AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 2-1 on their season-long 10-game road trip...are 2-1 in a 4G series at Boston...will play 3G at Detroit (Tues.-Thurs.) and 3G at Toronto (Fri.-Sun.)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand, taking 2-of-3 vs. Oakland and 2-of-3 vs. Texas.

- Are 4-1 in their last 5G and 10-3 in their last 13G.
- At 94-50 (.653), are tied with Houston for the best record in the Majors.**
- Are 37-19 (.661) since the All-Star break, tied with Houston and St. Louis for the most wins in the Majors over the span...**are Major League-bests 53-23 since 6/15, 71-34 since 5/12, and 86-40 since 4/19.**
- Are a season-high 44G over .500...are 44G over .500 for the first time since ending the 2009 season with a 103-59 record.
- Are on pace to go 105-57...have won 105 games in a season only five times in franchise history, and just once in the last 58 seasons since 1962 (114-48 in 1998).
- Lead the AL East by 8.5G over Tampa Bay (86-59), 3.0G below their largest division lead of the season (11.5G, at the end of play on 8/28)...is Baseball's third-largest division lead (Los Angeles-NL, +17.0G, Houston, +9.5G)...since 8/29, Tampa Bay is 10-1 and the Yankees are 6-3.
- Have lost just two of their last 24 completed series (15-2-7 since 6/17)...are 28-4-8 in their last 40 (since 4/16).
- Their +169 run differential ranks third in the Majors.
- Are 29-14 in games following a loss since 4/13.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated Boston, 10-5, on Sunday night at Fenway Park...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (4.0IP, 8H, 4ER, 0BB, 2K, 1HR) took a no-decision...**RHP Chad Green** (3.0IP, 5K) retired all 9BF...**2B Gleyber Torres** (3-for-5, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 4RBI, 1SB) hit a two-run HR in the second...**LF Mike Tauchman** (2-for-2, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his 13th HR before exiting with left calf tightness...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his eighth HR in his last 15G.

- Other than the Red Sox' one-run eighth, every run was scored in a two-run inning (Yankees: second, third, fourth, fifth, ninth; Red Sox: third, fourth).

GREENY BABY: RHP **Chad Green** retired all 9BF with 5K and earned his third win on Sun. at Boston...has retired 28-of-34 batters over his last five appearances (one start) while tossing 9.1 scoreless innings (2H, 4BB, 17K).

GLEYBER DAY: INF **Gleyber Torres** went 3-for-5 with 2R, 1 double, 1SB and a two-run HR on Sun. at Boston, his 35th HR of the season...**is the second middle infielder ever to hit 35HR in a season at age-22 or younger** (min. 50% of G at 2B/SS), joining Seattle's Alex Rodriguez, who hit 42HR in 1998 at 22 years old and 36HR in 1996 at 20 years old.

- Sunday marked his second career game with a HR and a SB (also 8/27/18 vs. Chicago-AL).
- His 15HR since the start of August are tied for the most in the Majors (Colorado's Nolan Arenado, Cincinnati's Aristides Aquino and Eugenio Suarez).
- Is tied for fourth in the AL with a team-leading 35HR...are the third-most HRs by a middle infielder in Yankees history (min. 50% of G at 2B/SS), behind 2B Alfonso Soriano (39HR in 2002, 38HR in 2003)...only one middle infielder has led the Yankees in HRs in the last 100 seasons (Robinson Cano-27HR in 2013).
- Is one of two Yankees to hit at least 30HR in his age-22 season or younger (also Joe DiMaggio-46HR in 1937 at age 22).

ALL RISE: RF **Aaron Judge** hit a solo HR on Sun. at Boston...has homered in eight of his last 15G (since 8/23), batting .290 (18-for-62) with 11R, 2 doubles, 8HR and 13RBI...is tied for second in the Majors in HRs in that span (Cincinnati's Eugenio Suarez-10HR)...has homered in six consecutive series...the Yankees are 16-3 in games in which he homers in 2019.

RISP-Y BUSINESS: Yankees batters went 5-for-12 with RISP on Sun. at Boston...are 9-for-24 (.375) in this series after hitting .165 (14-for-85) with RISP in their previous 15G.

RACE TO THE FINISH: The Yankees can eliminate Boston from AL East contention with a win tonight...would eliminate Tampa Bay with 10 wins/Rays losses.

- Would seal their third consecutive postseason berth by clinching better records than two of these four teams: Boston (elimination number: 2), Cleveland (elim. number: 8), Oakland (elim. number: 10) and Tampa Bay (elim. number: 10).

