OCT. 9

2005 - The Astros top the Braves in a famed 18 innings by a score of 7-6, which advances them to their second straight NLCS...RHP Roger Clemens stole the show, tossing 3.0 innings of scoreless relief to pick up the win.

TODAY'S GAME: The Astros and Red Sox will match up in Game 4 of the ALDS today with RHP **Charlie Morton** (14-7) starting for Houston opposite Red Sox starter RHP **Rick Porcello** (11-17)...dating back to the regular season, the Astros have won eight of their last 10 games, including a 5-2 record against Boston.

CHARLES IN CHARGE: RHP **Charlie Morton** (14-7), a veteran of 10 Major League seasons (2008-17), posted career bests this season in wins, strikeouts (163) and opponent batting average (.228)...the biggest uptick was in his strikeout numbers, as he posted a 10.00 strikeouts per nine ratio, which ranked ninth in the AL (min. 125 IP), and represented over a three strikeout difference with his career ratio of 6.86.

WE MEET AGAIN: This series between the Astros and Red Sox marks just the fourth time in MLB history for two teams to play in the final series of the regular season and also face off for the start of the postseason...the last time it happened was in 2013, when the Pirates swept the Reds in Cincinnati in the regular season and then won in Pittsburgh in the NL Wild Card Game.

POSTSEASON APPEARANCES: This season marks the Astros 11th time in the postseason and their seventh time as a division winner, also winning the NL West in 1980 and 1986 and the NL Central in 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2001...after winning the AL West by 21 games this season, the Astros became the first team in Major League history to win three different divisions.

DIVISION SERIES HISTORY: The Astros have played in the Division Series eight times in franchise history, last doing so in 2015, and dropping the series in five games to the eventual World Series Champion Kansas City Royals...Houston is 14-22 all-time in the DS, but 10-7 dating back to 2004.

TURN THE TIDE: The Astros are 3-10 all-time in postseason series, winning the 2004 NLDS (ATL), the 2005 NLDS (ATL) and the 2005 NLCS (St. Louis)...if the Astros are to win this series, they would advance to the League Championship Series for just the fifth time in franchise history, also reached in 1980, 1986, 2004 and 2005.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Astros set a franchise record for road wins this season with a 53-28 mark, which also tied the Indians for the best road record this season.

AT THE HELM: Manager **AJ Hinch** has completed three full seasons with the Astros (2015-17) with a 271-215 (.557) regular season record and two playoff appearances...in franchise history, Hinch ranks first in winning percentage and seventh in wins.

ABOUT YESTERDAY: The Astros dropped Game 3 of the ALDS yesterday by a score of 10-3 in Boston...Houston collected 13 hits on the day, including a 4x4 performance by **1B Yuli Gurriel**...the Astros bounced RHP **Doug Fister** (3ER/1.1IP) in the 2nd inning, but were unable to push across a run on the Red Sox pen.

#HOUSTONSTRONG: As the Astros continue their run in the postseason on the field, the organization's thoughts and prayers remain with the City of Houston and the many victims impacted by Hurricane Harvey.

PITCHING IN: Monetary donations for hurricane relief can be made at YouCaring.com/AstrosHarvey... additionally, Astros Owner and Chairman **Jim Crane**, the Astros ownership group and the Astros Foundation have all pledged a donation of \$4 million to relief efforts.

AID TO PR: The Astros Foundation, in partnership with Crane Worldwide, FedEx and the Houston Mayor's Office, facilitated the transport of over 240,000 pounds of supplies, equivalent to approximately six truck-loads of air cargo, to aid in Puerto Rico relief efforts in the wake of Hurricane Maria.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Astros offense led the Majors this season in runs (896), hits (1581), doubles (346), batting average (.282), OBP (.346), SLG (.478) and OPS (.823) while striking out fewer than any other club (1087)...this season, the Astros set club records in doubles, batting average and SLG, while finishing second in OPS...this marks the first time in franchise history for the Astros to lead the Majors in runs.

THE 700 CLUB: **2B Jose Altuve** is 8x11 (.727) this series and has collected two-plus hits in all three games, which ties as the longest multi-hit game streak in Astros postseason history...his big series includes a three-homer game in Game 1, making him the ninth player in Major League history (10th time) to hit three homers in a postseason game and the first since **Pablo Sandoval** in the 2012 World Series.

ELIAS SAYS: **SS Carlos Correa** became the third player in Major League history to hit a home run as a shortstop while batting in the fourth spot in the batting order in a postseason game, doing so in Game 2... he joins **SS Nomar Garciaparra**, who did it seven times for the Red Sox in 1998 and 1999, and **SS Didi Gregorius**, who did it for the Yankees in this year's American League Wild Card game.

