BALTIMORE ORIOLES (13-29) at BOSTON RED SOX (29-14)

RHP Kevin Gausman (3-2, 3.18) vs. LHP David Price (3-4, 4.89)

TAKE TWO: Tonight's game is the rescheduled contest from Patriots Day on Monday, April 16 that was postponed due to forecasted inclement weather...It marked the first Patriots Day game to be postponed since 1984.

THESE GO TO 11: OF Adam Jones gave the Orioles an early 1-0 lead with a one-out solo home run in the first inning on Wednesday afternoon against the Phillies...The blast marked his seventh home run of the season...Jones has hit safely in a season-high 11 consecutive games, his longest hitting streak since also collecting a hit in 11 straight from June 16-30, 2016...He is batting .341 (15-for-44) with three home runs, five RBI, and nine runs scored during this streak (since May 3).

GRAND CENTRAL STATION: OF Adam Jones hit his 254th career home run as a center fielder on Wednesday...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 254 homers hit while playing center field rank 13th all-time in Major League history...He also ranks fifth all-time among American League hitters...Among AL hitters, he trails Mickey Mantle (432), Ken Griffey, Jr. (382), Fred Lynn (266), and Bernie Williams (261)...Willie Mays is the all-time leader with 640 home runs as a center fielder.

YOU'RE LOOKING AT THE MAN-NY: SS Manny Machado has hit safely in 33-of-42 games played this season...Machado currently ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories (see chart at right)...Additionally, his .422 on-base percentage ranks fourth in the AL and ranks seventh in the majors...His .652 slugging percentage ranks second in the AL and second in the majors...His 17 multi-hit games rank tied for third in the AL and are tied for fourth in the majors...His 105 total bases are tied for second in the AL and are tied for third in the majors...His seven intentional walks lead the AL and rank second in the majors.

MORE ABOUT MANNY: SS Manny Machado went 2-for-4 with two home runs (one grand slam) and six RBI last Friday night...It marked his first grand slam of the season and the eighth of his career...Machado's eight grand slams ties him with Chris Davis for most in the majors since his debut in 2012...Last Friday, he hit the 149th and 150th home runs of his career, becoming the youngest Oriole to collect 150 career home runs (25 years, 309 days old)...Prior to Machado, Eddie Murray was the youngest Oriole to reach 150 home runs at 26 years, 165 days.

THE COMPANY YOU KEEP: SS Manny Machado hit two home runs on Friday against the Rays for his fourth multi-home run game of the season and the 18th of his career...According to STATS, LLC., Machado ranks fourth all-time among American League hitters in multi home run games before turning 26 years old...He trails Hal Trosky (20), Jimmie Foxx (19), and Alex Rodriguez (19)...With his 18th career multi-home run game, Machado passed Joe DiMaggio (17).

CATCH THIS: On April 21, C Chance Sisco threw out three Cleveland baserunners attempting to steal...He caught LF Michael Brantley attempting to steal second base in the sixth inning, SS Francisco Lindor at second base in the seventh inning, and PR Rajai Davis at third in the ninth inning...It marked the first time an Orioles catcher had three catcher-caught-stealing in a game since C Matt Wieters caught three baserunners on August 25, 2012 vs. Toronto...Sisco has caught 9-of-18 would-be base stealers this season...Sisco enters tonight's game tied for first in the majors with Jonathan Lucroy with nine catcher caught stealing.

TAKE A CHANCE: In Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader, C Chance Sisco cut Baltimore's deficit to 3-2 with an RBI double in the second inning, then tied the game with his steal of home on a double steal with 3B Jace Peterson, who stole second base...It marked Sisco's first career stolen base, and the first steal of home by an Orioles player since Seth Smith did so on May 4, 2017 at Boston...According to STATS, LLC., Sisco is the first Orioles catcher to steal home (since 1974, when such data is available)...He is the first catcher in the majors to steal home since Toronto's Russell Martin did so on June 2, 2015 at Washington...Sisco is the 39th catcher in the majors to steal home (since 1974)...Became the first Oriole to steal home for their first career stolen base since Cal Ripken, Jr. on May 31, 1982 vs. Texas.

DANDY DEBUT: RHP David Hess made his Major League debut in Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader and earned the first win of his career after holding the Rays to three runs on six hits with three strikeouts over 6.0 innings of work...Hess retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced (two singles)...With C Chance Sisco behind the plate, Hess' start marked the first time an Orioles pitcher made their Major League debut with a rookie catcher behind the plate since August 4, 2009 when LHP Brian Matusz made his debut on the mound and the starting catcher was rookie Matt Wieters...Hess became the first Oriole pitcher to start and win his Major League debut since RHP Mike Wright, Jr. did so on May 17, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-AL (7.1 IP, 0 R, 4 H, 6 K).

