BOSTON RED SOX (45-22) at BALTIMORE ORIOLES (19-46)

EXTRA, EXTRA! After entering the 12th inning scoreless last night, the Red Sox scored twice on a pair of sacrifice flies in the 12th to earn a 2-0 win over the Orioles.

- Last night's win was the team's first shutout victory in 12+ innings since 4/5/17 vs. PIT (3-0 in 12 innings)... The club has just 8 such wins in the last 100 seasons (1919-2018), including just 3 on the road.
- Last night was the first time since at least 1925 the Red Sox have snapped a scoreless tie in extra innings with a sacrifice fly.
- Steven Wright extended his career-long scoreless innings streak to 22.2 innings...His 1.21 ERA is the lowest in the AL among pitchers with more than 1 start.

STATE OF THE SOX: The Red Sox lead MLB with 45 wins... They have lost 3 of their last 5 games, but are 6-3 in their last 9 and 17-8 in their last 25.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Last night's game was the first of a 10-game, 11-day road trip through BAL (3 G), SEA (4 G), and MIN (3 G)...At 22-11 (.667), the Sox are tied with NYY for MLB's 2nd-highest winning percentage on the road.

- BOS pitchers have a 3.09 ERA on the road (102 ER/297.1 IP), MLB's 3rd-lowest mark.

EASTERN STANDARD: At 45-22 (.672), the Red Sox are zero games behind the Yankees in the AL East, but trail New York in winning percentage...BOS is 26-10 (.722) vs. the AL East, the highest winning percentage for any club against any division (min. 15 games).

PITCHING IN: The Red Sox used 6 pitchers to combine for their 5th shutout of the season last night, allowing just 5 hits in 12 innings...Sox pitchers have a 2.04 ERA (17 ER/75.0 IP) and a .185 opponent AVG in their last 8 games.

- The Red Sox have struck out 11+ hitters in each of their last 5 games, their longest streak since at least 1908.
- Since 5/19, BOS leads MLB with a 1.53 bullpen ERA (12 ER/70.2 IP).

ON THE OFFENSIVE: The Red Sox lead MLB in runs scored (343), 2B (148, tied), and XBH (254)...They also rank 2nd in run differential (+97), AVG (.262), SLG (.457), and OPS (.783).

- The Sox also are tied for 2nd in MLB in steals and rank 2nd in stolen base % (83.3%, 50-for-60).
- BOS is 33-6 (.846) when scoring 5+ runs this season, including 13-0 since 5/16.
- The Sox are 28-3 (.903) when scoring the game's 1st run, the best such record in the majors.

SLUGGING SOX: The Red Sox rank 2nd in MLB with 95 HR, the 4th-most through 67 games in club history (107 in 1977, 100 in 1996, and 97 in 1969).

- BOS leads the majors with 65 HR since 4/30 (40 G).
- The Sox have hit multiple HR in 32 games, most in the majors...They are 27-5 (.844) this season when hitting multiple HR, including 14-1 since 5/16.

IN GOOD COMPANY: This is only the 5th time in the Red Sox' 118-year history they have won as many as 45 of their first 67 games, having also done so in 1978 (46-21), 1946 (47-18-2), 1912 (46-21), and 1904 (45-22).

- Only 3 teams from 2004-17 won 45+ of their first 67 games, each of whom went on to win the World Series:

ALL-STAR UPDATE: MLB today released its 1st update on fan balloting for the AL's starting 9 in the 89th MLB All-Star Game on 7/17 in Washington, D.C....Mookie Betts leads the majors with 748,872 votes, while J.D. Martinez leads AL designated hitters with 513,415.

- Mitch Moreland ranks 2nd among AL first basemen, while Andrew Benintendi (6th) and Jackie Bradley Jr. (12th) are in the top 15 among AL OF.
- The AL All-Star Team will have 9 elected starters via fan balloting...Pitchers and reserves will be determined through a combination of "Player Ballot" choices and selections made by the Commissioner's Office.

LEADING OFF: Mookie Betts returned from the DL yesterday after missing the Red Sox' previous 14 games...He leads MLB in AVG (.354), SLG (.735), and OPS (1.167).

- The only qualifying AL hitters ever with a .735+ SLG before the All-Star break are Mark McGwire (.796 in 1996), Frank Thomas (.795 in 1994), Mickey Mantle (.749 in 1956), and Jimmie Foxx (.744 in 1933).

J.D. POWER: J.D. Martinez is tied with Mike Trout for the ML lead in HR (21) and leads MLB outright in RBI (54)...The only Red Sox ever to lead MLB outright in both categories in a season are Ted Williams (1942), Jim Rice (1978), and Tony Armas (1984).

- Martinez has 12 HR in his last 26 games...He leads MLB since the 2017 All-Star break with 52 HR, 126 RBI, a .698 SLG, and a 1.070 OPS.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Among those who have played at least 50% of their games at 1B, Mitch Moreland leads AL 1st basemen in SLG (.573) and OPS (.928) (min. 100 PA).

- Moreland also leads AL first basemen in Fangraphs' WAR (1.5)...Since starting the season 0-for-12, Moreland is 47-for-152 (.309) with a .376 OBP.

HAVE WE BENINTRODUCED?: Andrew Benintendi hit 1 HR in his first 32 games of 2018; he has 10 HR in 31 games since then, including 8 in his last 21 games, and 4 in his last 9.

