**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers were shut out by the Red Sox, 6-0, in the series opener on Tuesday night at Fenway Park. Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits, including a double, while Dixon Machado was 1x3. Artie Lewicki started for Detroit and suffered the loss, allowing four runs, two earned, on five hits with three walks and two strikeouts in 3.2 innings. The Tigers and Red Sox play the second game of their three-game series tonight. Following the series in Boston, Detroit returns home for a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (June 8-10) and three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14).

### TIGERS SELECT EIGHT PLAYERS ON DAY TWO OF 2018

**MLB DRAFT:** The Tigers selected eight players on the second day of the 2018 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. The list of selected players includes 2B Kody Clemens from the University of Texas (son of Roger Clemens), CF Kingston Liniak from Mission Hills HS (CA), LHP Adam Wolf from the University of Louisville, RHP Hugh Smith from Whitworth College (WA), CF Eric De La Rosa from Grossmont College (CA), 2B Jeremiah Burks from Fresno State University, LHP Tarik Skubal from Seattle University and CF Brock Deatherage from North Carolina State University.

**IN THE NICK OF TIME:** Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits in last night's game to record his 26th multi-hit game of the season, which is tied with Atlanta's Nick Markakis and Seattle's Jean Segura for the Major League lead. Castellanos has hit safely in 21 of his last 27 games with at least one at-bat, hitting .375 (42x112) with 15 runs scored, 13 doubles, one triple, three home runs and 13 RBI during the stretch.

**DOUBLE TROUBLE:** Nicholas Castellanos doubled in the first inning of last night's game, extending the Tigers streak of games with at least one double to 53. The streak is the longest by a Tigers team, and is the third-longest streak among all MLB teams since at least 1908. The 1996 Cleveland Indians have the longest streak in the last 110 years, recording a double in 75 straight games from May 30-August 19, 1996.

**ZIP, ZERO, ZILCH, NADA:** The Tigers suffered their eighth shutout of the season last night at Boston. Detroit's eight shutouts are the second most in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee, which has been blanked nine times. Last season, the Tigers were shut out 12 times.

**LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY:** Tonight's game marks the 18th time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 10-7 against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .280 (147x525) as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers lead the Majors with a .280 batting average vs. lefties, while they led the American League with a .341 on-base percentage and rank second with a .453 slugging percentage. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos leads the Majors with a .458 (27x59) batting average vs. lefties.

**TIGERS AND RED SOX:** The Tigers are 0-1 against the Red Sox this season after losing the series opener last night. Detroit went 4-3 against the Red Sox last season, but dropped two-of-three games at Fenway Park. The Tigers have won the season series over the Red Sox in four of the last five seasons.

**ON THE ROAD:** The Tigers are 0-1 on their current three-game road trip. Detroit is 9-19 away from Comerica Park this season, and has lost 12 of their last 16 road games. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .239 (233x976) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.51 ERA (237.1IP/119ER).

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters tonight's game with a 29-33 (.468) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,097-1,072 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**INJURY REHAB UPDATES:** RHP Alex Wilson made an injury rehabilitation start with Triple A Toledo last night, throwing 1.1 hitless innings with one walk and two strikeouts. Wilson has been sidelined since May 8 with a left plantar fascia strain. RHP Jordan Zimmermann is scheduled to make an injury rehab start with Triple A Toledo tonight. Zimmermann has been on the disabled list since May 8 (retroactive to May 6) with a right shoulder impingement.

**TIGERS ON THE DL:** LHP Ryan Carpenter (right oblique strain, 10-day DL on June 1); LHP Francisco Liriano (right hamstring strain, 10-day DL on May 30, retroactive to May 27); LHP Daniel Norris (left groin strain, 60-day DL on April 30); LHP Daniel Stumpf (ulnar nerve irritation, 10-day DL on May 30, retroactive to May 29); RHP Alex Wilson (left plantar fascia strain, 10-day DL on May 8); RHP Jordan Zimmermann (right shoulder impingement, 10-day DL on May 8, retroactive to May 6).

**ABOUT BLAINE:** Hardy will make his ninth appearance and fifth start of the season tonight at Boston.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Hardy won his second consecutive start on Friday vs. Toronto, allowing two runs on three hits with four walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

**VS. BOSTON:** Hardy has made two career relief appearances against the Red Sox, posting a 1-1 record with a 5.40 ERA (1.2IP/1ER) and two strikeouts. He has not faced the Red Sox since August 8, 2015, when he threw 1.1 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and two strikeouts.

