The Mariners and Red Sox meet for the 6th (2-3) of 7 games in 2018...these clubs split a 4-game series in Seattle, June 14-17:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue an 11-day, 10-game, 3-city road trip with the second (0-1) of 3 games at Boston...began the trip by going 0-3 at New York-AL...following this series, will conclude the trip with 4 games at Baltimore...went 5-2 on a recently-concluded 7-day, 7-game homestand vs. Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and Boston (2-2)...tonight's game will be televised to a national audience on **FOX** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have lost 5 in a row...they have won 6 of their last 12 games, 13 of their last 21, 17 of their last 27, 22 of their last 33 and 24 of their last 37...Seattle is 32-19 in its last 51 games, 37-22 over its last 59 games and 42-26 in its last 68 games...Seattle is 14-13 during the day and 32-17 at night...Seattle is 25-14 at Safeco Field, 21-16 on the road.

- **20/20 Vision** - **Nelson Cruz** has hit at least 20 home runs in each of the last 10 seasons...he is the only player in the Major Leagues to record 20-or-more home runs in every season since 2009.
- **First Things First** - **Dee Gordon** is batting .361 (22x61) when leading off a game this season.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - **Jean Segura** leads the Major Leagues with 32 multi-hit games, ahead of Nolan Arenado-COL (30) and Nick Markakis-ATL (30)...Segura leads the Majors with 14 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (12).
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 33-10 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 13-20 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Stuff** - The Mariners have won or tied 21 of their first 25 series, posting a series record of 15-4-6.

BOOMSTICK, BABY!...**Nelson Cruz** had a monster game last night, going 4-for-5 with 2 home runs and 7 RBI...marked his 5th career game with at least 7 RBI and his 25th career multi-home run game...each of his homers was a 3-run home run, as he became the 4th player in club history with a pair of 3-run home runs in a game (also: Edgar Martinez, 5/26/97 at MIN, Bret Boone, 6/4/01 vs. TEX, and Justin Smoak, 5/30/12 at TEX)...Cruz is the 6th player in club history (done 7x) with at least 4 hits, 2 home runs and 7 RBI in a game, joining Mickey Brantley (9/14/87 vs. CLE), Butch Huskey (5/17/99 vs. MIN), Alex Rodriguez (2x, last: 9/30/00 at LAA), Bret Boone (6/4/01 vs. TEX) and Mike Cameron (8/19/01 at NYY)...Cruz is just the 11th visiting player to Fenway Park since 1908 to record at least 7 RBI (last: Lyle Overbay-TOR, 8/20/10 at BOS).

PITCH LIKE MIKE...since May 22, **Mike Leake** is 3-1 with a 2.59 ERA (12 ER, 41.2 IP) with 21 strikeouts and 5 walks in 6 starts...the Mariners are 5-1 in those 6 starts...Leake has worked at least 6.0 innings in each of his last 6 starts, including 2 outings of 8.0 innings pitched and 2 or fewer runs allowed (5/27 vs. MIN and 6/7 at TB)...he has allowed 2 or fewer earned runs in 5 of his last 6 starts, including 3 games in which he allowed just 1 earned run...5 of his last 6 outings have been quality starts...among American League leaders since May 22, Leake ranks T2nd in innings pitched (also: Trevor Bauer-CLE), trailing only James Shields-CWS (44.2 IP)...over that same stretch, he also ranks 11th in the AL in ERA and 8th in WHIP (0.98/5 BB, 36 H, 41.2 IP).

THE RACE FOR 20...**Nelson Cruz** has reached the 20-home run plateau before the end of June for the 4th time in his career and his 2nd time with the Mariners...following are the dates in the 4 seasons in which Cruz has reached 20 home runs before the end of June...2013 with Texas: June 26...2014 with Baltimore: May 31...2016 with Seattle: June 28...2018 with Seattle: June 22...prior to Cruz, the last Mariner with 20 home runs before the end of June was Bret Boone in 2003, who belted his 20th home run of the season on June 22.

YES IN DEE, DEE...**Dee Gordon** has hit safely in 10 consecutive games, dating back to June 12...during that span, Gordon is batting .395 (17x43) with 7 runs, 1 double, 2 RBI, 1 HBP, 1 walk and a .422 on-base percentage...he hit .346 (18x52) over a season-high 12-game hitting streak, March 29 - April 14...Gordon is one of 7 players in the Majors this season to have two hitting streaks of at least 10 games each, joining C.J. Cron, Freddie Freeman, Yuli Gurriel, Marcell Ozuna, Wilson Ramos and Andrelton Simmons...when Gordon records at least 1 hit, the Mariners are 31-17 (.646) this season, compared to 8-10 (.444) when he goes hitless.