FOUR HITS FOR YULI: Yesterday, **1B Yuli Gurriel** became the fourth player in franchise history to collect four hits in a postseason game, joining **SS Carlos Correa** (2015 ALDS, G4), **CF Carlos Beltran** (2004 NLDS, G5) and **CF Terry Puhl** (1980 NLCS, G5)... oddly enough, the Astros went 1-3 in those games.

BACK THEN: The 2017 Astros feature four players remaining from the 2013 Astros, which finished 51-111: **2B Jose Altuve**, **IF Marwin Gonzalez**, **LHP Dallas Keuchel** and RHP **Brad Peacock**...that group bottomed out in 2013 (51-111), made the postseason in 2015 and won 101 games this season.

BACK IN HOUSTON: For every playoff road game, the Astros will host a Postseason Watch Party at Minute Maid Park, which is free and open to the public with a voucher...the party will begin two hours prior to first pitch with a Postseason Street Fest on Crawford Street...the game will stream live on the main video board inside Minute Maid Park as well as on large projection screens outside the ballpark.

- 3x4 with 3 singles yesterday at BOS...tied a franchise record with 3 straight multi-hit games in the postseason...accomplished 5x, most recently **Willy Taveras** ('05).
- in G2 became the 6th second-baseman in MLB postseason history with 2+ IBB in 1 game...others were **Daniel Murphy** (2016), **Roberto Alomar** (1997), **Joe Morgan** (1976), **Jackie Robinson** (1952) and **Tony Lazzeri** (1937).
- hit 3 solo home runs in Game 1 (2 off **LHP Chris Sale**)...became the 9th player in Major League history to have a 3-HR game in the postseason, joining **Pablo Sandoval** (2012 World Series), **Albert Pujols** (2011 World Series), **Adrian Beltre** (2011 ALDS), **Adam Kennedy** (2002 ALCS), **George Brett** (1978 ALCS), **Reggie Jackson** (1977 World Series), **Bob Robertson** (1971 NLCS) and **Babe Ruth** (1928 World Series, 1926 World Series).
- this is his 2nd career appearance in the postseason...started at 2nd base in all 6 of Houston's playoff games in 2015 (1 WC game, 5 ALDS games).
- is a career .382 (58x152) hitter with 12 doubles, 6 homers, 21 RBI, 8 steals and a 1.001 OPS (.432 OBP/.579 SLG) in 37 games against the BOS between the regular season and playoffs...owns the highest batting average vs. Boston by any active Major Leaguer, postseason and regular season combined (min. 100PA).
- has hit .485 (49x101) with 9 doubles, 6 homers, 16 RBI and a 1.304 OPS in his last 25 games against Boston dating back to Aug. 16, 2014.

- is appearing in the postseason for the 7th time in his career, and his 2nd with Houston...this is his 3rd straight postseason appearance, as he played in the 2015 AL Wild Card Game with the Yankees, and the 2016 ALDS with the Rangers.
- helped take Houston to the 2004 NLCS in what was one of the greatest post-season performances of all-time...hit .435 (20x46) with 3 doubles, 8 HR, 14 RBI and a 1.557 OPS in 12 playoff games, tying **Barry Bonds** (2002 SF) for the most homers ever hit in a single postseason...that record still has not been broken... **Nelson Cruz** (2011 TEX) is the only player who has matched it since.
- ranks T-8th among all active players in career postseason games (57)...ranks among the top 5 active players in career hits (4th), homers (T-2nd), RBI (2nd) and OPS (2nd, 1.082), in the postseason.
- faced Boston in the postseason during the 2013 World Series when he was a member of the Cardinals...hit .294 (5x17) with 3 RBI in that series.

- this is his first career appearance in the postseason...in Game 1, became the youngest third baseman in club history to start a postseason game...the previous youngest was 29-year-old **Morgan Ensberg** in 2004.
- hit .331 (47x142) with 18 extra-base hits (9 doubles, 2 triples, 7 homers), and a .974 OPS (.404 OBP/.570 SLG) vs. LHP's.

- named the **AL Player of the Week** for the final week of the regular season...hit .520 (13x25) with 4 doubles, 3 homers, 10 RBI, 8 runs, 1.611 OPS in 6 games... led the AL in batting average, hits, runs and RBI during the week...on Sept 28 at BOS, went 4x4 with a double, HR and 3 RBI to become the 1st player in Astros history to record 3 straight games with at least 3 hits and 3 RBI (Elias).
- prior to Game 1, had a 19-game on-base streak he had posted against the Red Sox...hit .417 (30x72) with 4 doubles, 6 HR, 12 RBI and a 1.234 OPS in his previous 19 career games vs. Boston...tied the 3rd-longest start of career streak vs. the Red Sox in MLB history with **Howie Kendrick**, behind 21-game streaks set by **Kirk Gibson** and **Kurt Suzuki**...has 4 HR in his last 9 games vs. BOS.
