### BALTIMORE ORIOLES (13-30) at BOSTON RED SOX (30-14)

### RHP Alex Cobb (0-5, 7.06) vs. LHP Drew Pomeranz (1-1, 5.47)

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY BROOKS:** Orioles Legend **Brooks Robinson** turns 81 years old today...“Mr. Oriole” spent 23 seasons with the Orioles and started 20 consecutive Opening Day games...He won the American League Most Valuable Player Award in 1964 and holds the record for most Gold Gloves by a position player with 16...He was elected to Baseball’s Hall of Fame (in his first year of eligibility in 1983) and was named MVP of the 1970 World Series...Robinson played in 18 All-Star games and was the All-Star Game MVP in 1966...In 2016, Robinson was honored at the annual Rawlings Gold Glove Award ceremony with a Lifetime Achievement Award...During his career, he hit safely in each of the 12 games he played on his birthday, hitting .435 (20-for-46) with one double, a home run, six runs scored, and five RBI.

**YOU'RE LOOKING AT THE MAN-NY:** **SS Manny Machado** has hit safely in 34-of-43 games played this season...Machado currently ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories (see chart at right)...Additionally, his .418 on-base percentage ranks fifth in the AL and ranks eighth in the majors...His .661 slugging percentage ranks second in the AL and second in the majors...His 17 multi-hit games rank tied for third in the AL and are tied for fourth in the majors...His 109 total bases are tied for second in the AL and rank third in the majors...His seven intentional walks lead the AL and rank second in the majors.

**MORE ABOUT MANNY:** **SS Manny Machado** went 2-for-4 with two home runs (one grand slam) and six RBI last Friday night...It marked his first grand slam of the season and the eighth of his career...Machado’s eight grand slams ties him with **Chris Davis** for most in the majors since his debut in 2012...Last Friday, he hit the 149<sup>th</sup> and 150<sup>th</sup> home runs of his career, becoming the youngest Oriole to collect 150 career home runs (25 years, 309 days old)...Prior to Machado, **Eddie Murray** was the youngest Oriole to reach 150 home runs at 26 years, 165 days.

**THE COMPANY YOU KEEP:** **SS Manny Machado** hit two home runs on Friday against the Rays for his fourth multi-home run game of the season and the 18<sup>th</sup> of his career...According to STATS, LLC., Machado ranks fourth all-time among American League hitters in multi home run games before turning 26 years old...He trails **Hal Trosky** (20), **Jimmie Foxx** (19), and **Alex Rodriguez** (19)...With his 18<sup>th</sup> career multi-home run game, Machado passed **Joe DiMaggio** (17).

**GRAND CENTRAL STATION:** **OF Adam Jones** hit his 254<sup>th</sup> career home run as a center fielder on Wednesday...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 254 homers hit while playing center field rank 13<sup>th</sup> all-time in Major League history...He also ranks fifth all-time among American League hitters...Among AL hitters, he trails **Mickey Mantle** (432), **Ken Griffey, Jr.** (382), **Fred Lynn** (266), and **Bernie Williams** (261)...**Willie Mays** is the all-time leader with 640 home runs as a center fielder.

**CATCH THIS:** On April 21, **C Chance Sisco** threw out three Cleveland baserunners attempting to steal...He caught **LF Michael Brantley** attempting to steal second base in the sixth inning, **SS Francisco Lindor** at second base in the seventh inning, and **PR Rajai Davis** at third in the ninth inning...It marked the first time an Orioles catcher had three catcher-caught-stealing in a game since **C Matt Wieters** caught three baserunners on August 25, 2012 vs. Toronto...Sisco has caught 9-of-18 would-be base stealers this season...Sisco enters tonight’s game tied for first in the majors with **Jonathan Lucroy** with nine catcher caught stealing.

**TAKE A CHANCE:** In Game 1 of Saturday’s doubleheader, **C Chance Sisco** cut Baltimore’s deficit to 3-2 with an RBI double in the second inning, then tied the game with his steal of home on a double steal with **3B Jace Peterson**, who stole second base...It marked Sisco’s first career stolen base, and the first steal of home by an Orioles player since **Seth Smith** did so on May 4, 2017 at Boston...According to STATS, LLC., Sisco is the first Orioles catcher to steal home (since 1974, when such data is available)...He is the first catcher in the majors to steal home since Toronto’s **Russell Martin** did so on June 2, 2015 at Washington...Sisco is the 39<sup>th</sup> catcher in the majors to steal home (since 1974)...Became the first Oriole to steal home for their first career stolen base since **Cal Ripken, Jr.** on May 31, 1982 vs. Texas.