- Benintendi has 14 XBH over a season-long 16-game on-base streak, batting .369/.446/.800 in that time (24-for-65, 16 R, 6 2B, 2 3B, 6 HR, 14 RBI).

STEADY EDDIE: The Red Sox are 11-1 in LHP Eduardo Rodriguez's starts this season...In his last 6 starts, he is 4-1 with a 2.14 ERA (8 ER/33.2 IP), 8 BB, and 38 SO.

- His 4-game winning streak is tied for a career-best, matching a streak from 4/23-5/26/17.
- The only other AL pitchers who have started 11 or more team wins are Luis Severino (12) and Gerrit Cole (11).

SOX & O'S: The Red Sox have won 10 of their last 11 games vs. BAL, including 7 of 8 this season.

- Boston's .587 winning percentage (125-88) at Camden Yards is the highest among all AL teams, including BAL, since the venue opened in 1992.

FOR THE BIRDS: Three Red Sox have a .300+ career AVG against the Orioles: Brock Holt (.317), J.D. Martinez (.314), and Andrew Benintendi (.313).

- Martinez's .714 SLG against the Orioles ranks 3rd all-time (min. 100 AB)...He has reached base in his last 19 games vs. BAL, batting .391 (25-for-64) with 9 HR, 23 RBI, and a 1.399 OPS.

- Among active players with 50+ at-bats at Camden Yards, Brock Holt ranks 3rd in AVG (.397) and 4th in OBP (.438).

TONIGHT'S START:

Has won a career-high 4 consecutive starts...Joins Rick Porcello (4, 3/31-4/18) as the only Red Sox to win 4 consecutive starts in 2018.

That streak also ties his career-long streak of winning decisions: 4, 4/23-5/26/17.

Rodriguez allowed 2 ER or fewer in each of those 4 starts (1.90 ERA, 5 ER/23.2 IP)...Is tied for the 2nd-longest such streak of his career (5, 8/18-9/14/15; 4, 9/5-23/17).

The Red Sox are 11-1 (.917) in Rodriguez's starts this season...Is 1 of 5 ML pitchers with 11+ team wins during their starts this year (Severino-12, Scherzer-11, Cole-11, Chacin-11).

Is 1 of 5 ML pitchers with 7+ wins and no more than 1 loss...The only other AL pitchers in that group are HOU's Gerrit Cole (7-1) and Charlie Morton (7-1)...The other 2 are STL's Michael Wacha (8-1) and Miles Mikolas (7-1).

Posted a 2.14 ERA (8 ER/33.2 IP) in his last 6 starts, lowering his season mark from 5.29 to 3.68...Allowed 3 ER or fewer in each of those outings.

His current streak of starts with 3 ER or fewer allowed marks his longest since a career-long-tying 8-start stretch from 4/13-5/26/17.

Surrendered just 2 HR in 33.2 IP over his last 6 starts, both solo HR.

Has allowed just 4 hits in 22 AB with RISP during those last 6 outings (.182 AVG, BB).

LHH are slugging just .317 vs. Rodriguez this season (2B, 2 HR)...The only 2 HR lefties have hit against Rodriguez this year were by TEX's Joey Gallo on 5/5 at Globe Life Park.

Has allowed 6 hits to 47 LHH faced this season (.146/6-for-41, 3 BB, 3 HBP), the 7th-lowest mark in the AL (min. 40 LHH faced).

Is limiting LHH to a .171 AVG (12-for-70, 5 BB, 5 HBP) in 19 starts since 8/26/17 vs. BAL.

Last start: Earned the win on 6/6 vs. DET (5.2 IP, 5 H, R, BB, 5 SO).

VS. THE ORIOLES:

Is 2-0 with a 0.77 ERA (1 ER/11.2 IP) in 2 starts vs. BAL this season...Tossed 5.2 scoreless IP on 5/20 and allowed 1 ER over 6.0 IP on 4/13...Both starts were at Fenway Park.

Allowed 7 ER over 5.2 IP in his last start at BAL on 6/1/17...Was placed on the DL with right knee subluxation the following day.

Was 3-1 with a 1.34 ERA (5 ER/33.2 IP) over his first 6 career starts at BAL...Allowed 2 ER or fewer in each of those outings...Marked the 2nd-longest streak of such starts at BAL ever by a Red Sox (Pedro Martinez, 8, 5/12/00-4/4/04).

ON THE ROAD:

The Red Sox have won each of Rodriguez's 4 road starts this year (2-0, 3.80 ERA, 27 ER/66.0 IP).

Hurled 5.0 scoreless innings in his last road start on 5/10 at NYY (1 H, 3 BB, 8 SO)...Held NYY hitless through the first 3.1 innings.

Has limited opponents to a .163 AVG (14-for-86) in 4 road starts this season, posting a 0.97 WHIP in those outings.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS:

The Red Sox won each of Rodriguez's first 7 starts this season...Marked the longest season-opening streak by a Red Sox since Clay Buchholz in 2013 (7, 4/3-5-6).

Recorded a season-high 10 SO over 6.0 IP on 5/5 at TEX (ND, 4 H, 5 R, 2 BB, 3 HR)...Was his 2nd career double-digit SO effort (also 13 SO on 9/25/16 at TB).

Allowed 3 ER or fewer over 6.0+ IP in 3 consecutive starts from 4/13-25, tied for his 2nd-longest career streak of quality starts (7, 4/23-5/26/17).
