At Fenway

The Braves are one of two N.L. teams to compile a winning record at Fenway Park since interleague play began in 1997, going 18-15 (.545) here...Chicago is 5-4 (.556).

The Braves have hit .283 (337-for-1190) here, and have averaged 4.8 runs per game (158 total) in their 33 games...They own a 3.85 team ERA (122 ER/285.0 IP) in Boston.

Despite the overall success, the Braves have lost eight of their last 11 games here, while committing 10 errors and getting outscored 58-37.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Red Sox begin a three-game series with the fourth game of the Braves' fourth road trip of the year...This Braves' first trip to Boston since 2016, when they split a two-game set here...Atlanta is one of two N.L. teams to compile a winning record at Fenway Park since interleague play began in 1997...The Braves are 18-15 (.545) and the Cubs are 5-4 (.556).

A This series marks the Braves' second interleague series of the season...They swept a two-game set in Tampa Bay, May 8-May 9.

A RHP Julio Teheran has lost both his starts against Boston...He allowed six runs, earned, over 6.1 innings in his only start here in Boston.

A LHP Eduardo Rodríguez is facing the Braves for the first time in his career...He has gone 3-2 with a 3.93 ERA (23 ER/52.2 IP) in nine career starts against the National League.

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves today placed LHP Luiz Gohara on the Bereavement/Family Medical Emergency List and recalled RHP Matt Wisler from Triple-A Gwinnett.

A Gohara is 0-1 with a 2.45 ERA (3 ER/11.0 IP) in four games, one start, this season...He made his lone start on Wednesday in Philadelphia, going 4.0 innings and allowing two runs, earned, to take a 4-0 loss.

A Wisler returns to the Braves for the third time this season...He was up from April 19-April 27 and then again on May 18...He is 1-1 with a 3.63 ERA (7 ER/17.1 IP) in three games, all starts, with the Braves this season.

A Wisler went 1-2 with a 3.90 ERA (13 ER/30.0 IP) in five games, five starts, at the Triple-A level this season.

INTERLEAGUE: The Braves are set for their second interleague series of the season after sweeping a two-game set from Tampa Bay, May 8-May 9...Atlanta will also travel to Toronto, June 19-20, before welcoming the first American League team to SunTrust Park, June 22-24, when they play host to Baltimore.

A They went 9-11 against the American League last season and have not finished with a winning record in interleague play since 2013, when they went 11-9...Atlanta's .375 (30-50) interleague winning percentage over the previous four seasons was the third worst in baseball.

A Braves designated hitters have hit 16 home runs in interleague play, tied for the second fewest among N.L. teams...They hit none last season.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY! Braves Executive Vice President and General Manager Alex Anthopoulos turns 41 today.

VS. LEFTIES: The Braves are scheduled to face three left-handed starters in this series, and are 9-3 in games started by a lefty opponent this season.

A They are hitting .288 (126-for-438) against lefty starters, the best mark in the N.L., while their .361 on-base percentage is the best in baseball.

A 2B Ozzie Albies is hitting .407 (22-for-54) this season against all left-handers, the sixth-best mark in baseball and the third highest in the N.L.

A 1B Freddie Freeman is hitting .368 (21-for-57) against lefties, the highest average in baseball by a left-handed hitter...OF Nick Markakis is third with a .354 (23-for-65) mark.

A Freeman's five home runs against lefties are also the most in the majors by a left-handed batter, and since 2016, his 20 such home runs are tied for the second most in the baseball and one off the lead...Only Seattle's Kyle Seager has more.

ON THE ROAD: The Braves enter tonight's game 18-10 (.643) away from SunTrust Park this season, tied for the best road record in the N.L. ...Milwaukee is also 18-10...Atlanta's 28 road games are tied with Milwaukee and Boston for the second most in baseball; only Colorado has played more (32).

A The Braves have won 12 of their last 15 road games, outscoring the opposition 76-35 over this stretch, which dates to April 28 at Philadelphia.

