BOSTON RED SOX (8-5) at TORONTO BLUE JAYS (2-10)

STATE OF THE SOX: Tonight, the Red Sox continue a stretch of 30 games in 31 days (6-5 so far), which includes a span of 17 consecutive days with a game from 4/7-23.

🔥 The Sox have won each of their last 3 games, their longest win streak of the season.

CLOSE CALLS: The Red Sox are 6-2 in games decided by 1 or 2 runs; BOS was 38-39 in such games last season...The Sox lost their first two 1-run games of 2017, but they have won each of their last 3.

SOX & JAYS: The Red Sox and Blue Jays will play each other 19 times during the regular season, but only 3 times through 6/29...The Jays will not travel to Fenway Park until after the All-Star break, with their 3 series in Boston scheduled for 7/17-20 (4 G), 9/4-6 (3 G), and 9/25-27 (3 G).

🔥 17 of 19 meetings between BOS and TOR in 2016 were decided by 3 runs or fewer, including 7 by 2 runs and 7 by 1 run.

ROGER THAT: Boston's 122 wins at Rogers Centre (opened in 1989) are the most by any visiting team; the Yankees (106) are the only other club with as many as 90 wins at the venue...The Sox' .550 winning percentage here ranks 1st among all AL teams, .004 ahead of the Jays (.546).

WE HAVE CONTACT: Mookie Betts has not struck out in his last 123 regular-season plate appearances, beginning with his final PA on 9/12/16 vs. BAL...In those 123 PA, Betts is batting .345 with a .415 OBP (38-for-110, 13 BB).

🔥 According to Elias, the last Red Sox player with a streak as long as Denny Doyle (159 in 1975)...Elias also notes that it is the longest streak by any player since Juan Pierre (147 in 2004).

🔥 Betts has not struck out in his last 28 games played (9/13-4/17)...In that time, 320 players have struck out 10+ times, 152 have struck out 20+ times, 41 have struck out 30+ times, and 5 have struck out 40+ times.

PITCHING IN: Red Sox pitchers rank 2nd in the majors in SO/9.0 IP (9.85), just .01 behind the Indians (9.86)...BOS has totaled 40 SO in the last 3 games, having recorded 11+ SO in each of those...The Sox last had a streak of 4 straight games with 11+ SO in 2013 (4/24-27).

BETTS & BOGEY: Xander Bogaerts recorded his 100th career double on Sunday and does not turn 25 until 10/1...Mookie Betts has 99 career doubles and turns 25 on 10/7...The only other Red Sox since 1913 with 100+ doubles before turning 25 are Bobby Doerr (159), Ted Williams (154), Carl Yastrzemski (136), and Tony Conigliaro (100).

🔥 Only 3 players have totaled 400+ hits since the start of 2015: Jose Altuve (432), Betts (401), and Bogaerts (400)...Robinson Cano ranks 4th in that time (387).

DOWN, BUT NOT OUT: The Red Sox have earned 5 wins when tied or trailing after 6 innings, as well as 3 when tied or trailing after 7 innings...The Red Sox are batting .322 (49-for-152) with a .421 OBP in the 7th inning and later, the highest such marks in the majors.

GETTING DEFENSIVE: The Red Sox have committed only 1 error in their last 4 games...They have not made more than 1 error in any of their 13 games this season.

DIAMOND TRIO: 1B Mitch Moreland, 2B Dustin Pedroia, and SS Xander Bogaerts have combined to field their last 768 chances without committing an error.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, LHP Brian Johnson was recalled from Triple-A Pawtucket...To make room on the roster, RHP Ben Taylor was optioned to Pawtucket following yesterday's game against the Rays.

🔥 Tonight will be the 2nd ML appearance of Johnson's career...He also started for BOS on 7/21/15 at HOU and earned the loss (4.1 IP, 3 H, 4 R, 4 BB, 3 SO)...In that game, Johnson allowed only 1 run through 4.0 innings.

REHAB NEWS: Jackie Bradley Jr. (10-day DL, right knee sprain) and Josh Rutledge (10-day DL, left hamstring strain) are scheduled to make their 1st rehab appearances tonight with Triple-A Pawtucket (at Charlotte, 7:05 p.m.)...Bradley will play CF and Rutledge will serve as the DH.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Red Sox lead the majors in AVG (.287), OBP (.353), and doubles (tied, 29)...Red Sox batters are averaging 6.47 PA/SO, the highest mark in the majors.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Red Sox went 3-for-6 with RISP in yesterday's win over the Rays...On the season, BOS leads the majors with a .414 OBP with RISP and paces the AL in AVG with RISP (.328).

THAT'S MORE(LAND) LIKE IT: Mitch Moreland began the season 0-for-12, but he is since batting .444 with a 1.323 OPS (16-for-36, 9 2B, HR, 7 BB, HBP)...He has reached base in 11 straight games.

🔥 Moreland leads the majors outright in doubles (9); no other AL player has more than 5...He also leads the AL and ranks T-2nd in the majors in XBH (10).