**KEEPING UP WITH JONES:** On May 4, **OF Adam Jones** played in his 1,500<sup>th</sup> game with the Orioles and went 3-for-4 with a home run...He became the eighth player in Orioles history (since 1954) to reach the 1,500 games played mark...Jones joined **Cal Ripken, Jr.** (3,001 games), **Brooks Robinson** (2,896), **Mark Belanger** (1,962), **Eddie Murray** (1,884), **Boog Powell** (1,763), **Brady Anderson** (1,759), and **Paul Blair** (1,700) as players to appear in at least 1,500 games with the Orioles...According to STATS, LLC., Jones became the seventh active player to reach 1,500 games with his current team...Jones joined the O’s in February 2008 when he was acquired from the Seattle Mariners along with RHP **Chris Tillman**, LHP **George Sherrill**, RHP **Kam Mickolio**, and LHP **Tony Butler** in exchange for LHP **Erik Bedard**.

**QUALITY OVER QUANTITY:** RHP **Dylan Bundy** tossed the Orioles 18<sup>th</sup> Quality Start of the season on Sunday...The Orioles 18 Quality Starts this season are tied for sixth in the American League...Bundy and RHP **Kevin Gausman** are tied for 15<sup>th</sup> in the American League with five Quality Starts each this season...Orioles starters have received just 95 runs of support this season, which ranks fewest in the majors...Overall, Orioles pitchers have received 176 runs of support this season, with ranks fourth-fewest in the AL.

**VS. BOSTON:** The Orioles and Red Sox play the fifth game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The Red Sox lead the season series, 4-0...The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 10-9...Baltimore trails Boston in the all-time series, 489-567, with the Orioles trailing 249-280 at home and trailing 240-287 at Boston.

**BLAME IT ON THE RAIN:** The postponed game between the Orioles and Phillies on May 15, has been rescheduled for July 12, at 6:05 p.m. ET...Tickets and parking for the May 15 game will be automatically honored for the makeup game on July 12...Fans unable to attend the July 12 makeup game may exchange the value of their May 15 tickets and parking toward any remaining home game this season.

**MANCINI JOINS HOOTON FOUNDATION:** **OF Trey Mancini** has joined the Taylor Hooton Foundation “Advisory Board” of active players from throughout Major League Baseball...The Taylor Hooton Foundation is widely acknowledged as the leader in the advocacy against appearance and performance enhancing substance use by the youth of America...The Orioles outfielder joins 38 other members of the Hooton Foundation’s “Advisory Board,” replacing **INF J.J. Hardy** as the Orioles representative.

**FEEL THE DRAFT:** The Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft will be held from Monday, June 4 through Wednesday, June 6 at MLB Network’s Studio 42 in Secaucus, NJ...Rounds one and two and both competitive balance rounds will take place on Monday, with rounds 3-10 on Tuesday, and rounds 11-40 on Wednesday...The draft will air on MLB Network and MLB.com...The Orioles own four picks in the top 115 of the 2018 Draft; the No. 11, 37, 87, and 115 overall selections.

**DISABLED LIST:** Seven Orioles are currently on the disabled list...**OF Colby Rasmus** (left hip flexor strain, since 4/7), **INF Luis Sardiñas** (lower back strain, retroactive to 4/29), **RHP Darren O’Day** (retroactive to 5/6, hyperextended right elbow), and **RHP Chris Tillman** (lower back strain, since 5/11) are on the 10-day disabled list...**LHP Zach Britton** (right Achilles surgery, since 2/15), **RHP Gabriel Ynoa** (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26), and **INF Tim Beckham** (left groin strain, retroactive to 4/24) are on the 60-day DL.

**COACHING STAFF:** The O’s welcomed back each member of the coaching staff from 2017...2018 marks the second season for **Howie Clark** (assistant hitting), **Roger McDowell** (pitching), and **Alan Mills** (bullpen); the fourth for **Scott Coolbaugh** (hitting); and sixth season for **Bobby Dickerson** (third base) and **Einar Diaz** (coach); while **Wayne Kirby** (first base) and **John Russell** (bench) return for their eighth years on the staff.

**THE SKIPPER:** A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), **Buck Showalter** is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (635-599, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter’s 1,517 career wins rank 23<sup>rd</sup> all-time and are third among active managers behind **Bruce Bochy** and **Mike Scioscia**...His 635 wins as O’s manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

**TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER**



**#17 RHP ALEX COBB**

**QUICK HITS:** Signed by the Orioles as a free agent on 3/21/18...Is two wins away from 50 career wins...Had spent his entire career (11 seasons) with the Tampa Bay Rays, including parts of six seasons with the Major League club...Missed the entire 2015 season due to "Tommy John" surgery...At the conclusion of the 2017 season, Cobb was the sixth-longest tenured Ray in club history (7 years, 61 days), and ranked among the franchise's all-time leaders in ERA (2<sup>nd</sup> - 3.50), wins (5<sup>th</sup> - 48), starts (6<sup>th</sup> - 115), innings pitched (5<sup>th</sup> - 700.0), and strikeouts (6<sup>th</sup> - 570)...Selected by the Rays in the fourth round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft.