KEEPING UP WITH JONES: On May 4, OF Adam Jones played in his 1,500th game with the Orioles and went 3-for-4 with a home run...He became the eighth player in Orioles history (since 1954) to reach the 1,500 games played mark...Jones joined Cal Ripken, Jr. (3,001 games), Brooks Robinson (2,896), Mark Belanger (1,962), Eddie Murray (1,884), Boog Powell (1,763), Brady Anderson (1,759), and Paul Blair (1,700) as players to appear in at least 1,500 games with the Orioles...According to STATS, LLC., Jones became the seventh active player to reach 1,500 games with his current team...Jones joined the O's in February 2008 when he was acquired from the Seattle Mariners along with RHP Chris Tillman, LHP George Sherrill, RHP Kam Mickolio, and LHP Tony Butler in exchange for LHP Erik Bedard.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: RHP Dylan Bundy tossed the Orioles 18th Quality Start of the season on Sunday...The Orioles 18 Quality Starts this season are tied for fifth in the American League...Bundy and RHP Kevin Gausman are tied for 14th in the American League with five Quality Starts each this season...Orioles starters have received just 95 runs of support this season, which ranks fewest in the majors...Overall, Orioles pitchers have received 174 runs of support this season, with ranks fourth-fewest in the AL.

VS. BOSTON: The Orioles and Red Sox play the fourth game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The Red Sox lead the season series, 3-0...The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 10-9...Baltimore trails Boston in the all-time series, 489-566, with the Orioles trailing 249-280 at home and trailing 240-286 at Boston.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 1967, the Orioles hit seven home runs for the first time in a 12-8 win at Boston...Four of the homers (C Andy Etchebarren, PH Sam Bowens, 1B Boog Powell, and 2B Davey Johnson) came in a nine-run seventh inning...CF Paul Blair, 3B Brooks Robinson, and RF Frank Robinson also went deep for the Orioles...The seven-homer game was matched on Aug. 8, 1985 at California and again on Sept. 26, 2012 vs. Toronto...The O's record for most home runs in a game is eight (June 16, 2015 vs. Philadelphia).

BLAME IT ON THE RAIN: The postponed game between the Orioles and Philadelphia Phillies on Tuesday, May 15, has been rescheduled for Thursday, July 12, at 6:05 p.m. ET...Tickets and parking for the May 15 game will be automatically honored for the makeup game on July 12...Fans unable to attend the July 12 makeup game may exchange the value of their May 15 tickets and parking toward any remaining home game this season.

DISABLED LIST: Seven Orioles are currently on the disabled list...OF Colby Rasmus (left hip flexor strain, since 4/7), INF Luis Sardiñas (lower back strain, retroactive to 4/29), RHP Darren O'Day (retroactive to 5/6, hyperextended right elbow), and RHP Chris Tillman (lower back strain, since 5/11) are on the 10-day disabled list...LHP Zach Britton (right Achilles surgery, since 2/15), RHP Gabriel Ynoa (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26), and INF Tim Beckham (left groin strain, retroactive to 4/24) are on the 60-day DL.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), Buck Showalter is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (635-598, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,517 career wins rank 23rd all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy and Mike Scioscia...His 635 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Making his ninth start of the 2018 season...Prior to the 2018 season, he changed his number to No. 34 to honor the late Roy Halladay, his childhood hero and fellow Coloradan..Made a team-leading 34 starts last year, which was also a career-high, passing his previous high of 30 set in 2016...Was ejected for the first time in his career on May 3 at Boston after hitting Xander Bogaerts.

LAST START: Gausman made his eighth start of the season on May 11 vs. Tampa Bay...He earned the win after tossing 7.1 innings, allowing two runs on 11 hits with six strikeouts...The 11 hits allowed were a career-high; was his first career win in which he has allowed more than nine hits; he is 1-6 in 12 such career starts...Second time this season not issuing a walk...His fifth Quality Start of the season...The Orioles improved to 4-4 in his eight starts...Seventh-straight start allowing three earned runs or less...Threw 107 pitches, 86 strikes.