CRUZ CONTROL...**Nelson Cruz** has 9 home runs in his last 13 games (6/9-c) and 10 home runs in his last 16 games (6/6-c)...since June 6, he leads the Major Leagues in home runs, ranking ahead of Paul Goldschmidt-ARI (8)...Cruz has hit safely in 21 of his last 28 games, dating back to May 24...during this span, he is batting .324 (33x102) with 19 runs, 3 doubles, 13 home runs, 30 RBI, 3 HBP, 11 walks, a .402 on-base percentage and a .735 slugging percentage (1.137 OPS)...**Cruz leads the Major Leagues in home runs since May 24**, while also ranking 2nd in RBI, 3rd in slugging and 3rd in OPS.

GOOD STRETCH...since May 8, the Mariners have a .628 (27-16) winning percentage, 3rd-best in the Majors over that span...they trail only Houston (.700/28-12) and New York-AL (.667/26-13), while ranking ahead of Milwaukee (.625/25-15) and Chicago-NL (.610/25-16)...the Mariners 27 wins are 2nd-most in the Majors since May 8, trailing only the Astros (28-12).

BUSINESS IS BOOMING...in 38 career games at Fenway Park, **Nelson Cruz** is batting .350 (55x157) with 29 runs, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 35 RBI, 1 HBP, 14 walks, a .407 on-base percentage and a .643 slugging percentage (1.050 OPS)...among active players at Fenway Park, Cruz ranks 2nd in slugging, 2nd in OPS, 3rd in batting and 4th in on-base percentage...among active players as visitors to Fenway Park, his 10 home runs are T5th-most (also: Chris Davis), trailing Jose Bautista (26), Evan Longoria (17), Edwin Encarnacion (17) and Adam Jones (13).

LEADERBOARD...this series features the top-2 American League leaders in RBI and saves, as well as two of the top-3 AL leaders in batting average and two of the top-4 league leaders in home runs...**Edwin Díaz** holds the top mark for saves in the AL with 27, ahead of Boston's Craig Kimbrel (22) and New York-AL's Aroldis Chapman (22)...Boston's J.D. Martinez leads the AL with 60 RBI, 5 more than **Mitch Haniger** (55) and Baltimore's Manny Machado (55)...the Red Sox Mookie Betts is batting .342 (77x225), 2nd-best in the AL, while **Jean Segura**'s .334 (99x296) average is 3rd-best...Martinez is tied with the Angels Mike Trout for the AL lead in home runs with 23, while Nelson Cruz ranks T4th with 20 home runs (also: Khris Davis-OAK).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Nelson Cruz** recorded his 5th career game with at least 7 RBI last night...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that since the RBI became an official stat in 1920, Cruz is one of 6 players in Major League history to collect 7-or-more RBI in at least 5 games?...he joins Lou Gehrig (9 such games), Ted Williams (6), Joe DiMaggio (5), Jimmie Foxx (5) and Alex Rodriguez (5).

ABOUT LEAKE...

- Michael Raymond Leake.
- 30-year-old right-hander is making his 16th start of the season, 21st Mariners start, 254th career appearance (249th career start) and 6th career start vs. Boston tonight.
- A native of San Diego, California, graduated from Fallbrook (CA) High School.
- Played in 3 seasons (2007-09) at Arizona State University...went 16-1 with a 1.71 ERA (27 ER, 142.0 IP) with 162 strikeouts and 24 walks in 19 games (18 starts) in his junior season (2009), earning *Baseball America* First-Team All-American, Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-Pac-12.
- Selected by Oakland in 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft... did not sign.
- Selected and signed by Cincinnati out of the 1st round (8th overall pick) in the 2009 MLB Draft.
- Is 19-12 with a 3.92 ERA (125 ER, 316.1 IP) in 49 career games (all starts) in June.

LAST OUTING...snapped a four-game win streak in the Mariners 3-9 loss to Boston on June 17...allowed 5 runs on 8 hits and 1 walk while striking out 1 batter across 6.0 innings...all 5 runs scored with two outs in the 3rd inning... loaded the bases (1B, 1B, BB) before allowing a 2-RBI single to Mitch Moreland followed by a 3-run home run to Rafael Devers; allowed another single before inducing a groundout to end the inning...did not allow a baserunner in his remaining 3.0 innings.

