.

EVAN LONGORIA—Has 31 HR lifetime vs. Boston, 2nd among active players behind TOR José Bautista (42)...17 of those have come at Fenway Park, tied with CLE Edwin Encarnación for 2nd among actives as a visitor, behind Bautista (25)...Longoria's career 102 RBI vs. Boston rank 2nd among active players, behind SEA Robinson Canó (116).

MORE ON IRMA—The Rays-Yankees series starting tomorrow is the fifth time in baseball history that weather concerns forced the relocation of games to a neutral site...just last week, the Rays hosted the Astros and Rangers for 3 games due to the devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey in Houston...the Astros-Rangers series was the first such occurrence since Sep 14-15, 2008 (Cubs at Astros, Miller Park) due to Hurricane Ike.

- + Irma is the third hurricane to affect Rays games at Tropicana Field, following Hurricane Frances (2004) and Hurricane Gordon (2000)...a full description of those circumstances can be found on Page 41 of the 2017 Rays Media Guide.
+ WDAE 620 AM will not carry Rays games until further notice due to hurricane news coverage...instead, fans can tune in on the Rays Radio Network or MLB At-Bat, which is waiving fees until the Rays flagship returns.

MUCH TO CELEBRATE IN MINOR LEAGUE PLAYOFFS—Triple-A Durham won, 4-3, yesterday over Indianapolis (Pirates) to advance to the Governor's Cup Finals, their 11th time reaching it in 20 seasons as a Rays affiliate (first since 2013)...C Justin O'Conner delivered a 2-out, 2-run single in the 8th inning to take the lead...they will play the winner of Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Lehigh Valley, with SWB holding a 2-1 lead in that series.

- + Double-A Montgomery won last night at Chattanooga (Twins), 2-0, to even their series 2-2...rehabbing RH Nathan Eovaldi (Tommy John surgery) and LH Xavier Cedeño (left forearm tightness) worked the first 2 innings, throwing 14 and 10 pitches, respectively...tonight in Chattanooga, they play a decisive Game 5 for only the second time in their 14-year history, and could clinch their first Southern League championship since 2007 with a win.
+ Short-A Hudson Valley won Game 1 of their best-of-three series vs. Staten Island (Yankees), 5-2, in the 13th inning on a walk-off, 3-run homer by C Zacrey Law...rehabbing RH Jake Faria (left abdominal strain) is scheduled to start Game 2 today at Staten Island, with a chance to advance to the NYPL Finals.

+ LAST START—On Mon vs. MIN, his only run allowed came on a 2nd-inning RBI single by **Max Kepler**...two of his 3 hits allowed came in the 2nd...retired 10 of his last 11 BF before being replaced by **Dan Jennings** with 1-on, 2-out in the 6th inning...improved to 2-0 with a 2.20 ERA (16.1-IP, 4-ER) in 3 career apps, all starts, in his career against the Twins...his line: W, 5.2 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 7 SO, 99 pit, 65 str.

+ THE WIN COLUMN—Has reached 10 wins for the fourth time in six major league seasons, and is one win shy of tying his career high (11, twice: 2013, 2012)...his last start was his first win since July 26 vs. BAL and it snapped a 3-game losing streak, matching the longest streak of his career (4th time)...his last road win was July 15 at LAA.

+ THE TURNAROUND—Through 12 starts this season, he was 4-5 with a 4.52 ERA (73.2-IP, 37-ER), including a career-high 9 runs on June 3 at SEA...since then, he has gone 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA (89.1-IP, 29-ER) over his last 14 starts, and his ERA during that span (since June 4) ranks 5th in the AL...has yielded 3 ER or fewer in 12 of the 14 starts over that span, and 2 ER or fewer in 10 of the 14 starts...has gone at least 6 IP in 11 of the 14 starts and at least 7 IP in 6 of 14 starts.

+ Redefining Quality—Has made a team-most 7 starts this season of 6+ IP and 1 run (or fewer), ahead of RH **Jake Faria** (6).

+ SEVERE SPLITS—His 4.91 ERA (84.1-IP, 46-ER) on the road would be his highest (min. 5 starts) since 2012 (4.92)...has allowed 4 runs or more in 6 of his 14 road starts, including starts of 7, 8 and 9 runs allowed...in comparison, his 2.29 ERA (78.2-IP, 20-ER) in 12 starts at home ranks 2nd in the AL, and it would be 3rd for a single season in franchise history, behind **David Price** in 2012 (1.81) and 2010 (1.96)...his most runs allowed in a home start this season is 4, twice: May 23

vs. LAA and April 21 vs. HOU.

