### BALTIMORE ORIOLES (14-30) at BOSTON RED SOX (30-15)

### RHP Dylan Bundy (2-5, 4.53) vs. RHP Rick Porcello (5-1, 3.28)

**SECOND BEST: 2B Jonathan Schoop** hit a seventh-inning home run in Friday's 7-4 win...It marked the 93<sup>rd</sup> home run of his career...Schoop passed **Brian Roberts** for the most home runs by a second baseman (primary position) in Orioles history (since 1954)...This year, Roberts has been elected to the Orioles Hall of Fame and will be honored at a luncheon on August 10, as well as during an on-field ceremony prior to the game on August 11 against the Red Sox.

**STREAKS SNAPPED:** Friday's 7-4 win over the Red Sox at Fenway Park snapped a 13-game road losing streak, which matched the longest in Orioles history (since 1954)...The O's also went winless for 13 consecutive road games from April 8-28, 1988, when the Orioles began the season a Major League-record 0-21...The win also snapped a seven-game losing streak against the Red Sox.

**YOU'RE LOOKING AT THE MAN-NY: SS Manny Machado** has hit safely in 35-of-44 games played this season...Machado currently ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories (see chart at right)...Additionally, his .423 on-base percentage ranks fourth in the AL and ranks eighth in the majors...His .671 slugging percentage ranks second in the AL and second in the majors...His 18 multi-hit games rank tied for third in the AL and are tied for fourth in the majors...His 114 total bases are rank second in the AL and rank second in the majors...His seven intentional walks lead the AL and rank second in the majors.

**MORE ABOUT MANNY: SS Manny Machado** went 2-for-4 with two home runs (one grand slam) and six RBI on May 11...It marked his first grand slam of the season and the eighth of his career...Machado's eight grand slams ties him with **Chris Davis** for most in the majors since his debut in 2012...On May 11, he hit the 149<sup>th</sup> and 150<sup>th</sup> home runs of his career, becoming the youngest Oriole to collect 150 career home runs (25 years, 309 days old)...Prior to Machado, **Eddie Murray** was the youngest Oriole to reach 150 home runs at 26 years, 165 days.

**THE COMPANY YOU KEEP: SS Manny Machado** hit two home runs on May 11 against the Rays for his fourth multi-home run game of the season and the 18<sup>th</sup> of his career...According to STATS, LLC., Machado ranks fourth all-time among American League hitters in multi home run games before turning 26 years old...He trails **Hal Trosky** (20), **Jimmie Foxx** (19), and **Alex Rodriguez** (19)...With his 18<sup>th</sup> career multi-home run game, Machado passed **Joe DiMaggio** (17).

**GRAND CENTRAL STATION: OF Adam Jones** hit his 254<sup>th</sup> career home run as a center fielder on Wednesday...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 254 homers hit while playing center field rank 13<sup>th</sup> all-time in Major League history...He also ranks fifth all-time among American League hitters...Among AL hitters, he trails **Mickey Mantle** (432), **Ken Griffey, Jr.** (382), **Fred Lynn** (266), and **Bernie Williams** (261)...**Willie Mays** is the all-time leader with 640 home runs as a center fielder.

**CATCH THIS:** On April 21, **C Chance Sisco** threw out three Cleveland baserunners attempting to steal...He caught **LF Michael Brantley** attempting to steal second base in the sixth inning, **SS Francisco Lindor** at second base in the seventh inning, and **PR Rajai Davis** at third in the ninth inning...It marked the first time an Orioles catcher had three catcher-caught-stealing in a game since **C Matt Wieters** caught three baserunners on August 25, 2012 vs. Toronto...Sisco has caught 9-of-18 would-be base stealers this season...Sisco enters tonight's game tied for first in the majors with **Jonathan Lucroy** with nine catcher caught stealing.

**TAKE A CHANCE:** In Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader, **C Chance Sisco** cut Baltimore's deficit to 3-2 with an RBI double in the second inning, then tied the game with his steal of home on a double steal with **3B Jace Peterson**, who stole second base...It marked Sisco's first career stolen base, and the first steal of home by an Orioles player since **Seth Smith** did so on May 4, 2017 at Boston...According to STATS, LLC., Sisco is the first Orioles catcher to steal home (since 1974, when such data is available)...He is the first catcher in the majors to steal home since Toronto's **Russell Martin** did so on June 2, 2015 at Washington...Sisco is the 39<sup>th</sup> catcher in the majors to steal home (since 1974)...Became the first Oriole to steal home for their first career stolen base since **Cal Ripken, Jr.** on May 31, 1982 vs. Texas.