THE 'PEN IS MIGHTIER: BOS relievers have not allowed a run in the last 3 games (9.2 IP, 4 H, 4 BB, 14 SO)...The Red Sox' bullpen ranks among ML leaders in ERA (4th, 1.84), opponent AVG (3rd, .183), and opponent SLG (4th, .268)...BOS relievers have allowed only 1 HR in 44.0 IP, the lowest HR/9.0 IP ratio in the AL and 2nd-lowest in MLB (0.20).

THEFT PROTECTION: Opponents have been successful in only 2 of 8 attempted steals against BOS this season...Sox catchers threw out the first 5 attempted base stealers, their best start since 1960 (also first 5).

🔥 Dating back to 9/16/16, Sandy León has not allowed a stolen base in his last 20 starts behind the plate (4 CS).

HAVE WE BENINTRODUCED?: Andrew Benintendi—who began the season ranked No. 1 overall in *Baseball America's* Top 100 Prospects list—has recorded 3 hits in each of his last 2 games...He ranks among AL rookie leaders in hits (T-1st, 16), doubles (T-1st, 3), BB (T-2nd, 5), RBI (T-4th, 9), and runs (4th, 7)...He also ranks 7th among all AL players in PA/SO (11.80), having struck out only 5 times with 5 BB.

🔥 Benintendi is tied for the team lead in hits and RBI...In 47 career ML games, he has hit .301 (47-for-156) with a .369 OBP...He does not turn 23 until 7/6.

CLOSING TIME: Craig Kimbrel has converted each of his last 25 save chances since 6/4/16, the majors' 2nd-longest active streak behind BAL's Zach Britton (54).

🔥 Kimbrel earned the save in each of the last 3 Red Sox wins, retiring all 9 batters faced (7 SO).

🔥 Since joining the Red Sox prior to the 2016 season, Kimbrel is 37-for-39 in save opportunities...In those 39 games, he has posted a 1.15 ERA, a 0.67 WHIP, and a .115 opponent AVG while averaging 15.0 SO/9.0 IP (39.0 IP, 15 H, 5 ER, 11 BB, 65 SO).

TONIGHT'S START:

- Was recalled from Triple-A Pawtucket earlier today.
- Will be making his 2nd career ML start (4.1 IP, 3 H, 4 R, 4 BB, 3 SO on 7/21/15 at HOU).
- Posted a 1.69 ERA (2 ER/10.2 IP) with 15 SO and 4 BB over 2 GS for Pawtucket this year.
- In his most recent outing on 4/13 vs. Syracuse (WSH), struck out 8 batters over 6.2 IP while allowing only 1 R on 4 H and 1 BB.
- Over 10 starts since rejoining the PawSox from the 7-day disabled list on 7/24, has gone 3-3 with a 3.29 ERA (20 ER/54.2 IP) with 41 SO and 18 BB.
- Is 14-12 with a 3.14 ERA (64 ER/183.2 IP) with 159 SO and 72 BB in 35 career Triple-A starts from 2015-17.
- Owens a 2.58 ERA and 29-22 career minor league record over 6 professional seasons (2012-17), all within the Red Sox organization.

2017 SPRING TRAINING:

- Appeared in 3 games and made 1 start for the Red Sox in Grapefruit League action... Went 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (4 ER/6.2 IP).
- In his only start on 2/27 vs. STL, allowed 3 runs on 4 H and 3 BB and 4 SO over 2.2 IP.
- Limited opponents to 1 ER in 4.0 IP over 2 relief outings (3/3 at ATL & 3/8 at NYM).

2016 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Made 15 starts with Triple-A Pawtucket, going 5-6 with a 4.09 ERA (35 ER/77.0 IP).
- Placed on Pawtucket's temporary inactive list on 5/21 to seek treatment for anxiety.
- Did not appear in a game until starting twice for the Rookie-level GCL Red Sox on 7/4 & 7/9, going 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (3 ER/7.0 IP) and 9 SO.
- Made his next 2 starts with Short-A Lowell, holding opponents scoreless over 11.0 IP and striking out 11.
- Returned to Pawtucket on 7/24 and made 8 starts throughout the remainder of the season.
- In his 2nd start after returning to the PawSox (7/29 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre), dealt 6.0 innings of a combined shutout...Allowed just 6 ER over 5 starts from 7/29-8/22, going 3-1 with a 1.76 ERA (6 ER/30.2 IP) and 20 SO.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- Entered 2017 ranked by *Baseball America* as the Red Sox No. 7 prospect...Was Red Sox' compensation draft pick for the loss of free agent Jonathan Papelbon.
- Chosen as the Red Sox 2014 Minor League Pitcher of the Year...Was rated by *Baseball America* as having the system's best control and best curveball following the 2014 and 2015 seasons.
- Named to *Baseball America's* Triple-A All-Star Team and ranked by *BA* as the No. 6 prospect in the Red Sox system during the 2015 season.
- Had his 1st professional season cut short after being hit in the face with a line drive while on the mound for Short-A Lowell on 8/18/12...The game took place at Fenway Park.
- Following the 2014 season, named the Red Sox' No. 5 prospect by *Baseball America*...Also named the No. 9 prospect in the Eastern League (AA) after the campaign and the No. 82 prospect in baseball.
- Went 22-12 with a 3.85 ERA (104 ER/243.1 IP) and 196 SO in 49 appearances (46 GS) over 3 seasons at the University of Florida from 2010-12...As a junior in 2012, named a First-Team All-American by the NCBWA, earned his 2nd straight First-Team All-SEC selection, and was a finalist for the John Olerud 2-Way Player of the Year Award.
- Was a member of the USA Collegiate National Team in 2010 and 2011...Played alongside Red Sox organization teammates Matt Barnes (2010), Jackie Bradley Jr. (2010), Noe Ramirez (2010), and Deven Marrero (2011)...In 2011, was teammates with Marcus Stroman, tonight's Blue Jays starting pitcher.