SEEING RED: The Yankees are 13-5 vs. Boston in 2019, **matching their most wins over the Red Sox in one season in the Expansion Era (since 1961)**...also won 13 head-to-head matchups in 2012 (13-5), 2001 (13-5) and 1961 (13-5).

- With a win tonight, would be the first team since 1973 to earn at least 14 wins over Boston...would be the fifth to do it in the Expansion Era: 1973 Tigers (15-3), 1965 Twins (17-1), 1965 White Sox (14-4), 1964 White Sox (14-4)...the last time the Yankees won more than 14 meetings was in 1960 (15-7).

FEAST ON THE EAST: The Yankees are 16-3 in their last 19G vs. the AL East and 39-13 (.750) in their last 52G...are 50-17 (.746) vs. the AL East in 2019, the second-best record by any club vs. its own division (Houston, 46-15, .754 vs. AL West).

- In the six-division era (since 1994), are the fourth AL East team to win at least 50 games within the division, joining Boston in 2018 (52-24), Boston in 2002 (51-25) and the Yankees in 2001 (50-24).
- Are 22-11 vs. the AL East on the road (are 28-6 at home)...are their most road wins in the division since going 24-13 in 2006...have dropped only two of their last 10 road series (5-2-2, current series pending).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit 12HR in the last 5G...have homered in 18 of their last 20G, with multiple HRs in nine of their last 13G...have hit 36HR in their last 15G.

- Their 268HR are a franchise record and the second-highest total in Major League history behind Minnesota's Major League-record 275HR this season...surpassed their previous club record on Sun. at Boston (267HR in 2018)...are on pace to hit 301HR.
- Have hit 14HR in 7G in September (Minnesota: 7HR, tied for third-fewest in the Majors)...set a Major League record for a calendar month with 74HR in August.
- Have 25 individual multi-HR games, second-most in Major League history (2019 Twins-30)...have recorded 13 of them since the start of August.
- Are second in the Majors with 832R and 5.78 runs/game (Minnesota-833R, 5.83 runs/game).
- Scored 10R on Sun. at Boston for the second time in their last 5G...their 21G with at least 10R are second-most in the Majors (Houston-24G), and are 21-0 in those games.

PARROT TALK: 1B/DH **Edwin Encarnación** went 3-for-5 with 1R and 1RBI on Sun. at Boston...in 5G since returning from the I.L., is hitting .318 (7-for-22) with 4R, 1 double, 2HR and 6RBI.

- Despite missing a month, is still batting .330/.402/.630 (33-for-100) with 19R, 9 doubles, 7HR, 26RBI, 10BB and 2HP in 25G since the All-Star break.

ROAD RULES: The Yankees are 41-28 (.594) on the road this season, the Majors' fourth-best road record...are 6-1 in their last seven road games...have clinched a winning road record for the second straight season and fourth time in six years.

- Are second in the Majors with 429R and 6.22 runs/game on the road to Minnesota (448R, 6.22 runs/game)...would be the Majors' fifth-highest road scoring average since 1940 (excl. strike-shortened seasons)...lead the Majors in road OBP (.345) and are second in OPS (.849), BA (.274) and SLG (.504).
- Are 11-7 (7-5 on the road, 4-2 at home) to begin a stretch of 24 of their final 36G on the road (starting 8/20)...are 2-1 to start a stretch of 15-of-21G on the road to end the season.

▶ Has been ejected four times in 2019 (4/20 vs. Kansas City by 2B umpire Jerry Meals, 5/1 at Arizona by HP umpire Paul Emmel, 7/18 Game 1 vs. Tampa Bay by HP umpire Brennan Miller and 8/17 vs. Cleveland by HP umpire Ben May)...has eight career managerial ejections.

▶ **1B/DH Edwin Encarnación** recorded a season-high-tying 3H on Sun. at Boston...hit his 32nd HR of the season and 11th as a Yankee on Sat. at Boston...was the 13th Yankee to hit 10HR with the club this season, establishing a Major League record...has 2HR and 1 double in 4G since his return from the I.L....was on the 10-day I.L. from 8/3-9/3 with a right wrist fracture...suffered the injury on a HBP in Game 1 of a doubleheader vs. Boston on 8/3...in two rehab games with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, was 1-for-8 with 2R, 1RBI and 1HP...of his 37H with the Yankees, 11 are HRs (15 singles, 11 doubles)...was added to the Yankees' 25-man roster on 6/17 after being acquired by the club from Seattle with cash on 6/15 in exchange for RHP Juan Then...hit .241/.356/.531 (58-for-241) with 48R, 7 doubles, 21HR, 49RBI and 41BB in 65G w/ Seattle...with 401HR at the time he was acquired, had the third-most HR ever by a player before playing his first game with the Yankees (Jose Canseco-440HR in 2000 and Andruw Jones-407HR in 2011).