**KEEPING UP WITH JONES:** On May 4, **OF Adam Jones** played in his 1,500<sup>th</sup> game with the Orioles and went 3-for-4 with a home run...He became the eighth player in Orioles history (since 1954) to reach the 1,500 games played mark...Jones joined **Cal Ripken, Jr.** (3,001 games), **Brooks Robinson** (2,896), **Mark Belanger** (1,962), **Eddie Murray** (1,884), **Boog Powell** (1,763), **Brady Anderson** (1,759), and **Paul Blair** (1,700) as players to appear in at least 1,500 games with the Orioles...According to STATS, LLC., Jones became the seventh active player to reach 1,500 games with his current team...Jones joined the O's in February 2008 when he was acquired from the Seattle Mariners along with **RHP Chris Tillman**, **LHP George Sherrill**, **RHP Kam Mickolio**, and **LHP Tony Butler** in exchange for **LHP Erik Bedard**.

**QUALITY OVER QUANTITY:** **RHP Alex Cobb** tossed the Orioles 19<sup>th</sup> Quality Start of the season on Friday...The Orioles 19 Quality Starts this season are tied for fifth in the American League...Bundy and **RHP Kevin Gausman** are tied for 16<sup>th</sup> in the American League with five Quality Starts each this season...Orioles starters have received just 101 runs of support this season, which is tied for fewest in the majors...Overall, Orioles pitchers have received 183 runs of support this season, with ranks fourth-fewest in the AL.

**VS. BOSTON:** The Orioles and Red Sox play the sixth game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The Red Sox lead the season series, 4-1...The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 10-9...Baltimore trails Boston in the all-time series, 490-567, with the Orioles trailing 249-280 at home and trailing 241-287 at Boston.

**BLAME IT ON THE RAIN:** The postponed game between the Orioles and Phillies on May 15, has been rescheduled for July 12, at 6:05 p.m. ET...Tickets and parking for the May 15 game will be automatically honored for the makeup game on July 12...Fans unable to attend the July 12 makeup game may exchange the value of their May 15 tickets and parking toward any remaining home game this season.

**FEEL THE DRAFT:** The Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft will be held from Monday, June 4 through Wednesday, June 6 at MLB Network's Studio 42 in Secaucus, NJ...Rounds one and two and both competitive balance rounds will take place on Monday, with rounds 3-10 on Tuesday, and rounds 11-40 on Wednesday...The draft will air on MLB Network and MLB.com...The Orioles own four picks in the top 115 of the 2018 Draft; the No. 11, 37, 87, and 115 overall selections.

**DISABLED LIST:** Seven Orioles are currently on the disabled list...**OF Colby Rasmus** (left hip flexor strain, since 4/7), **INF Luis Sardiñas** (lower back strain, retroactive to 4/29), **RHP Darren O'Day** (retroactive to 5/6, hyperextended right elbow), and **RHP Chris Tillman** (lower back strain, since 5/11) are on the 10-day disabled list...**LHP Zach Britton** (right Achilles surgery, since 2/15), **RHP Gabriel Ynoa** (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26), and **INF Tim Beckham** (left groin strain, retroactive to 4/24) are on the 60-day DL.

**COACHING STAFF:** The O's welcomed back each member of the coaching staff from 2017...2018 marks the second season for **Howie Clark** (assistant hitting), **Roger McDowell** (pitching), and **Alan Mills** (bullpen); the fourth for **Scott Coolbaugh** (hitting); and sixth season for **Bobby Dickerson** (third base) and **Einar Diaz** (coach); while **Wayne Kirby** (first base) and **John Russell** (bench) return for their eighth years on the staff.

**THE SKIPPER:** A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), **Buck Showalter** is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (636-599, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,518 career wins rank 23<sup>rd</sup> all-time and are third among active managers behind **Bruce Bochy** and **Mike Scioscia**...His 636 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

**QUICK HITS:** Will be making his 10<sup>th</sup> start of the 2018 season...Made a career-high 28 starts last season and won a career-high 13 games...The Orioles went 16-12, the only Orioles starter with a winning record in his starts (minimum two starts)...Threw 90-or-more pitches in 26 of his 28 starts (threw 89 and 76 in his last two starts respectively)...Made 19 Quality Starts last season, tied for the eighth-most in the AL and tied for 16<sup>th</sup>-most in MLB.

