RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers split a doubleheader against the Yankees yesterday, losing the first game, 7-4, and winning the second game, 4-2. In the nightcap, Victor Martinez had a pair of hits, including a double, and drove in a run, while Leonys Martin also added two hits and scored two runs. Mike Fiers started the game and earned his fifth win of the season, allowing two runs on six hits with two walks and six strikeouts in 5.2 innings. Shane Greene pitched a scoreless ninth inning for his 15th save of the season. In the first game, Nicholas Castellanos had two hits and drove in a run. Drew VerHagen started and took the loss, giving up seven runs on seven hits with two walks and two strikeouts in 3.2 innings. The Tigers begin a three-game series against the Boston Red Sox tonight. Following the three games in Boston, Detroit returns home for a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (June 8-10) and three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14).

ROSTER MOVE: Following last night's game, the Tigers returned RHP Sandy Baez to Double A Erie after he served as the 26th man for both games of yesterday's doubleheader.

WILSON SCHEDULED TO BEGIN INJURY REHAB ASSIGNMENT TONIGHT: RHP Alex Wilson is scheduled to begin an injury rehabilitation assignment with Triple A Toledo tonight. Wilson has been sidelined since May 8 with a left plantar fascia strain.

TIGERS SELECT MIZE, MEADOWS ON NIGHT ONE OF 2018 MLB DRAFT: The Tigers selected RHP Casey Mize from Auburn University with the first overall pick in the 2018 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Additionally, with the 44th overall pick, the Tigers selected OF Parker Meadows from Grayson High School (GA). Mize, who was named a first-team All-American by *Baseball America*, has started 16 games for Auburn this season, compiling a 10-5 record with a 2.95 ERA (109.2IP/36ER) and 151 strikeouts. He leads the SEC in strikeouts, strikeouts per nine innings (12.45) and walks allowed per nine innings (0.99). Meadows was named a 2018 Rawlings-Perfect Game first-team All-American and has played 92 games in his high school career, posting a .370 (95x257) batting average with 87 runs scored, 18 doubles, eight triples, 10 home runs and 64 RBI.

SAINT NICK: Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits in the first game of yesterday's doubleheader to record his 25th multi-hit game of the season, which is tied with Atlanta's Nick Markakis and Seattle's Jean Segura for the Major League lead. Castellanos has hit safely in 20 of his last 26 games with at least one at-bat, hitting .370 (40x108) with 15 runs scored, 12 doubles, one triple, three home runs and 13 RBI during the stretch.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Tigers doubled in each game of yesterday's doubleheader vs. the Yankees, extending their streak of games with at least one double to 52. The streak is the longest by a Tigers team, and is the third-longest streak among all MLB teams since at least 1908. The 1996 Cleveland Indians have the longest streak in the last 110 years, recording a double in 75 straight games from May 30-August 19, 1996.

BAEZ MAKES MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Sandy Baez made his Major League debut in the first game of yesterday's doubleheader vs. New York (AL), throwing 4.1 no-hit innings with three walks and four strikeouts. With his outing, Baez became the first Tigers pitcher and the sixth Major League pitcher since at least 1908 to throw 4.1-or-more no-hit innings in his Major League debut. Baez is ranked as the 19th-best prospect in the Tigers organization by MLB Pipeline.

RECAPPING THE HOMESTAND: The Tigers went 8-4 on their recently completed 12-game, 11-day homestand, going 2-1 vs. Chicago (AL), 3-1 vs. Los Angeles (AL), 2-1

vs. Toronto and 1-1 vs. New York (AL). The Tigers hit .271 (108x399) over the 12 games, while the pitching staff had a 4.25 ERA (108.0IP/51ER). Individually, Nicholas Castellanos hit .365 (19x52) with seven runs scored, seven doubles, one home run and seven RBI during the homestand, while José Iglesias batted .364 (12x33) with five runs scored, five doubles and four RBI. Victor Martinez finished the homestand hitting .323 (10x31) with two doubles and two RBI.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers begin a brief three-game road trip to Boston tonight. Detroit is 9-18 away from Comerica Park this season, and has lost 11 of their last 15 road games. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .243 (230x948) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.51 ERA (229.1IP/115ER).

TIGERS AND RED SOX: The Tigers begin a three-game series at Boston tonight. Detroit went 4-3 against the Red Sox last season, but dropped two-of-three games at Fenway Park. The Tigers have won the season series over the Red Sox in four of the last five seasons.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 29-32 (.475) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,097-1,071 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT ARTIE: Lewicki will make his seventh appearance and first start of the season tonight in the series opener at Boston.

LAST TIME OUT: Lewicki's last appearance came on Friday vs. Toronto, when he earned his first Major League hold by retiring the only batter he faced and stranding the bases loaded in the eighth inning.

VS. BOSTON: Lewicki will be making his first career appearance against the Red Sox tonight.

ON THE ROAD: Lewicki has made three relief appearances on the road in his career, compiling a 0-0 record with a 7.50 ERA (6.0IP/5ER) and six strikeouts. In two road outings this season, Lewicki is 0-0 with an 11.25 ERA (4.0IP/5ER) and three strikeouts.

AT TOLEDO: Lewicki has made six starts at Toledo this season, compiling a 3-3 record with a 5.06 ERA (32.0IP/18ER) and 29 strikeouts.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Lewicki made his Major League debut on September 4, 2017 vs. Kansas City, throwing 5.0 innings and allowing five runs on 11 hits with one walk and one strikeout. Lewicki struck out Alex Gordon in the second inning for his first Major League strikeout.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Lefthanded hitters have posted a .326 (15x46) batting average against Lewicki in his career, while righties have hit .355 (22x62). In 12 appearances, including six starts, between Detroit and Triple A Toledo this season, righthanded hitters are batting .297 (38x128) and lefties are hitting .323 (20x62).

PILING UP THE WINS IN 2017: Lewicki earned 14 wins last season between Double A Erie and Triple A Toledo, ranking tied for sixth among all Minor League pitchers. Lewicki won 10 of his final 11 decisions in the minors in 2017. During the 12-start stretch, Lewicki had a 10-1 record with a 2.55 ERA (74.0IP/21ER) and 68 strikeouts.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Lewicki was selected by the Tigers in the eighth round of the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia. As a senior at Virginia, Lewicki helped the Cavaliers to the College World Series, compiling an 8-1 record with one save and a 1.31 ERA (68.2IP/10ER). Lewicki threw 23.1 innings without allowing an earned run in the NCAA Tournament.

ABOUT BLAINE: Hardy will make his ninth appearance and fifth start of the season tomorrow night at Boston.

LAST TIME OUT: Hardy won his second consecutive start on Friday vs. Toronto, allowing two runs on three hits with four walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. BOSTON/AT FENWAY PARK: Hardy has made two career relief appearances against the Red Sox, posting a 1-1 record with a 5.40 ERA (1.2IP/1ER) and two strikeouts. He has not faced the Red Sox since August 8, 2015, when he threw 1.1 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and two strikeouts. Hardy's only career appearance at Fenway Park was on July 24, 2015, when he took the loss after giving up a run on one hit with one walk in a third of an inning.

FOR STARTERS: Hardy has allowed two runs-or-less in each of his four starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 2-0 record with a 2.82 ERA (22.1IP/7ER) and 16 strikeouts.

AT TOLEDO: Hardy has appeared in seven games, including four starts, with the Mud Hens this season and has a 3-0 record with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP/2ER) and 30 strikeouts. At the time of his promotion, he led the International League with a 0.74 ERA, 0.62 WHIP, and .136 opponents batting average, while he was tied for the league lead with three wins.