▶ **INF Thairo Estrada** was reinstated from the 10-day I.L. on Sunday...was placed on the 10-day injured list on 8/18 with a right hamstring strain...is in his fourth stint with the Yankees (4/4-6, 4/21-6/6, 6/29-30, 8/14-pres)...hit his first Major League HR off fellow Venezuelan Félix Hernández on 5/6 vs. Seattle...made his Major League debut on 4/21...in 60G with Triple-A Scranton/WB, hit .266 (64-for-241) with 39R, 17 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR and 32RBI.

▶ **INF Mike Ford has 5HR in his last 8G.**...is hitting .315 (17-for-54) with 10R, 2 doubles, 7HR, 11RBI, 3BB and 1HP in his last 18G (since 8/12-G2)...hit safely in a career-best seven straight games from 8/25-9/2...hit his first career "walk-off" HR on 9/1 vs. Oakland...marked his first career pinch-hit HR (is 3-for-6 as PH)...was the first rookie in Yankees history to hit a pinch-hit walkoff home run (credit: STATS)...was the second PH HR by a Yankee this season (Hicks on 7/5 at Tampa Bay)...was the sixth pinch-hit, "walk-off" HR in the Majors this season, and first by a Yankee since Neil Walker on 8/28/18 vs. Chicago-AL (off Dylan Covey)...recorded his first career multi-HR game and had a career-high 3RBI on 8/26 at Seattle...homed in back-to-back games for the first time in his career on 8/25 at Los Angeles-NL and 8/26 at Seattle...is in his third stint with the Yankees (also 4/16-5/3, 7/2-6, 8/3-pres)...hit .303/.401/.605 (89-for-294) with 59R, 20 doubles, 23HR and 60RBI in 79G w/ Scranton/WB.

▶ **OF Clint Frazier** turned 25 on Friday...is in his second stint with the Yankees (4/1-6/16, 9/1-pres)...has a career-high 11HR and the Yankees are 8-1 when he homers in 2019 (two multi-HR games)...since 1987, is the third Yankees outfielder (min. 50% of games in OF), in his age-24 season or younger, to reach double digits in HR (also Melky Cabrera, 13HR in 2009 and Bernie Williams, 12HR in 1993, both age 24)...was placed on the 10-day I.L. with a left ankle sprain from 4/25 (retro. to 4/23) - 5/5...hit .247 (61-for-247) with 35R, 20 doubles, 1 triple, 8HR and 26RBI in 61 games with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

▶ **OF Brett Gardner** stole his 10th base of the season on Sat. at Boston, his 11th season with double-digit steals (2008-11, '13-19), fourth-most in franchise history, behind Derek Jeter (17), Roy White (13) and Willie Randolph (12)...has 25XBB in his last 43G (13 doubles, 3 triples, 9HR)...has tied a career high with 21HR (also 2017)...led off the ninth inning of 9/1 game vs. Oakland with a game-tying HR...marked his seventh career game-tying or go-ahead HR in the ninth inning or later, first since 5/29/18 vs. Houston (two-run game-tying HR off Devenski in the ninth)...was ejected in the bottom of the sixth inning of 8/17 win vs. Cleveland...was his sixth career ejection and second of the season (also 8/9)...since 2017, the Yankees are 38-11 when he homers...missed 9G on the 10-day injured list from 7/25 (retro. to 7/22)-8/1 with left knee inflammation...was his first stint on the I.L. since 2012...has hit in every spot in the starting lineup except cleanup...is one of 16 players drafted and signed by the Yankees to reach 100HR in the Majors and one of seven to hit at least 100HR with the Yankees (also Judge, Posada, Jeter, Mattingly, Munson and Pagliarulo)...is the Yankees' longest-tenured player (third round 2005 draft pick, MLB debut in 2008).

