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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-21) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (28-12)

MONDAY, MAY 14, 2018 — FENWAY PARK — 7:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three at New York to start the road trip and have now lost five of the last six games...that has dropped the A's to two games under .500 for the first time since April 20 (9-11)...have not been more than two games over .500 or two games under .500 every day dating back to the 20th...are now 14-11 (.560) over the last 25 games after starting the year 5-10 (.333)...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 19th consecutive day and now trail first place Houston by six games...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since April 16 when they were 6½ games back...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 35 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

FIRST PLACE AND OTHER TOUGH TEAMS: Tonight's game marks the A's sixth straight contest against a team with at least a share of the lead in its division...are 1-4 over the first four games of that stretch (0-2 vs. Houston, 1-2 vs. New York)...are currently in a 19-game stretch that began a week ago today and runs through May 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona...those six teams are currently a combined 149-93 (.616) and the A's are 1-5 during that stretch.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 6-3 (.667) against American League East teams...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East and Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...have a 10-4 (.714) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West...have the worst intradivision record in the AL and the third worst in the majors...are batting .235 (202-for-861) and are averaging 3.69 runs per game (96 runs in 26 games) against the AL West, .269 (139-for-516) with an average of 6.00 runs per game (84 runs in 14 games) against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.92 ERA (124 er in 227.0 ip) against the AL West, 3.43 (51 er in 133.2 ip) against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The are 1-2 on this 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (three games) and Toronto (four games) and have now lost six of their last eight road games...this trip concludes a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...are 8-12 (.410) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...are tied for the fifth worst road record in the American League but have the fourth best home record...the A's have compiled a 5.06 ERA (96 er in 170.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...have the fifth highest road ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest home ERA...have allowed a Major League leading 33 home runs on the road...the offense has hit 34 home runs on the road, which is second most in the AL (Boston, 36), compared to 14 at home, which is tied for second fewest...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-8 with a 5.23 ERA (43 er in 74.0 ip) over the last 14 games after going 6-2 with a 2.93 ERA over an 11-game stretch from April 15-27...are 11-18 with a 4.65 ERA (113 er in 218.2 ip) for the season...are tied for fourth in the American League in losses...starters have issued two free passes or fewer in 35 of the 40 games this year and are second in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.30) to Cleveland (2.16).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.76 ERA (35 er in 54.2 ip) and .316 (72-for-228) opponents batting average over the last six games...however, have a 3.98 ERA (101 er in 228.2 ip) over the last 25 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...have allowed at least one home run in each of the last seven games (13 home runs total) and 13 of the last 14 (22 home runs)...walked 17 batters in the three-game series at New York, but are averaging 2.70 walks per nine innings for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have 29 wild pitches, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 30)

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors in the last nine games but those two errors have led to seven unearned runs...now have 21 unearned runs for the season, which is third most in the American League...have turned 28 double plays, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...A's outfielders have just two assists (both by Chad Pinder), which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Washington, 1).

OFFENSE: The A's scored 18 runs in the three-game series at New York after scoring 15 runs in six games on the last homestand...are hitting .209 (98-for-469) with 44 runs scored over the last 14 games (3.1 runs per game) after batting .268 and averaging 5.2 runs per game over the first 26 contests...rank fourth in the American League in walks (136) but have the fifth most strikeouts (368).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 1-for-6 (16.7%) in stolen base attempts over the last 16 games...are 7-for-14 (50.0%) for the season and the stolen base percentage is the lowest in the majors...also rank last in the majors in stolen bases and stolen base attempts...opponents have stolen 32 bases, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (New York, 34)...however, they have been caught stealing 13 times, which is tied for second most in the AL (Chicago, 15).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their five-game winning streak in one-run games snapped in a 7-6, 11-inning loss at New York on Saturday...still have the best record in one-run games in the majors with a mark of 6-2 (.750)...however, the eight one-run decisions are tied for second fewest in the majors (Texas, 7)...dropped to 3-1 in extra inning games with the loss on Saturday...are tied for third in the American League in extra inning wins...it was the A's first last at bat loss of the season...have six last at bat wins, which is third most in the AL...have three walk-off wins.

