BOSTON RED SOX (9-6) at TORONTO BLUE JAYS (3-11)

STATE OF THE SOX: The Red Sox snapped a 4-game win streak last night, their longest of the season...Tonight, they continue a stretch of 30 games in 31 days, which includes a span of 17 consecutive days with a game from 4/7-23.

SETTING SALE: Chris Sale has pitched at least 7.0 innings and allowed 2 runs or fewer in each of his 3 appearances as a member of the Red Sox...In the last 55 years (1962-2016), the only other pitchers to begin their BOS careers with such a streak are Josh Beckett (first 3 in 2006), Pedro Martinez (4 in 1998), and Tim Wakefield (4 in 1995)...However, Sale is the only pitcher in that group to *also* allow 5 hits or fewer in each of his first 3 games as a Red Sox.

Since becoming a starter prior to the 2012 season, Sale is 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA and .174 opponent AVG vs. the Blue Jays (39.0 IP, 23 H, 9 ER), tossing at least 7.0 innings and allowing 2 ER or fewer in each of his 5 outings against the club.

CLOSE CALLS: The Red Sox are 7-2 in games decided by 1 or 2 runs; BOS was 38-39 in such games last season...The Sox lost their first two 1-run games of 2017, but they have won each of their last 4.

DOWN, BUT NOT OUT: The Red Sox have come from behind in 5 of their 9 wins this season...They have 5 wins when tied or trailing after 6 innings, as well as 3 when tied or trailing after 7.

The Sox are being outscored, 17-3, in the 1st inning this season; they have outscored their opponents, 62-48, in all other innings...The Red Sox have a .407 OBP in the 7th inning and later, the highest mark in MLB.

SOX & JAYS: Since the start of 2016, 19 of 21 meetings between the Red Sox and Blue Jays have been decided by 3 runs or fewer, including 7 by 2 runs and 8 by 1 run...3 of the last 4 have been decided by 1 run.

ROGER THAT: Boston's 123 wins at Rogers Centre (opened in 1989) are the most by any visiting team; the Yankees (106) are the only other club with as many as 90 wins at the venue...The Sox' .549 winning percentage here ranks 1st among all AL teams, .003 ahead of the Jays (.546).

ONE TWENTY-NINE: Mookie Betts struck out swinging against Francisco Liriano in the 4th inning last night, snapping a streak of 129 regular-season plate appearances without a strikeout (last: 9/12/16 vs. BAL)...In those 129 PA, Betts faced 57 different pitchers and hit .353 with a .419 OBP (41-for-116, 13 BB).

According to Elias, the last Red Sox player with a streak as long as Denny Doyle (159 in 1975)...Elias also notes that it was the longest streak by any player since Juan Pierre (147 in 2004).

Betts did not strike out in 29 consecutive games played from 9/13-4/18...In that time, 322 players struck out 10+ times, 155 struck out 20+ times, 46 struck out 30+ times, and 8 struck out 40+ times.

BETTS & BOGEY: Xander Bogaerts recorded his 100th career double on Sunday and does not turn 25 until 10/1...Mookie Betts has 99 career doubles and turns 25 on 10/7...The only other Red Sox since 1913 with 100+ doubles before turning 25 are Bobby Doerr (159), Ted Williams (154), Carl Yastrzemski (136), and Tony Conigliaro (100).

Only 3 players have totaled 400+ hits since the start of 2015: Jose Altuve (435), Betts (405), and Bogaerts (403)...Robinson Cano ranks 4th in that time (389).

APRIL SHOWERS BRING MAY POWER: The Red Sox rank last in the majors in HR (7)...In 2016, BOS ranked last in the AL in HR in April (19), but the club's 189 HR from 5/1 through the end of the season ranked T-6th in the majors...The Sox' 114 HR from 7/4 through the end of the season ranked 3rd in MLB behind only BAL (125) and STL (117).

REHAB NEWS: Jackie Bradley Jr. (10-day DL, right knee sprain) and Josh Rutledge (10-day DL, left hamstring strain) continued their rehab assignments last night for Triple-A Pawtucket at Charlotte...Bradley played 9 innings in CF and went 1-for-3 with a HR and 2 BB (on his 27th birthday), while Rutledge served as the DH and went 0-for-3 with a BB...Rutledge also homered for the PawSox on Tuesday.

THAT'S MORE(LAND) LIKE IT: Mitch Moreland began the season 0-for-12, but he is since batting .444 (20-for-45, 10 2B, HR, 7 BB, HBP)...He has reached base in 13 straight games.

Moreland leads the majors outright in doubles (10); no other AL player has more than 6...He also leads the AL and ranks T-4th in the majors in XBH (11).

Moreland became the only Red Sox player since at least 1913 to record as many as 10 2B in the team's first 14 games of a season.

