RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered a 7-1 loss to the Red Sox on Wednesday night at Fenway Park. JaCoby Jones had a pair of hits, including a triple, while Miguel Cabrera also added two hits. José Iglesias drove in Detroit's only run of the game with a second inning single. Blaine Hardy started for the Tigers and took the loss, allowing five runs on eight hits with two strikeouts in 6.0 innings. The Tigers and Red Sox conclude their three-game series tonight. Following tonight's game, Detroit returns home for a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (June 8-10) and three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14).

ROSTER MOVES: Following last night's game, the Tigers optioned INF Ronny Rodriguez to Triple A Toledo. The Tigers today have activated RHP Alex Wilson from the 10-day disabled list. Wilson had been sidelined since May 8 with a left plantar fascia strain.

MULTI-HIT MIGGY: Miguel Cabrera had a pair of hits in last night's game to record his 520th multi-hit game in a Tigers uniform. With his performance last night, Cabrera broke a tie with Bobby Veach for the seventh-most multi-hit games in franchise history. Cabrera is 111 multi-hit games away from tying Lou Whitaker for sixth place in Tigers history.

DOUBLES STREAK SNAPPED: The Tigers did not record a double in last night's game, snapping their streak of games with at least one double at 53. The streak was the longest by a Tigers team, and the third-longest streak among all MLB teams since at least 1908.

MLB DRAFT RECAP: The Tigers selected 40 players over the three days of the 2018 Major League Baseball Player Draft. Detroit selected 17 pitchers and 23 position players during the draft. The Tigers selected 35 players out of the college ranks, while five of the players drafted were out of high school.

TIGERS TIDBITS: JaCoby Jones snapped an 0x15 skid with a triple in the second inning of last night's game. Jones ranks tied for third in the American League with three triples...José Iglesias has hit safely in seven of his last eight games at Fenway Park, batting .387 (12x31) during that stretch.

LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY: Tonight's game marks the 19th time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 10-8 against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .276 (152x551) as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers rank second in the Majors with a .276 batting average vs. lefties, while they are fourth in the American League with a .336 on-base percentage and a .445 slugging percentage. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos leads the American League with a .429 (27x63) batting average vs. lefties.

TIGERS AND RED SOX: The Tigers are 0-2 against the Red Sox this season after losing the first two games of this week's series. Detroit went 4-3 against the Red Sox last season, but dropped two-of-three games at Fenway Park. The Tigers have won the season series over the Red Sox in four of the last five seasons.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers are 0-2 on their current three-game road trip. Detroit is 9-20 away from Comerica Park this season, and has lost 13 of their last 17 road games. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .237 (240x1011) on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.59 ERA (245.1IP/125ER).

ON DECK: The Tigers begin a six-game homestand tomorrow as they open a three-game series against the Cleveland Indians. Detroit is 2-5 vs. Cleveland this season, but took two-of-three games in the first series this season at Comerica Park, which was Detroit's first series win over Cleveland since May 1-3, 2017. The Indians have won the season series over the Tigers in each of the last two seasons.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 29-34 (.460) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,097-1,073 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

MIDWEST LEAGUE ALL-STAR TEAM ANNOUNCED:

INF Cole Peterson and RHP Brandyn Sittinger have been named to the Midwest League All-Star Team. In 55 games with Single A West Michigan, Peterson is hitting .280 (60x214) with 33 runs scored, six doubles, four triples and 16 RBI. Sittinger has made 12 relief appearances for the Whitecaps, compiling a 2-0 record with one save, a 5.00 ERA (27.0IP/15ER) and 36 strikeouts.

ZIMMERMANN INJURY REHAB UPDATE: RHP Jordan Zimmermann made his second injury rehab start last night for Triple A Toledo vs. Buffalo, allowing one run on three hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 4.1 innings. Zimmermann has been on the disabled list since May 8 (retroactive to May 6) with a right shoulder impingement.

ABOUT MATTHEW: Boyd will make his 12th start of the season tonight in the series finale at Boston.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd did not factor into the decision on Saturday vs. Toronto, allowing four runs on six hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 7.0 innings.

VS. BOSTON: Boyd has made two career starts against the Red Sox, compiling a 0-1 record with a 12.00 ERA (6.0IP/8ER) and four strikeouts. His last start against Boston came on August 18, 2016, when he threw 6.0 innings and allowed one run on five hits with two walks and four strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Boyd has pitched in 34 games, including 32 as a starter, on the road in his career, compiling a 6-15 record with a 5.85 ERA (163.0IP/106ER) and 139 strikeouts. In five road starts this season, Boyd is 0-3 with a 4.23 ERA (27.2IP/13ER) and 21 strikeouts.