LATE INNINGS: The A's have compiled a 3.36 ERA (45 er in 120.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is second lowest in the American League (Toronto, 2.58)...have a 4.88 ERA (130 er in 240.0 ip) over innings one through six...are batting .264 (124-for-470) in the seventh inning or later compared to .239 (217-for-907) in innings 1-6...are batting a Major League leading .281 (36-for-128) with 21 runs scored in the ninth inning...the runs scored are tied with Atlanta and New York (AL) for the most in the majors.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher tomorrow and Wednesday...have won six of the last nine games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 7-8 against left-handed starters and the 15 games are tied for second most in the American League (Toronto, 17)...are batting .261 (110-for-422) against left-handed pitchers, .242 (231-for-955) against right-handers.

THE DISABLED LIST: The have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cahill, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL 10 times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: today and Wednesday against Boston and May 22 against Seattle...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three in Oakland April 20-22...have now won seven of their last 11 games against Boston after losing nine straight...have won six of the last eight games in the Coliseum but have lost eight of the last nine at Fenway...over the last three years, neither team has recorded a save...nine of the 16 games over that stretch have been decided by five runs or more, including five by nine or more...the last save in an A's vs. Red Sox game was by Tommy Layne on June 7, 2015 and the last by an Athletic was by Sean Doolittle on June 20, 2014...the A's won the season series last year 4-3 after losing the season series each of the previous two years (went 1-5 in both 2015 and 2016)...are 242-295 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 147-122 in Oakland, 94-172 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 884-1076 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League third baseman with 145 total chances, which is 31 more than any other third baseman...**Khris Davis** leads the majors in go-ahead home runs (8) and is tied for the American League lead in go-ahead RBI (11)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the AL lead in multiple hit games (17) and go-ahead RBI (11), ranks second in hits (54) and RBI (36) and fourth in batting (.340)...**Blake Treinen** ranks third among AL relievers with a 0.98 ERA.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1988 Bob Welch tosses a five hit shutout as the A's win at Baltimore, 8-0...in 1995 Geronimo Berroa and Terry Steinbach have four RBI each in the A's 12-3 win at Minnesota...the A's hit five home runs, including two by Berroa.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-4, 2.11 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has allowed four runs in each of his last two starts after allowing six runs over his first six starts...is 0-2 with a 6.17 ERA (8 er in 11.2 ip) and .289 (13-for-45) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his eight starts and allowed four hits or fewer five times.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the third lowest opponents batting average (.170), on-base percentage (.215) and OPS (.503) in the American League and the fourth lowest ERA (2.11) and slugging percentage (.289)...ranks third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.14), fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.43), seventh in innings pitched (55.1) and tied for ninth in wins (4) and losses (4)...is also tied for seventh in wild pitches (4) and tied for eighth in hit batters (4)...is averaging the fewest pitches per inning in the majors (13.3).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his four losses this year (3 rs in 24.1 ip, 1.11 RSA) and 22 of his 23 career losses (23 rs in 117.2 ip, 1.76 RSA)...is 14-0 in 21 career starts with run support of four or more and 20-1 in 28 starts with three runs of support or more...has season run support this year of 3.58 (22 rs in 55.1 ip), which is seventh lowest in the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 4-for-54 (.074) with a walk and a hit by pitch (.107 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the American League (Berrios, MIN .065 and .104)...has surrendered five of his six home runs to right-handed hitters...five have come with the bases empty...opponents are hitting .138 (12-for-87) with two strikes...has a .138 (9-for-65) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .235 (16-for-68) the second time and .131 (8-for-61) after that...the opponents number six hitter is 1-for-21 (.048) and the two hitter is 2-for-22 (.091).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 1.78 ERA (6 er in 30.1 ip) and .137 (14-for-102) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 2.52 ERA (7 er in 25.0 ip) and .207 (19-for-92) opponents average in four starts on the road...has allowed four of his six home runs on the road...is now 13-8 with a 3.43 ERA (66 er in 173.1 ip) in 31 career games at home, 10-15 with a 4.39 ERA (86 er in 176.1 ip) in 31 starts on the road.

IN APRIL: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in five starts...it was his first Pitcher of the Month honor...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month and the four wins match the most by an A's pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (ninth time, last: Triggs in 2017)...his ERA tied for the fourth lowest in any month in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...it was the lowest since Cory Lidle had a 0.20 ERA in Aug., 2002...had a .395 OPS and is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history with an OPS under .400 in a month with a minimum of 100 batters faced (.358, Lidle in Aug. 2002; .376, Torrez in Sept. 1976; .390, Ontiveros in June 1987).