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Red Sox rank 2nd in the majors in AVG (.288), 14 points higher than any other AL team (HOU-.274)...BOS also leads the AL in OBP (.351, 2nd in MLB) and doubles (32, 3rd in MLB)...Red Sox batters are averaging 6.12 PA/SO, the highest mark in the majors.

Tuesday marked the 3rd time this season the Red Sox recorded at least 15 hits...The only other teams with more than 1 such game are NYM (2), WSH, and BAL (2)...17 teams have yet to record 15+ hits in any game.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Red Sox are 13-for-32 (.406) with RISP in their last 4 games...On the season, BOS leads the majors with a .423 OBP with RISP and paces the AL in AVG with RISP (.333).

THE 'PEN IS MIGHTIER: Boston's bullpen has allowed only 2 HR in 49.0 IP, marking the lowest HR/9.0 IP ratio in the AL and 4th-lowest in the majors (0.37).

Red Sox relievers also rank among ML leaders in ERA (4th, 2.20), opponent AVG (6th, .190), and opponent SLG (5th, .287).

HAVE WE BENINTRODUCED?: Andrew Benintendi—who began the season ranked No. 1 overall in *Baseball America's* Top 100 Prospects list—has reached base multiple times in each of his last 4 games (9-for-17, 1 BB)...He ranks among ML rookie leaders in hits (2nd, 19), doubles (T-3rd, 4), BB (T-2nd, 6), RBI (T-3rd, 10), and runs (T-4th, 8).

In 49 career ML games, Benintendi has hit .305 (50-for-164) with a .373 OBP and a .463 SLG...He does not turn 23 until 7/6.

CLOSING TIME: Craig Kimbrel has converted each of his last 25 save chances since 6/4/16, the majors' 2nd-longest active streak behind BAL's Zach Britton (54).

Kimbrel earned the save in 3 straight games vs. TB from 4/15-17, retiring all 9 batters faced (7 SO).

Since joining the Red Sox prior to the 2016 season, Kimbrel is 37-for-39 in save opportunities...In those 39 games, he has posted a 1.15 ERA, a 0.67 WHIP, and a .115 opponent AVG while averaging 15.0 SO/9.0 IP (39.0 IP, 15 H, 5 ER, 11 BB, 65 SO).

GOLDEN GLOVE: Dustin Pedroia has not committed an error in his last 51 games played (last: 8/19/16 at DET), totaling 178 chances in that time...Pedroia holds the longest career errorless games and chances streaks at 2B in Red Sox history, logging 98 games and 439 total chances without a miscue from 7/30/09-5/19/10 and 7/29/09-5/20/10, respectively.

THEFT PROTECTION: Red Sox catchers have thrown out 6 of 10 attempted base stealers this season...Only the White Sox and Rockies have allowed fewer steals (3 each).

Dating back to 9/16/16, Sandy León has allowed a SB in 1 of his last 21 starts behind the plate (last night).

APRIL 20, 1939 (78 YEARS AGO): Rookie Ted Williams collects his 1st ML hit, a double off the Yankees' Red Ruffing.

APRIL 20, 1989 (28 YEARS AGO): Jim Rice and Dwight Evans hit back-to-back HR in the 8th inning...It marked the 56th and final time they would homer in the same game.

APRIL 20, 2013 (4 YEARS AGO): In an emotional day at Fenway Park and throughout Boston, the Red Sox played their 1st home game following the tragic events at the Boston Marathon...David Ortiz proclaimed during pre-game ceremonies that "This is our...city," and Daniel Nava hit a go-ahead HR in the bottom of the 8th inning, leading the Sox to a 4-3 win over KC.

TODAY'S START:

- Has pitched 7.0+ IP and allowed 2 or fewer R in each of his 3 starts this year...Since 1962, the only other pitchers to begin their BOS careers with such a streak are Josh Beckett (3 GS, 2006), Pedro Martinez (4 GS, 1998), and Tim Wakefield (4 GS, 1995).
- Is the only pitcher in that group to also allow 5 H or fewer in each of his first 3 starts as a Red Sox.
- Is limiting opponents to a .149 AVG (11-for-74) over 3 starts this season.
- Has received only 3 R of support over 21.2 IP (1.25 RSA).
- Struck out 10 over 7.2 IP in his first road start vs. DET on 4/11 (5 H, 2 R, BB, HR).
- In 50 career outings (31 GS) facing AL East ballclubs, is 17-10 with a 2.51 ERA, 271 SO, 71 BB, a 1.05 WHIP, and a .203 opponent AVG.
- Holds the 4th-lowest opponent AVG (min. 800 batters faced) and 4th-lowest ERA (min. 200.0 IP) all-time vs. the AL East.
- In 21 career outings (15 GS) at Camden Yards, Rogers Centre, Tropicana Field, and Yankee Stadium combined, is 7-5 with a 1.85 ERA (23 ER/111.2 IP), 123 SO, 31 BB, and a .189 opponent AVG (77-for-407).
- Is 15-5 with a 2.88 ERA (54 ER/169.0 IP) and 166 SO in 25 career March/April starts.