A The Braves have not finished with a winning record on the road since 2012, when they went 46-35... From 2013 through last season, the Braves compiled the seventh-worst road record in the majors at 174-230 (.431).

A The club has hit 40 of their 57 home runs this season away from SunTrust Park,

TOP OF THE LINEUP: Since moving 2B Ozzie Albies to the leadoff spot and OF Ronald Acuña Jr. to the two hole, the Braves are 14-8...When Acuña Jr. gets at least one hit, the team is 12-3.

IN THE FIRST: The Braves have scored 40 first-inning runs this season, tied for the most in baseball... They are hitting .332 and slugging .610 in the opening inning this season, the highest marks in baseball

A 1B Freddie Freeman (.410) and 2B Ozzie Albies (.404) are second and third in the N.L. in first-inning batting average, while Albies leads the N.L. with six home runs, 14 runs scored and 11 extra-base hits in the opening inning.

A The Braves are 13-5 this season when taking a lead to the second inning.

TWO OUT RUNS: The Braves lead the majors with 119 two-out runs, and only two other teams, including Boston (100), are in triple digits...Oakland is second with 105 two-out runs.

Tonight's Game

- A* Set to make his 11th start of the season and the 173rd (176th appearance) of his career.
- A* Is 0-2 in two career starts versus Boston, pitching to a 4.73 ERA (7 ER/13.1 IP) with 11 strikeouts...Red Sox batters have hit .345 (19-for-55).
- A* Made one career start at Fenway Park, 6/16/15...Allowed 13 hits and six runs over 6.1 innings to take the loss...Held the Red Sox to two runs over his first five innings before allowing four runs in his last 1.1 frames.
- A* Tonight's start will be his 20th in Interleague Play...Is 6-9 with a 5.08 ERA (63 ER/111.2 IP) against the American League...Has won three straight Interleague decisions spanning four starts dating to 5/29/17, and Atlanta is 4-0 in that stretch.
- A* Makes his sixth start of the season on the road, and is 3-1 with a 2.89 ERA (9 ER/28.0 IP) in five starts away from home...Has a 5.54 ERA (16 ER/26.0 IP) in five starts at SunTrust Park.
- A* Is tied for sixth in the majors with 11 wins on the road since the start of 2017... His 3.08 ERA on the road in that span is 10th best in the National League.
- A* Opponents are hitting just .177/.278/.405 with 14 hits in 79 at-bats against him on his first time through the lineup...On his second time through, opponents are batting .268 (19-for-71) with a .366 on-base percentage.