NO-HITTER: Tossed the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history on April 1 against Boston in Oakland...was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week of April 16-22 along with Manny Machado for his efforts...it was his first Player of the Week award...his no-hitter was the earliest by date (Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota) and second earliest by game number (Chief Bender, May 12, 1910 vs. Cleveland, game 18) in Athletics history...it was the 10th no-hitter in Coliseum history (six by A's, four by opponents)...it was the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay...is the third Oakland pitcher to strikeout 10 or more in a no-hitter...Dave Stewart had 12 and Catfish Hunter had 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in Major League history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season...the last pitcher to no hit a team that led the majors in runs per game entering the game was the A's Dave Stewart, who did it against Toronto on June 29, 1990 (also Elias).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed one run in 7.2 innings in his first start on March 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and one run in 8.0 innings in his second start on April 4 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...won three consecutive starts from April 15 to 27 and allowed just two runs (one earned) on six hits over that stretch (0.39 ERA, .078 opponents batting average)...allowed two hits in seven innings at Seattle April 15 and then no-hit Boston on April 21 to become the first A's pitcher with back-to-back starts of seven innings or more and two hits or fewer since Barry Zito (July 9-15, 2005)...shutout the Red Sox 3-0 in the no-hitter...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12 before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out for his first career complete game...it came

in his 59th game and 58th start and his streak of 57 consecutive starts without a complete game was fourth longest in Oakland history...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts...the shutout came in the A's 21st game of the season and it was the earliest shutout by an Athletic since Barry Zito on April 18, 2003 vs. Texas, the A's 17th game of the season...allowed a fourth-inning single to Correa in his first start after the no-hitter on April 27 at Houston, snapping his streak of consecutive hitless innings at an Oakland record 14.0 innings...broke the previous mark of 13.0 held by John "Blue Moon" Odom from June 1-7, 1968...opponents went 0-for-47 off him during the hitless streak...yielded four runs on six hits in a 4-1 loss at Seattle May 3 to snap a season-opening streak where he allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first six starts...that tied for the third longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Dave Stewart had a seven-game streak in 1990.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss to Houston last Tuesday in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the first but he allowed a solo home run to Bregman in the second...Oakland got than run back in the third, but he allowed a two-run double in the fifth to give Houston a 3-2 lead...also allowed a RBI single to Gonzalez in the sixth.

MANAEA vs. BOSTON: Is 2-2 with a 7.52 ERA (20.1 ip, 26 h, 18 r, 17 er, 2 bb, 18 so, 4 hr) in four career starts...is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 0-2 with a 21.32 ERA (15 er in 6.1 ip) in two starts in Fenway Park...no-hit the Red Sox in his only start this year, a 3-0 A's win in Oakland on April 21...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12 before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out for his first career complete game...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts.

2017 RECAP: Compiled a 12-10 record and a 4.37 ERA in 29 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and 4-5 with a 5.55 ERA and .328 opponents average over his final 12 starts...led the A's in wins, games started, innings pitched (158.2), strikeouts (140), hits (167), walks (55) and hit batters (10)...allowed a .268 opponents batting average, including .227 (30-for-132) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (137-for-491) against right-handers...had a .593 OPS against lefties, .809 against righties.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (2-4, 4.06 ERA): Is 2-2 with a 3.24 ERA (12 er in 33.1 ip) over his last six starts after going 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA over his first two starts...is now 5-5 with a 2.95 ERA (26 er in 79.1 ip) over his last 13 starts dating back to Sept. 9, 2017 after going 2-10 with a 6.86 ERA over the first 16 starts of his career...has issued just five walks in 44.1 innings and his average of 1.02 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the American League (Colon, TEX 0.83)...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.60, which is fourth best...is 0-4 with a 6.30 ERA in four starts in intradivision games, 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts interdivision contests...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 so)...is 0-1 with an 8.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 14 h, 8 r, 8 er, 2 bb, 7 so) in two career starts against Boston...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's win in Oakland on April 22 (6.1 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so).