- His 12 straight quality outings on the road is the longest active streak in the majors (7-1, 2.72 ERA, 26 ER/86.0 IP, 79 SO, 12 BB)...Pedro Martinez (13, 6/14/02-4/27/03) was the last Sox pitcher with a longer such streak.
- Went 3-0 with a 4.50 ERA (16 ER/32.0 IP), 33 SO, and 6 BB over 5 GS vs. TOR in 2016.

- Had 3 hits within the first 4 innings of yesterday's win, including a go-ahead 2-run single with the bases loaded in the 2nd...Was his first career bases-loaded hit (1-for-6), and drove in his first go-ahead RBI of the season (2 in 2016)...Was his 2nd consecutive 3-hit game, tying a career high in hits for the 5th time... Also had consecutive 3-hit games from 8/7-9/16, his 5th and 6th career games.
- Has hit .325 (38-for-117) with a .932 OPS in 132 career PA vs. RHP...All of his 16 XBH, and 38 of his 47 hits overall, have come off of right-handers...When leading off an inning, has hit .438 (14-for-32) with 6 2B, 1 3B, and a 1.188 OPS.
- Has reached base in 12 of 13 games played...Became the 4th Sox hitter since 1913 to reach in each of the club's first 10 games at age 22 or younger, joining Bobby Doerr in 1939, Jim Piersall in 1952, and George Scott in 1966...The previous 2 ML hitters to do so were ATL's Jason Heyward and PIT's Jose Tabata in 2011.
- Hit a 3-run homer in the Red Sox' Opening Day win, becoming the 2nd-youngest Sox hitter (22 years, 271 days) to homer on Opening Day since Tony Conigliaro (20 years, 95 days) in 1965 (also Mookie Betts in 2015)...According to ESPN Stats & Info, was the youngest in franchise history with 3+ RBI on Opening Day.
- Debuted with the Red Sox last season at the age of 22...In 47 ML games since, has hit .301/.369/.462 with 23 runs, 14 2B, 3B, 3 HR, and 23 RBI.
- Entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as baseball's No. 1 prospect...Named 2016 Minor League Player of the Year by the Boston chapter of the BBWAA.

- Has not struck out in his most recent 123 regular season PA since 9/12/16...According to Elias, marks the longest active streak, the longest by a Red Sox hitter since Denny Doyle in 1975 (159 PA), and the longest by any hitter since Juan Pierre in 2004 (147 PA).
- Recorded 9 hits, 3 2B, and 3 RBI in the Sox' 4-game series with TB (.529/9-for-17, 3 R)...Leads the majors with 71 multi-hit games since the start of last season, 4 more than any other hitter...Also ranks among ML leaders in that time in hits (227, 2nd), runs (126, 5th), RBI (116, T-5th), and total bases (375, 2nd).
- Is 4 for his first 7 (.571) with RISP, including 2-for-3 with 2 outs...Among AL hitters with RISP since the start of 2016, ranks 2nd with a .365 AVG (54-for-174) and a .642 SLG and 4th with a 1.061 OPS...With 2 outs and RISP in that time, has hit .417 (25-for-60, 2nd in the AL) with a .507 OBP (2nd), a .767 SLG (1st), and a 1.274 OPS (1st).
- Has reached base safely in 35 of 42 career games vs. TOR, batting .284 (50-for-176) with 32 runs, 12 2B, 4 3B, 4 HR, and 21 RBI.
- Finished 2nd in AL MVP voting last season, behind Mike Trout...Started his 1st All-Star Game in RF, won Rawlings Gold Glove and Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger Awards, and was named a *Sporting News* AL All-Star...Was honored as the Wilson Overall Defensive Player of the Year.
- His 214 hits in 2016 were the most ever by a right-handed Red Sox hitter, and tied for the 3rd-most in a single season in franchise history...Led the majors with 359 total bases...Also ranked among ML hitters with 214 hits (2nd), 122 runs (T-2nd), 42 2B (T-6th), 78 XBH (T-7th), 113 RBI (5th), and a .318 AVG (7th).