2018 Recap

- A* Allowed a season-high six runs over 5.0 innings in his last start, 5/20 vs. MIA... Left the game trailing 6-0 before Atlanta rallied for a 10-9 win...The Braves are 8-2 in his 10 starts this season.
- A* All six runs scored in the fourth inning, the third time in his career he's allowed six or more runs in one inning...Also did so on 7/28/17 at PHI (5th) and 5/26/15 at LAD (4th).
- A* Won his third consecutive start, 5/14 at CHI, after holding the Cubs to four hits and four runs over 6.0 innings...All four runs scored on a pair of two-run homers.
- A* Allowed two runs in the bottom of the second to snap a 16.0-inning scoreless streak, the second-longest such stretch of his career...Tossed a career-most 23.0 consecutive scoreless innings in 2016.
- A* Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, 5/9 at TB...Allowed four hits and fanned seven... Logged consecutive scoreless starts for the fifth time in his career and the first since his final start of 2016 (10/2 vs. DET) and his first turn in 2017 (4/3 at NYM).
- A* The outing vs. TB snapped a streak of 11 consecutive starts within the N.L. East, dating to 9/6/17...According to STATS, LLC, Teheran was the first Braves pitcher to make 11 consecutive starts against his own division since RH Phil Niekro also made 11 straight in 1979-80.
- A* Held the Mets to two hits and two walks over 7.0 scoreless innings, 5/3 at Citi Field...Fanned six.
- A* Took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before Asdrúbal Cabrera doubled with two outs...Was his longest no-hit bid since holding Pittsburgh without a hit for 7.2 innings on 6/5/13.
- A* Allowed two hits and three runs over 3.0 innings, 4/27 at PHI...Left the game after 3.0 innings with right upper trap tightness.
- A* Threw just 43 pitches, the fewest he has thrown in a start in his career.
- A* Earned his first win of the season, 4/16 vs. PHI...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed just five hits and one run, striking out a season-best nine.
- A* Snapped a six-start winless stretch with the victory, which dated to 9/17/17... Went 0-3 with a 5.18 ERA (19 ER/33.0 IP) during his winless spell.
- A* Made his second consecutive start against Washington, 4/9...Took the loss despite holding the Nationals to five hits and two runs in 6.0 innings of work...Struck out seven.
- A* In eight career instances in which he has faced the same opponent in back-to-back starts, is 5-0 with a 2.52 ERA (14 ER/50.0 IP) and 31 hits allowed in the first meeting and 2-3 with a 3.61 ERA (19 ER/47.1 IP) and 52 hits allowed in the second.
- A* Went 2.1 innings and allowed six hits and five runs, 4/3 vs. WSH....Surrendered three home runs, which accounted for four of the five runs he allowed.
- A* Entered the game with a 19.0-inning scoreless streak against the Nationals before allowing three runs in the first...The 19.0-inning stretch was tied for the longest active scoreless streak by a starter against any one opponent in the majors...Research courtesy of STATS, INC.
- A* Made his fifth consecutive Opening Day start, which set the Atlanta era (since 1966) record for a pitcher...Only two other Atlanta pitchers (Greg Maddux from 1993-96 and Rick Mahler 1985-88) went four straight...Only Phil Niekro (8), Maddux (7) and Mahler (5) made at least five Opening Day starts in total for Atlanta.
- A* The last Braves pitcher to make more than four consecutive Opening Day starts was Hall-of-Famer Warren Spahn, who started six straight Milwaukee openers from 1957-1962.

Career Recap

- A* Signed a six-year contract through 2019, with an option for 2020, on February 14, 2014.... Is a two-time National League All-Star (2014, '16).

Jesse Biddle • LHP • 6-5 • 220 • 26 yrs • #63

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 12/9 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/3

- Right-handed batters have just four hits in 34 at-bats (.118) against him...Lefties are hitting .500/.556/.813 with eight hits, two walks, two doubles, a home run and five RBI.
- Allowed the first two runs of his major league career, 5/4 vs. SF...Surrendered a two-run home run to Brandon Crawford in the top of the seventh.
- Went 2.0 innings and fanned a career-most five batters, 4/29 at PHI...Became the first Atlanta reliever to strike out at least five batters in 2.0 or fewer innings since Dario Álvarez did so on 6/15/16...Just four Atlanta relievers have had an outing of five strikeouts in 2.0 or fewer innings since 2000.
- Made his major league debut, 4/21 vs. NYM, and tossed 1.0 scoreless inning...Earned the win when Atlanta walked off in the bottom of the ninth...Became the first Atlanta reliever to earn the win in his debut since Jed Bradley on 9/3/16 at PHI.

Shane Carle • RHP • 6-4 • 210 • 26 yrs • #51

Saves/Opp: 0/1 **Holds:** 8 **1st Batter/Retired:** 22/14 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 12/3

- Has allowed runs in consecutive outings, 5/21 and 5/23 at PHI...Prior to these two games, went 14 consecutive outings without allowing an earned run (15.1 innings).
- Holding batters to a .163 (8-for-49) average with men on base and has allowed just three hits (3-for-30, .100) with runners in scoring position...Batters are hitting .263 (15-for-57) with no one on base.
- Converted his eighth hold of the season, 5/19 vs. MIA...Eight holds are tied for the club lead (D.Winkler) and are second most in the majors among rookie pitchers...No rookie has led the Atlanta staff in holds since Jonny Venters in 2010 (24).
- Holding right-handed batters to a .213 (13-for-61) average...Lefties are hitting .222 (10-for-45).
- Tallied his first career win, 4/3 vs. WSH.