**ON THE ROAD:** Hardy has pitched in 82 games, including one as a starter, in his career on the road and has a 3-3 record with a 4.02 ERA (80.2IP/36ER) and 77 strikeouts. In five road outings, including one start, this season, Hardy has a 0-0 record with a 3.12 ERA (8.2IP/3ER) and eight strikeouts.

**AT FENWAY PARK:** Hardy's only career appearance at Fenway Park was on July 24, 2015, when he took the loss after giving up a run on one hit with one walk in a third of an inning.

**RECORD IN JUNE:** Hardy has appeared in 29 games, including one start, during the month of June in his career, posting a 3-2 record with a 4.01 ERA (33.2IP/15ER) and 23 strikeouts. He made just two relief outings in June last season and had a 0-0 record with a 5.40 ERA (1.2IP/1ER) and no strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE AL EAST:** Hardy has pitched in 30 games, including one start, in his career against American League East opponents, compiling a 2-1 record with a 3.27 ERA (33.0IP/12ER) and 27 strikeouts. In four relief outings vs. AL East teams last season, Hardy had a 0-0 record with a 18.00 ERA (3.0IP/6ER) and three strikeouts.

**FOR STARTERS:** Hardy has allowed two runs-or-less in each of his four starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 2-0 record with a 2.82 ERA (22.1IP/7ER) and 16 strikeouts.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Hardy has held lefthanded batters to a .230 (66x287) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .288 (122x424) against him. In eight appearances, including four starts this season, lefties are hitting .208 (5x24) vs. Hardy, while righthanded hitters are batting .239 (17x71).

**AT TOLEDO:** Hardy has appeared in seven games, including four starts, with the Mud Hens this season and has a 3-0 record with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP/2ER) and 30 strikeouts. At the time of his promotion, he led the International League with a 0.74 ERA, 0.62 WHIP, and .136 opponents batting average, while he was tied for the league lead with three wins.

**FIRST WIN AS A STARTER:** Hardy earned his first win as a starter on May 27 vs. Chicago (AL), throwing a career-high 7.0 innings and allowing one run on three hits with one walk and a career-best six strikeouts. Hardy finished the outing by retiring the final 14 White Sox batters he faced.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Hardy was originally selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 22nd round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was signed by the Tigers as a Minor League free agent on April 2, 2013.

**ABOUT MATTHEW:** Boyd will make his 12th start of the season tomorrow night in the series finale at Boston.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Boyd did not factor into the decision on Saturday vs. Toronto, allowing four runs on six hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 7.0 innings.

**VS. BOSTON/AT FENWAY PARK:** Boyd has made two career starts against the Red Sox, compiling a 0-1 record with a 12.00 ERA (6.0IP/8ER) and four strikeouts. His last start against Boston came on August 18, 2016, when he threw 6.0 innings and allowed one run on five hits with two walks and four strikeouts. Tomorrow night will mark Boyd's first career appearance at Fenway Park.

**AMONG THE AL LEADERS:** Boyd currently ranks ninth in the American League with a .207 (47x227) opponents batting average.

**PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF:** After finishing the 2017 season on a strong note, Boyd has allowed three runs-or-less in eight of his first 11 starts this season. Over his last 15 starts dating back to September 12, 2017, Boyd has posted a 3.01 ERA (89.2IP/30ER) and 69 strikeouts. Among American League pitchers with at least 80.0 innings pitched during that time span, Boyd ranks seventh with a .202 (65x322) opponents batting average and ninth with a 3.01 ERA.

- Posted his 46th career four-hit game in the first game of the doubleheader on April 25 vs. Pittsburgh...is tied with Willie Mays for the 23rd-most four-hit games in MLB history.
- Named the AL Most Valuable Player in 2012 and 2013, joining Hal Newhouser as the only two players in franchise history to win the award in back-to-back seasons...one of only eight Tigers to capture the MVP award.
- Is the all-time leader among Venezuelan-born players in home runs (465), RBI (1,635), slugging percentage (.552), extra-base hits (1,038) and total bases (4,656).