CAREER VS. BOSTON: Gausman will be making his first start of the season against the Red Sox and the 14th of his career (19th appearance)...He is a career 4-6 with a 3.83 ERA (34 ER/80.0 IP) and four Quality Starts against the Red Sox...Has made two-straight scoreless starts against Boston...His last start against them came on September 19, 2017 at Oriole Park when he worked 8.0 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with one walk and seven strikeouts; he did not factor in the decision as the Orioles lost 1-0...His last start at Fenway Park came on August 26, 2017 when he worked 7.2 scoreless innings, allowing four hits with three walks and five strikeouts; he earned the win as the Orioles won 7-0...In six career starts (10 games) at Fenway Park, he has gone 2-3 with a 3.68 ERA (15 ER/36.2 IP); he has alternated wins and losses in his last four starts, winning his last one...His only career ejection came on May 3 in Boston.

VS. AL EAST: Gausman will be making his fourth start against an AL East opponent this season...He is 2-0 with a 3.44 ERA (7 ER/18.1 IP) against the division so far this season...Gausman has made 57 career starts (75 appearances) against the division; he is 23-19 with a 3.51 ERA (137 ER/351.2 IP) in his previous 75 games against the division, making 26 Quality Starts and averaging 8.19 strikeouts-per-9.0 innings...Gausman has won seven of his last nine decisions (12 starts total) against divisional opponents dating back to June 27 of last season, posting a 1.67 ERA (14 ER/75.1 IP) in that span.

GETTING THEM EARLY: Gausman has allowed a .115 (3-for-26) opponents batting average with a 0-2 count...With a 1-2 count, opponents are hitting .097 (3-for-31)...When the count is even with two strikes at 2-2, opponents are hitting .233 (7-for-30), and with a full count opponents are hitting .188 (3-for-16)...The first time through the lineup, opponents are hitting .258 (17-for-66), second time through, .232 (16-for-69), and the third time through, .264 (14-for-53).

FIRST INNING TROUBLE: Gausman has surrendered runs in the first inning of three of his eight starts this season (four runs on 4/1 vs. MIN, one run on 4/6 vs. NYY, one run on 4/11 vs. TOR), bringing his career first inning ERA to 5.45 (69 ER/114.0 IP), his highest career ERA for any inning...Last season, Gausman posted a 6.35 ERA (24 ER/34.0 IP) in the first inning, the sixth-highest mark among AL pitchers (min. 20 starts).

HOME SWEET HOME: Gausman has made five starts at Oriole Park, going 3-2 with a 4.06 ERA (14 ER/31.0 IP)...He owns a career record of 22-16 and a 3.57 ERA (135 ER/340.1 IP) at home, as opposed to being 15-29 with a 4.62 ERA (180 ER/350.1 IP) in 59 career starts (74 appearances) on the road...Last season, Gausman made 17 starts at Oriole Park, going 4-5 with a 4.61 ERA (49 ER/95.2 IP), 38 walks and 102 strikeouts...As a starter, he is 20-15 with a 3.48 ERA (127 ER/328.1 IP) in his 55 career starts at Oriole Park.

RARE OCCURRENCE: Gausman tossed 9.0 scoreless innings allowing just two hits and striking out six while not factoring in the decision on May 5 at Oakland...He is the first Orioles starter to toss 9.0 scoreless innings and not earn the win since LHP Zach Britton (9.0 IP, 3 H, 5 K) on May 12, 2011 vs. Seattle...He is the first Orioles starter to toss 9.0 scoreless innings while allowing two-or-less hits and not earn the win since RHP Mike Morgan (9.0 IP, 2 H, 4 K) on April 16, 1988 vs. Cleveland...The loss was the ninth loss in Orioles history (since 1954) in which the Orioles starter went at least 9.0 scoreless innings and the Orioles lost the game; the O's are 436-9 in such games.

IMMACULATE INNING: Gausman struck out the side in the seventh inning on nine pitches on 4/23 against Cleveland...The inning marked Gausman's first "immaculate inning" of his career...According to STATS LLC., he was the first Orioles pitcher to accomplish the feat since 1988 (since such records have been kept)...Since 1988, an "immaculate inning" has been recorded 52 times in the majors and Gausman's was the first since RHP Rick Porcello did so against Tampa Bay in the fifth inning on August 9, 2017.

QUICK ON THE DRAW: With his three strikeouts on April 6 at New York-AL, Gausman passed 600 strikeouts for his career (now has 629)...According to STATS, LLC., Gausman's 131 career games to reach the 600-strikeout mark rank as the third-fewest in Orioles history (since 1954)...LHP Erik Bedard (110 games) and RHP Daniel Cabrera (129 games) rank first and second, respectively...Ranking fourth and fifth-fewest games to 600 are RHP Mike Mussina (133 games) and RHP Jim Palmer (138 games).