Sam Freeman • LHP • 5-11 • 180 • 30 yrs • #39

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 5 **1st Batter/Retired:** 25/19 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 19/3

- Left-handed batters are hitting just 1-for-26 (.038) against him this season.
- Snapped a 10-game scoreless streak in his last appearance, allowing a run in 1.0 inning, 5/23 at PHI...His scoreless streak stretched to 4/26 and totaled 9.1 innings.
- Ranks tied for eighth in the majors with 25 appearances this season...Made a career-most 58 appearances last year.
- Tossed 1.1 scoreless innings to earn his first win of the season, 4/26 at CIN.
- Inherited the bases loaded, 4/19 vs. NYM, and allowed a sacrifice fly before stranding the remaining two runners...Has inherited 19 runners on the season, and has stranded 16 (84%)...Inherited just 19 runners last season.
- Took the loss, 4/23 at CIN...The loss snapped a streak of 190 consecutive games without a loss, the longest such active streak in the majors at the time...Freeman's run, which was the second-longest in MLB history, dated to 10/3/12...Only Trevor Miller (240 games, 2006-09) had a longer streak in MLB history.

A.J. Minter • LHP • 6-0 • 215 • 24 yrs • #33

Saves/Opp: 2/2 **Holds:** 7 **1st Batter/Retired:** 22/15 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 7/2

- Logged his second save of the season, 5/14 at CHI...Two saves lead all rookie relievers in the majors...Is a perfect 7-for-7 in hold chances and has converted his only two save opportunities.
- Has earned the win in three of his last five appearances after picking up a victory, 5/20 vs. MIA...Three wins are tied for third in the majors among relievers.
- Inherited the bases loaded, 5/9 at TB, and allowed two runs to score...The runs were the first inherited runners he has allowed to score in his career...Has stranded five of seven runners this season and nine of 11 in his career.
- Earned the first save of his major league career with a scoreless ninth inning, 4/25 at CIN...Became the first left-handed pitcher to record a save for Atlanta since Jonny Venters logged five in 2011.
- Allowed a career high-tying three hits and two runs, 4/24 at CIN...Had surrendered just four hits total entering play...Had not allowed three hits or two runs since 8/27/17 vs. COL, his second career appearance.
- Appeared on consecutive dates times this season...His back-to-back outings on 4/3 and 4/4 vs. WSH marked the first time doing so in his career...Did so just once in the minors (7/23 and 7/24/17 with GWN)...Underwent "Tommy John" surgery in 2015.

Peter Moylan • RHP • 6-3 • 220 • 39 yrs • #30

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 22/12 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 11/5

- Tossed his fourth consecutive hitless outing in his last game, 5/23 at PHI, retiring all three batters he faced...Marked his first clean appearance of at least 1.0 inning this season...Allowed at least one baserunner in 18 of his 22 outings this season.
- Overall, opponents have 20 hits and 13 walks over 16.1 innings of work (2.02 WHIP).
- Worked a season-most 1.1 inning, 4/29 at CIN, and has 10 outings of at least 1.0 full inning this season...Made 79 appearances with Kansas City last season, but just 34 of those games went 1.0 full frame...His 79 total appearances led the majors, but his 34 relief outings of at least 1.0 inning ranked tied for 142nd.
- Has appeared in 199 games without a loss, the longest such active streak in the majors...Moylan's run, which is the second longest in MLB history, dates to 9/9/11...Only Trevor Miller (240 games, 2006-09) has had a longer streak.

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 3/0 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 1/1

- Recalled to Atlanta from Triple-A Gwinnett, 5/20, for his third stint on the roster...Also up from 4/15-4/19 and on 5/5 (recalled pregame, optioned postgame).
- Allowed three hits and two runs over 2.0 innings of relief, 5/20 vs. MIA...In three appearances with the Braves this season, has a 10.50 ERA (7 ER/6.0 IP) with two home runs...All three first batters he has faced have reached.