**LAST START:** Suffered his fifth loss of the season in game two of the May 12 doubleheader vs. Tampa Bay...Allowed four runs, three earned, on seven hits, including two home runs, with five strikeouts...Exited the game after a one hour and 19 minute rain delay...Extended his career-long losing streak to five games...First start of the season in which he did not issue a walk...Second time this season allowing multiple home runs (April 14 at BOS)...Struck out a season-high tying five batters for the second-straight start...Threw 68 pitches, 44 strikes.

**CAREER VS. BOSTON:** Cobb will be making his 16<sup>th</sup> career start against the Red Sox; has gone 6-5 with a 4.02 ERA (38 ER/85.0 IP) in his first 15 starts...Made his 2018 debut against Boston on April 14 at Fenway Park and suffered the loss after allowing eight runs (seven earned) on 10 hits, including two home runs, with one walk in 3.2 innings...Has dropped two straight starts against the Red Sox after a career-best four-game winning streak against them (9/23/14-9/10/17)...Red Sox catcher Christian Vázquez is a career .727 (8-for-11) hitter against Cobb; his eight hits are tied for the fourth-most by any batter against him.

**AGAINST THE AL EAST:** Will be making his fourth start of the season against a divisional opponent; is 0-3 with a 9.64 ERA (15 ER/14.0 IP) in the first three games...Owns a career record of 21-16 with a 3.38 ERA (115 ER/306.1 IP) in 51 career starts against AL East opponents...Among all pitchers with at least 250.0 innings pitched against the division since his rookie season of 2011, Cobb ranks third in ERA and ninth in winning percentage (.568)...Has made 23 career road starts against AL East opponents, going 11-6 with a 4.05 ERA (60 ER/133.1 IP).

**ON THE ROAD:** Will be making his fifth road start of the season; has gone 0-3 with a 7.11 ERA (15 ER/19.0 IP) in four starts away from Oriole Park this year...He is a career 25-19 in 61 road starts with a 4.07 ERA (164 ER/362.1 IP)...In 2017, he went 6-5 with a 4.72 ERA (50 ER/95.1 IP) in 16 road starts, eight Quality Starts...44 of his 69 career home runs allowed have come on the road...In eight career starts at Fenway Park, Cobb has gone 5-2 with a 4.33 ERA (21 ER/43.2 IP).

**HOME SWEET HOME:** Has made two starts at home this season, going 0-2 with a 6.97 ERA (8 ER/10.1 IP)...Posted a 2.46 ERA (23 ER/84.0 IP) in 13 starts at Tropicana Field in 2017, marking the third-best home ERA in the AL behind Corey Kluber (1.81) and Justin Verlander (2.45)...It was also the fourth-best mark in Rays history...Made Quality Starts in seven of his 13 home games...For his career, owns a 3.21 ERA (131 ER/367.0 IP) in 60 career home starts, the seventh-best home ERA in the AL since 2011 (minimum 360.0 IP).

**THE HITS KEEP COMING:** Opponents have gone 49-for-132 (.371) against Cobb this season...Left-handed hitters are batting .500 (28-for-56) against him, while right-handers are batting .276 (21-for-76)...His 49 hits allowed are the most in baseball since making his season debut on April 14.

**2017 RECAP:** Made a career-high 29 starts for the Rays in 2017, going 12-10 with a 3.66 ERA (73 ER/179.1 IP)...Established career highs in innings pitched (179.1) and wins (12)...Led the Rays in victories and ranked second to Chris Archer in starts, innings pitched, and strikeouts (128)...Worked at least 6.0 innings in nine straight starts from 6/9-7/26, the longest streak of his career...Tossed 8.0 shutout innings on 6/27 at PIT, allowing two hits with one walk and four strikeouts; had a no-hitter until Josh Harrison and Andrew McCutchen opened the seventh inning with back-to-back singles...Posted a 2.82 ERA (12 ER/38.1 IP) in seven starts from 8/1 through the end of the season...Spent 16 games on the disabled list from 8/6-23 due to turf toe on his right big toe...Named one of three finalists for the AL Gold Glove Award as the league's top defensive pitcher.