GETTING LOOSE...through Leake's first 25 pitches in a game, opponents are batting .364 (32x88) with a .391 on-base percentage and a .523 slugging percentage, but in pitches 26 through 100+, Leake has limited batters to a .234 average (58x248) with a .287 OBP and a .435 slugging mark.

GIVE 'EM A CHANCE...has exited 11 of his 15 starts with a lead (9 games) or a tie score (2 games)...in 2 of his other 4 starts, exited trailing 1-3 after 6.0 IP, and 0-3 in the 6th inning...the Mariners are 11-4 in his 15 starts this season.

HELLO, SEATTLE...since making his Mariners debut on Sept. 1, 2017, is 10-5 with a 3.97 ERA (55 ER, 124.2 IP) in 20 starts (12 quality starts)...during that span, Leake leads Mariners starters in wins, innings pitched and quality starts (12)...in 15 of his 20 Mariners starts, Leake has gone at least 5.0 innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs...the Mariners are 14-6 in Leake starts.

FOUR SCORE...is 12-1 with a 3.33 ERA (43 ER, 116.1 IP) in his last 18 starts in which he has received 4 or more runs of support, dating back to April 23, 2017...his clubs are a combined 15-3 in those 18 games (7-3 w/STL, 8-0 w/SEA)...for his career, Leake is 68-4 with a 3.42 ERA (246 ER, 647.1 IP) in 100 career starts when he has received 4+ runs of support; his clubs are 81-19 in those 100 starts.

TAKING HIS TURN...since making his Major League debut in 2010, has made 248 starts, 13th-most among all pitchers...among all pitchers since 2010, ranks 14th in innings pitched (1539.0).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 37 walks in 31 starts...was acquired along with cash considerations and international slot money from STL on Aug. 30, 2017 in exchange for minor league infielder Rayder Ascanio...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 2 walks in 5 starts with Seattle.

DURABLE...made 30 starts in each of the past 6 seasons...is one of 4 pitchers in the Major Leagues to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17, joining Jon Lester, Max Scherzer and Ian Kennedy.

GOING FOR DISTANCE...recorded 3 starts in 2017 of at least 8.0 innings pitched and 1-or-fewer runs allowed (4/7 vs. CIN, 5/24 at LAD and 6/30 vs. WAS)...only 6 pitchers in MLB made more such starts last season (Corey Kluber, 8, Chris Sale, 4, Carlos Martinez, 4, Zach Greinke, 4, Jacob deGrom, 4 and Carlos Carrasco, 4).

QUICK RISE...became the 21st player since the MLB Draft began in 1965 to appear in the Major Leagues before playing in a minor league game (last: Xavier Nady, SD, 2000)...became just the 13th pitcher to reach the Majors before appearing in the minor leagues (last: Ariel Prieto, Oakland, 1995)...made his MLB debut on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati after being selected by the Reds with the 8th overall pick in the 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft...appeared in 6 games (5 starts) with the Peoria Saguaros in the Arizona Fall League in 2009.

CAREER...has appeared in 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c)...has a career record of 90-81 with a 4.01 ERA (686 ER, 1539.0 IP) with 1,040 strikeouts and 363 walks in 253 career games (248 starts)...made his Major League debut in a start on April 11, 2010 vs. Chicago-NL with Cincinnati...selected by Oakland in the 7th round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...selected and signed by Cincinnati in the 1st round (8th overall pick) of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP MARCO GONZALES (7-4, 3.80 ERA)

26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 16th start of the 2018 season tomorrow vs. Boston...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 9 of his last 11 starts (4/24-c), going 6-2 with a 2.88 ERA (22 ER, 68.1 IP) with 6 quality starts over that span...L#4 in his last start, a 2-7 Mariners loss on 6/19 at NYY (6.1,8,6,6,1,5,HR-3); 6 runs are a career high, 3 home runs tie a career high...**CAREER:** Drafted by St. Louis with 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...made MLB debut with the Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado...is 12-7 with a 4.59 ERA (83 ER, 162.2 IP) with 138 strikeouts in 37 games (29 starts) in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c)...missed the 2016 season while recovering from ligament replacement surgery on his left elbow...**vs. BOS:** Has never faced Boston.