+ ODDS & ENDS—Has allowed 13 HR against right-handed batters this season, more than his career total (12) in 85 starts from 2011-16...his previous career high for a season against righties was 4 (2014, 2013)...twelve of his last 15 HR allowed have been to righties, but prior to this stretch only 13 of 48 HR allowed in his career were vs. RHB.

+ Opposing 7-thru-9 hitters are batting .306/.345/.492 (56-for-183) with 13 2B, 7 HR and 26 RBI against him...the major league average for this split is .247/.314/.401.

+ PITCH SELECTION—Has thrown his changeup a career-low 15.2 percent of the time this season, and his curveball a career-high 33.6 percent of the time...over his last 3 starts, has only thrown 12 changeups in 278 pitches...in his career entering this season, his pitch distribution included 34.7 pct. changeups and 20.5 pct. curveballs.

+ DON'T RUSH ME—Averages 26.1 seconds between pitches, according to FanGraphs, 3rd in the majors behind NYY **Masahiro Tanaka** (26.2) and TEX/LAD **Yu Darvish** (26.1), and the highest of his career...in his 5 starts after returning from Tommy John in 2016, averaged 21.4 seconds between pitches...his previous high before this season (min. 10 starts) was 24.5 seconds in 2014.

+ WATCH YOUR BACK—Has 5 pickoffs, tied for 2nd in the majors behind SD **Clayton Richard** (8), and tied with CHC **Kyle Hendricks** for most among RHP...his 5 pickoffs are the most by a Rays RHP since **James Shields** (13) in 2011...had 5 career pickoffs prior to this year.

+ According to Baseball America's 2017 Best Tools survey of major league managers, coaches, scouts and executives, his pickoff move was ranked first in the AL, ahead of BAL **Wade Miley**.

+ BOSTON-BORN—Was born in Boston but moved to Florida with his family as a 2-year-old...made return trips as a visitor growing up, which would include stops at Fenway Park...the Red Sox were his favorite team until he was drafted by the Rays in 2006.

CAREER—Is 5-3 with a 3.42 ERA (71-IP, 27-ER) in 12 career starts against the Red Sox...has yielded 3 ER or fewer in 10 of his 12 starts against them...is 4-1 with a 3.34 ERA (35-IP, 13-ER) in 6 career starts at Fenway Park, his most wins at any visiting stadium...has made 3 starts against the Red Sox this season, going 2-0 with a 3.32 ERA (19-IP, 7-ER), including a scoreless start (7.2 IP) on July 8 at home.

TOMORROW'S STARTER—RH JAKE ODORIZZI (8-7, 4.58)

+ LAST START—On Tue vs. MIN, had a no-hitter through 6.1 IP, spoiled by 1B **Joe Mauer's** single that bounced off second base...it tied the longest no-hit bid of his career (also May 29, 2016 vs. NYY) and was the longest by any Ray since that game...retired his first 12 BF and faced the minimum through 6 IP...was his first scoreless start since April 15 at BOS (1 IP, injury-shortened) and his first scoreless start of at least 6.2 IP since July 29, 2016 vs. NYY (6.2)...won a second consecutive start following a 5-start winless streak (0-3)...his line: W, 6.2 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 6 SO, 90 pit, 56 str.

+ vs. YANKEES—Is 5-6-1 with a 4.40 ERA (73.2-IP, 36-ER) in 13 career apps (12 starts) against the Yankees...will be facing them for the first time since April 2—the Rays second game of the season—when he was at 25 pitches through 2 IP, then five of his 7 hits allowed and 3 of his 4 runs allowed came in a 28-pitch 3rd inning, which included a 2-run homer by **Ronald Torreyes** and an RBI double by **Matt Holliday**...his final line: L, 6 IP, 7 H, 4 R, 2 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR, 107 pit, 76 str...will be pitching at Citi Field for the first time in his career.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

+ Selected by Indians Manager Terry Francona to join the AL coaching staff for the 2017 All-Star Game, his first career All-Star appearance as a player, coach or manager...joined **Larry Rothschild** in 2000 and **Joe Maddon** and his entire coaching staff in 2009 as Rays managers/coaches to go.

+ On July 18 at OAK, was ejected in the 5th inning by HP umpire **Bill Welke**, his seventh career ejection as a manager and third this season.

+ Is in his third season as Rays manager and at age 39, remains the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.

+ Is the fifth manager in Rays history...is the sixth Tampa-born manager in ML history and second to manage the Rays...joins Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

+ Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, including parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10)...spent two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.

+ Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