Last start: Earned his first win as a member of the Red Sox on 4/15 vs. TB, striking out 12 over 7.0 IP (3 H, R, 3 BB).

His 12 SO are the most ever by a pitcher in his first win for the Red Sox...The previous record was 11, held by Don Aase (1977), Pedro Martinez (1998), and Hideo Nomo (2001).

Leads the majors with 21 starts of 12+ SO since 2012...Was his 2nd consecutive start with 10+ SO...Became the 3rd Red Sox LHP since 1913 to allow 2 or fewer ER with 10+ SO in consecutive starts, joining Jon Lester (2x) and Bruce Hurst.

VS. THE BLUE JAYS:

Is 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA (9 ER/39.0 IP) over 5 career starts vs. TOR...Has 31 SO and 10 BB in those outings while limiting the Blue Jays' hitters to a .174 AVG (23-for-132).

Has allowed 2 or fewer ER over 7.0+ IP in each of his 3 career starts at TOR...Dennis Martinez (4 GS, 8/7/78-9/1/82) and Larry Gura (4 GS, 4/17/78-4/30/80) are the only pitchers to ever begin their careers with at least 4 such outings at TOR.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- Has the most SO through 150 career starts (1,149) in MLB history (Source: Elias)...Kerry Wood (1,122) and Nolan Ryan (1,118) rank 2nd and 3rd, respectively.
- Won each of his first 9 starts of 2016 (9-0, 1.58 ERA, 62 SO, .163 opponent AVG).
- Named to his 5th straight All-Star team last season, joining Clayton Kershaw as the only pitchers named to an All-Star team in each of the last 5 years (2012-16).
- Led the majors with 23 starts of 7.0+ IP and 13 starts of 8.0+ IP last year...Tossed at least 8.0 IP in 6 consecutive outings from 8/20-9/16/16 (1.98 ERA).
- Has finished in the top 6 in AL Cy Young Award voting in each of his 5 seasons as a starter (2012-16).
- Holds the highest SO/BB ratio (4.80) in the live ball era (min. 1,000.0 IP)...Has averaged 10.1 SO/9.0 IP in his career...The only other pitchers in the live ball era (since 1920) to average at least 10.0 SO/9.0 IP (min. 1,000.0 IP) are Randy Johnson (10.6), Kerry Wood (10.3), and Pedro Martinez (10.0).
- Leads AL pitchers since 2012 (min. 500.0 IP) in ERA (3.00), SO (1,162), SO/BB ratio (5.10), WHIP (1.06), and opponent OPS (.631).
- Joined Madison Bumgarner as the only pitchers to post a 3.41 ERA or lower in each of the 5 seasons from 2012-16...His career ERA of 2.97 ranks 2nd among active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 IP) behind only Clayton Kershaw (2.37) who has spent his entire career in the National League.
- Trails only Max Scherzer (1,307) and Clayton Kershaw (1,195) for the most strikeouts in MLB since 2012 (1,162).
- Is tied with teammate David Price for the most CG in the AL since 2012 (14)...His 41 starts of 8.0+ IP since 2012 trail Kershaw (56) and Price (49) for most in the majors.
- Joins Scherzer as the only pitchers with 200+ SO in each of the last 4 seasons (2012-16)...His 941 SO in that time are the most ever by a CWS pitcher in any 4-year span.

- Has reached base multiple times in each of his last 4 games (.529/9-for-17, 3 R, 3 2B, 3 RBI), and 5 of his last 6 (.440/11-for-25, 4 R, 4 2B, 4 RBI)...Is tied for 7th in the AL with 19 hits, and tied for the AL lead with three 3-hit games...His 10 RBI are the most by a Sox hitter as young as 22 through the club's first 14 games since Tony Conigliaro (12) and George Scott (12) in 1966.
- Has hit .328 (40-for-122) with a .940 OPS in 138 career PA vs. RHP...All of his 17 XBH, and 40 of his 50 hits overall, have come off of right-handers...With RISP, has hit .389 (14-for-36) with a 1.121 OPS, including a .400 clip (10-for-25) with a 1.180 OPS with RISP and 2 outs.
- Has reached base in 14 of 15 games played...Became the 4th Sox hitter since 1913 to reach in each of the club's first 10 games at age 22 or younger, joining Bobby Doerr in 1939, Jim Piersall in 1952, and George Scott in 1966...The previous 2 ML hitters to do so were ATL's Jason Heyward and PIT's Jose Tabata in 2011.
- Hit a 3-run homer in the Red Sox' Opening Day win, becoming the 2nd-youngest Sox hitter (22 years, 271 days) to homer on Opening Day since Tony Conigliaro (20 years, 95 days) in 1965 (also Mookie Betts in 2015)...According to ESPN Stats & Info, was the youngest in franchise history with 3+ RBI on Opening Day.