AT FENWAY PARK: Tonight marks Boyd's first career appearance at Fenway Park.

AGAINST THE AL EAST: Boyd has made 13 career starts against teams from the American League East, posting a 1-4 record with a 6.24 ERA (62.0IP/43ER) and 52 strikeouts. In three starts vs. AL East teams this season, Boyd is 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA (19.1IP/6ER) and 16 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JUNE: Boyd has started six games in his career during the month of June, compiling a 0-3 record with a 7.02 ERA (33.1IP/26ER) and 22 strikeouts.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS: Boyd currently ranks ninth in the American League with a .207 (47x227) opponents batting average and 10th with a 3.23 ERA (64.0IP/23ER).

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: After finishing the 2017 season on a strong note, Boyd has allowed three runs-or-less in eight of his first 11 starts this season. Over his last 15 starts dating back to September 12, 2017, Boyd has posted a 3.01 ERA (89.2IP/30ER) and 69 strikeouts. Among American League pitchers with at least 80.0 innings pitched during that time span, Boyd ranks seventh with a .202 (65x322) opponents batting average and ninth with a 3.01 ERA.

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MAY: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for May after posting a 3-2 record with a 3.18 ERA (34.0IP/12ER) and 31 strikeouts. He allowed three runs-or-less in five of his six starts in May.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Boyd threw 6.0-or-more innings and allowed one run-or-less in each of his first three starts this season. He became the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher since at least 1908 to work at least 6.0 innings and give up one run-or-less in each of his first three starts of the season.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Lefthanded hitters have posted a .255 (67x263) career batting average vs. Boyd, while righties are hitting him at a .276 (305x1107) clip. In 11 starts this season, lefties are hitting .152 (7x46) against Boyd, while righthanded hitters are batting .221 (40x181).

NEAR NO-NO: Boyd came just one out shy of his first career no-hitter on September 17, 2017 vs. Chicago (AL). Boyd threw 8.2 no-hit innings before allowing a double to Tim Anderson. He completed the shutout, allowing just one hit and striking out five.

STRONG FINISH TO 2017: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for September, 2017 after compiling a 1-3 record with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER), 30 hits allowed, 11 walks and 30 strikeouts. Boyd ranked fourth in the American League with 36.2 innings pitched during the month, while he was 10th with a .216 (30x139) opponents batting average.

NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Boyd was selected as a 2015 Minor League All-Star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors in 2015, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the Minor Leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.

EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN: Boyd picked up the first win of his Major League career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Boyd made his Major League debut with the Toronto Blue Jays on June 27, 2015 against Texas. Boyd took the loss in the game, allowing four runs on nine hits with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings. Boyd's seven strikeouts tied the Toronto record for most strikeouts by a pitcher making their debut as a starter (also, Mark Rzepczynski, July 7, 2009 at Tampa Bay). Also, his 6.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk were the most by a Toronto starter making their debut.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Boyd was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Daniel Norris and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015 in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Boyd was selected by the Blue Jays in the sixth round of the 2013 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Boyd attended Oregon State University and helped the Beavers to the 2013 College World Series. He earned All-Pac-12 First Team honors and was named a third-team All-American by *Baseball America* as a senior.

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer took the loss in his last start on Sunday vs. Toronto, allowing four runs on five hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND/AT COMERICA PARK: Fulmer has faced the Indians six times in his career, posting a 2-3 record with a 7.31 ERA (28.1IP/23ER) and 17 strikeouts. He started against Cleveland earlier this season on April 12 and suffered the loss, allowing nine runs, six earned, on eight hits with two strikeouts in 3.0 innings. Fulmer has made 29 career starts at Comerica Park, compiling a 9-10 record with a 3.68 ERA (183.1IP/75ER) and 128 strikeouts. In six home starts this season, Fulmer is 0-4 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2IP/20ER) and 21 strikeouts.

Belted his 465th career home run on April 28 at Baltimore...his 465 home runs are tied with Dave Winfield for 34th in MLB history...is three homers shy of tying Chipper Jones (468) for 33rd.
Posted his 46th career four-hit game in the first game of the doubleheader on April 25 vs. Pittsburgh...is tied with Willie Mays for the 23rd-most four-hit games in MLB history.
Named the AL Most Valuable Player in 2012 and 2013, joining Hal Newhouser as the only two players in franchise history to win the award in back-to-back seasons...one of only eight Tigers to capture the MVP award.
Is the all-time leader among Venezuelan-born players in home runs (465), RBI (1,635), slugging percentage (.552), extra-base hits (1,038) and total bases (4,658).