▶ **SS Didi Gregorius** has 14HR this season, five of which have come with at least two runners on base...snapped an 0-for-16 with a two-run single in the eighth inning on 9/1 vs. Oakland...missed 2G (8/26-27) with a right shoulder contusion after being hit by a pitch in the first inning on 8/25...has 41RBI in his last 43G (since 7/16)...hit his 100th career home run on 7/23 at Minnesota (off Kyle Gibson) as part of a career-best 5-for-5, 2R, 2 double, 7RBI game...became the first AL shortstop ever to collect 5H and 7RBI in a game and the fifth Yankee since 1920 to go 5-for-5 with at least 7RBI in a contest...missed the Yankees' first 61G of the season on the 60-day I.L. (reinstated on 6/7) recovering from "Tommy John" surgery performed on 10/17/18.

▶ **C Kyle Higashioka** was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on Sun...is in his third stint with the Yankees (also 4/12-23, 7/24-8/9)...collected his first career multi-HR game and set a career high with 5RBI on 8/7 at Baltimore...had never had more than 2RBI in a game entering the night...hit doubles in the second and third innings on 8/4 vs. Boston, his first career game with 2XBB...had 4 doubles in 46G before the game...in 70G with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, hit .278/.348/.581 (67-for-241) with 42R, 13 doubles, 20HR and 56RBI.

▶ **OF Cameron Maybin** has appeared in just three of the Yankees' last 13G (since 8/25)...was 11-for-21 (.524) with 7R, 5 doubles, 2HR and 7RBI during his career-high-tying five-game extra-base hit streak from 8/3 (G2) - 8/8...was placed on the 10-day injured list from 6/23 (retro. to 6/22) - 7/25 with a left calf strain (missed 27G)...homed in a career-best four straight games from 6/15-18, tied for the longest such streak by a Yankee since 2008 (8x)...made his Yankees debut on 4/26 at San Francisco...was acquired by the Yankees from Cleveland for cash considerations on 4/25.

▶ **C Austin Romine** is batting .329 (28-for-85) with 11R, 5 doubles, 4HR and 14RBI in 25G since the start of July...has 13RBI over his last 20G, recording multiple RBI in three straight games from 7/26-31 for just the second time in his career (4G from 5/20-26/18)...reached base safely in a career-best 15 straight games from 7/5-8/8, hitting .388 (19-for-49) with 9R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 12RBI and 4BB over the span.

LHP James Paxton will make his 26th start of the season in tonight's series finale at Boston...the 30-year-old will start on extended five days' rest after winning his seventh consecutive start with 7.0 shutout innings (1H, 1BB, 12K) on Tues. vs. Texas...**has won seven consecutive starts, tied for the longest streak of his career** (also seven straight starts from 7/2-8/4/17)...his **12 wins tie a career high** (12-5 in 2017 w/ Seattle)...missed 23 games on the 10-day injured list with left knee inflammation from 5/4-28...on 4/16 vs. Boston and 4/21 vs. Kansas City, became just the second Yankees pitcher ever to record back-to-back games with at least 12K (also David Cone in 1998)...added a third 12K game on 9/3 vs. Texas...made his Yankees debut on 3/30 vs. Baltimore...made his fifth career Opening Day active roster (also: 2014-15, '17-18 with Seattle)...his 11.18 K/9.0IP ratio (532K/428.1IP) since 2017 ranks sixth among pitchers with at least 300.0IP in that span (Chris Sale-13.21, Max Scherzer-12.25, Robbie Ray-12.01, Gerrit Cole-11.53 and Justin Verlander-11.22)...is just the eighth Canadian pitcher to appear in a game for the Yankees, the first since LHP Jeff Francis and RHP Chris Leroux in 2014...has recorded a sub-4.00 ERA in every season of his career... was acquired by the Yankees from the Mariners in exchange for LHP Justus Sheffield, RHP Erik Swanson and OF Dom Thompson-Williams on 11/19/18...was originally selected by the Mariners in the fourth round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST START: On 9/3 vs. Texas, struck out 12 and allowed 1H and 1BB over 7.0 scoreless innings to win his seventh consecutive start (since 8/2)...the only hit was a two-out single by Isiah Kiner-Falefa...was the third start in Yankees history with at least 12K and 1H-or-fewer, also Mike Mussina (9.0IP, 1H, OR, OBB, 13K) on 9/2/01 at Boston and CC Sabathia (7.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 3BB, 14K) on 7/26/11 vs. Seattle.

- ✦ **Has allowed 1H in each of his last two starts**...is the fourth pitcher in Yankees history to complete 5.0IP and allow 1H-or-fewer in consecutive starts (within one season), joining Don Larsen (9/20 & 9/28/58), Whitey Ford (9/2 and 9/7/55) and Vic Raschi (9/9 and 9/14/51).