**LAST START:** Bundy made his ninth start of the season on May 13 vs. Tampa Bay and snapped a three-game losing streak...He tossed 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing two hits with four walks and seven strikeouts, while earning the win...The 17 runs of support were a career-high...Issued a career-high tying four walks, the eighth time doing so and first this season...The two hits were a season-low and fewest allowed since his one hit shutout on August 29, 2017 vs. Seattle...His fifth Quality Start of the season...Threw 100 pitches, 63 strikes.

**CAREER VS. BOSTON:** Bundy will be making his second start of the season against Boston, and his 10<sup>th</sup> career start (14<sup>th</sup> career appearance) against the Red Sox...He has gone 3-5 with a 4.66 ERA (29 ER/56.0 IP) in his 13 career appearances; his nine starts and 13 games are both the most against an opponent in his career...He faced the Red Sox on April 15 in Boston and was dealt the loss after tossing 5.2 innings, allowing three runs, one earned, on seven hits with two walks and six strikeouts; it was the coldest starting temperature for an Orioles game this season (34 degrees)...In his career at Fenway Park, he has gone 2-2 with a 3.18 ERA (10 ER/28.1 IP) in four career starts (seven appearances).

**VS. AL EAST:** This will be Bundy's fifth start against a divisional opponent this season... He snapped a three-game losing streak against the division with his win in his last outing against Tampa Bay, and is 1-3 with a 3.70 ERA (10 ER/24.1 IP) on the year against the AL East...It will mark his 26<sup>th</sup> career start (37<sup>th</sup> appearance) against an AL East opponent; he owns a career record of 10-12 with a 4.44 ERA (77 ER/156.0 IP) against the division, including 9-12 and a 4.67 ERA (72 ER/138.2 IP) in his 25 starts...Last season, Bundy went 6-5 and posted a 3.80 ERA (35 ER/83.0 IP) with 10 Quality Starts in 14 games against the division; the Orioles went 7-7 in those games.

**STOPPING THE SKID:** Bundy tossed his second scoreless start of the season his last time out on 5/13 vs. Tampa Bay...In his previous three starts, Bundy had allowed 22 runs (19 earned) on 23 hits with four walks, eight strikeouts, and nine home runs in 9.0 total innings...Opponents batted .460 (23-for-50) with 13 extra-base hits (four doubles; nine home runs) over these three outings, including a .529 average against by left-handers (9-for-17)... Prior to that three-game stretch, Bundy had posted a 1.42 ERA (5 ER/31.2 IP) and limited opponents to a .220 average (26-for-118) in his first five starts of the year.

**DAY MAN:** Bundy has made four day starts on the season...He has gone 1-1 with a 0.70 ERA (2 ER/25.2 IP) in four day games as opposed to being 1-4 with a 9.00 ERA (22 ER/22.0 IP) in five night games this season...His daytime ERA leads the American League and is seventh-best in the majors and his nighttime ERA is the second highest in the majors and the American League...For his career, Bundy has gone 6-6 with a 4.75 ERA (57 ER/108.0 IP) in 25 career day time games (17 starts).

**FIRST INNING TROUBLES:** Bundy has allowed an inning-high 12 runs in the first inning, pitching to a 13.50 ERA (12 ER/8.0 IP)...He has allowed 12 earned runs in all his other innings combined...He has surrendered seven first inning home runs...Entering the season he had allowed only 13 first inning runs in 42.0 innings (42 games).

**AT ORIOLE PARK:** Bundy has made six home starts this season, going 2-3 with a 4.83 ERA (17 ER/31.2 IP) with 12 walks against 37 strikeouts...He made 16 starts at home during the 2017 season, posting a record of 7-5 with a 4.20 ERA (45 ER/96.1 IP), 24 walks, and 80 strikeouts...In his career, he owns a 14-11 record with a 3.94 ERA (84 ER/192.0 IP) in 42 appearances at Oriole Park...In 30 career starts at home, he has gone 14-11 with a 4.09 ERA (78 ER/171.2 IP).

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Over his first nine starts of the season, Bundy has limited right-handed hitters to a .212 average (21-for-99) with seven walks against 34 strikeouts as opposed to allowing a .330 average by left-handers (30-for-91)...However, eight of the 10 home runs Bundy has allowed this season have been to righties.

**MOWING THEM DOWN:** Bundy has struck out eight-or-more batters in three starts this year and 13 times overall in his career...Eight of those games came in 2017; he went an undefeated 5-0 with a 2.50 ERA (15 ER/54.0 IP) and the Orioles went 6-2 in those eight starts...For his career, he's posted a record of 7-2 with a 2.52 ERA (24 ER/85.2 IP) when striking out eight-or-more batters.