12-PAX: On 9/3 vs. Texas, struck out 12 and allowed 1H and 1BB over 7.0 scoreless innings to win his seventh consecutive start (since 8/2).

- ✦ Was his third 12K this season, fourth career (16K on 5/2/18 vs. Oakland w/ Seattle, 12K on 4/16/19 vs. Boston, 12K on 4/21/19 vs. Kansas City)...is one of five Yankees pitchers (sixth time) to record at least 12K three times in one season, joining Al Downing (4 in 1963, 3 in 1967), Masahiro Tanaka (3 in 2017), Mike Mussina (3 in 2001) and David Cone (3 in 1997)...is one of six pitchers in 2019 with at least 3G with 12K (Gerrit Cole-8, Chris Sale-6, Justin Verlander-5, Max Scherzer-5, Blake Snell-5).
- ✦ Is tied for fourth in the Majors with 5G with at least 11K...with his starts on 7/7 at Tampa Bay (11K, OBB) and 8/23 at Los Angeles-NL (11K, OBB), this marks the eighth season in franchise history that a pitcher has recorded multiple games with at least 11K and OBB, the first since Tanaka in 2017 (3G).

SEVENTH HEAVEN: **Has won seven consecutive starts, tied for the longest streak of his career** (won seven straight starts from 7/2-8/4/17)...owns a 2.98 ERA (42.1IP, 25H, 14ER, 15BB, 51K, 5HR) during the streak...is the Majors' longest active streak and the longest streak by a Yankee this season...the only pitcher to win eight consecutive starts in the Majors in 2019 is Chicago-AL's Lucas Giolito (eight starts from 5/7-6/14)...the last Yankee to win eight straight starts is Ivan Nova (eight starts from 7/1-9/2/11).

- ✦ Is the fifth Yankees pitcher since 1940 to win at least seven straight starts in his first season with the club, joining John Candelaria (1988), Mike Torrez (1977), Dock Ellis (1976) and Bobby Shantz (1957), all seven-start streaks.
- ✦ Went 6-0 in August, one of just two Yankees to go 6-0 or better in August since 1979 (also Andy Pettitte, 6-0 in 6GS in August 2007).

VS. BOSTON: Is 4-1 with a 3.32 ERA (43.1IP, 16ER) in seven career starts vs. the Red Sox...13 of the 16ER came in two starts, on 6/15/18 w/ Seattle (2.1IP, 6ER) and 7/26/19 at Fenway (4.0IP, 7ER)...as a Yankee in 2019, is 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (18.0IP, 9ER).

- ✦ Will make just his second career start at Fenway Park, also 7/26/19 (4.0IP, 9H, OBB, 9K, 4HR).

ROAD RULES: Is 6-3 with a 4.80 ERA (60.0IP, 68H, 33R/32ER, 19BB, 78K, 12HR) in 11 road starts in 2019...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in six of his last seven starts and completed 6.0IP in 5-of-7...issued 5BB in his last road start after recording 38K against just 1BB over his previous four...owns a 11.70 K/9.0IP ratio on the road this season (78K/60.0IP).

2019: Has completed 6.0IP with 2R-or-fewer in 7-of-12 starts since the start of July, going 7-3 with a 3.99 ERA (67.2IP, 30ER) in that span...has held opponents to 1ER-or-fewer in 9-of-25 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 15-of-25.

- ✦ His 11.45 K/9.0IP ratio ranks eighth in the Majors (sixth in the AL), min. 100.0IP...would be the highest single-season K/9.0IP in Yankees history (min. 100.0IP), currently held by Mariano Rivera (10.87 in 1996).
- ✦ Of his season-high 109 pitches on 8/23 at Los Angeles-NL, got 29 swings-and-misses, the most by a Yankee in the Statcast era (since 2015)...were tied for the most in a game in this season in the Majors, with Houston's Gerrit Cole (29 on 6/7 vs. Baltimore) and Houston's Justin Verlander (29 on 6/12 vs. Milwaukee).
- ✦ Became the third Yankee to record 9K in 4.0IP-or-fewer on 7/26 at Boston, but allowed a career-high 4HR.
- ✦ Left his start on 5/3 vs. Minnesota after 3.0IP (2H, 1R/0ER, 3BB, 1K)...missed 23 games on the 10-day I.L. with left knee inflammation (5/4-28).
