**LEADING OFF:** Angels play the second contest (0-1) of a four-city, 10-game road trip to **Kansas City** (June 25 – make up for 4/15; 0-1), **Boston** (June 26-28), **Baltimore** (June 29-July 1) and **Seattle** (July 3-5)...**Halos have dropped three straight and are 4-10 in last two weeks**...LAA is now tied for third with Oakland and sits a season-high 10.5 games back of pace in A.L. West (3<sup>rd</sup> time)...Club is 7.0 games behind **Seattle** for second Wild Card spot...Angels are 28-35 since a club-record 13-3 start...Club is 11-11 this month...**16 of 24 games in July will be at home**...Angels are 6-12 when a left-hander starts (35-26 vs. RHS)...**LAA is 10-16 on road since a franchise-best 11-1 start.**

**NOW YOU KNOW:** This trip marks the sixth time in team history **playing three games in three time zones in three days (Anaheim, KC, Boston)**...Last time was Sept. 8-10, 2013 (Anaheim, Minnesota, Toronto) *STATS*.

**FRIENDS OF FENWAY:** **Andreton Simmons** checks in with a .395 (17/43) career clip in 11 games at Fenway...**Mike Trout** owns a .371 (26/70) career average in 16 games here...**Albert Pujols** is hitting .305 (25/82) with 10 doubles & four HRs in 21 games at Fenway.

**DID YOU KNOW?** Fenway Park is the only A.L. yard **Trout** has yet to homer in (he has at least 4 HRs at all other A.L. venues)... **Trout** did not appear here in 2017 (D.L.; ligament tear in left thumb).

**FROM THE START:** Halo starters have allowed three runs-or-less in 40 of last 50 games...**LAA starters have fashioned a 3.06 ERA (286.1 IP – 97 ER) since May 1, tops in MLB in span**... Angels are 25-26 in the 51 games during the stretch.

**SKAGGS STAYS HOT:** **Tyler Skaggs** is 3-1 with a 0.67 ERA (27 IP – 2 ER) this month (4 GS)...**The 0.67 ERA is a club record for June (min. 4 GS)**...**He has allowed two earned runs or less in 12 of his 15 starts**...His 2.69 ERA ranks eighth in A.L.

**TRIPLE THREATS at 1K:** June 21st marked the 1,000<sup>th</sup> career game for **Mike Trout**...He joins **Willie Mays** & **Alex Rodriguez** as only players in MLB history with at least a **.300 average, 450 extra-base hits & 150 stolen bases** at the 1K milestone.

**OHTANI UPDATE:** **Shohei Ohtani** (10-day DL; Grade 2 sprain of the ulnar collateral ligament in right elbow) received a stem cell platelet-rich plasma (PRP) injection June 7<sup>th</sup>...He has begun taking one-armed swings, running and tracking live pitches... **He is scheduled to be re-evaluated Thursday (6/28).**

**MAKE WAR:** **Trout's 6.6 WAR** this season (**Wins Above Replacement**) leads MLB...Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is **J. Ramirez** (CLE) at 5.3...**On pace for a 14.2 WAR campaign (BBREF) – would be best single-season mark in MLB history (Babe Ruth; 14.1 in 1923)**...**He has led A.L. in WAR in six of last seven seasons and his 60.7 career WAR is tops in MLB history thru 1,004 games.**

**ALWAYS ON:** Since his call-up in 2012, **Mike Trout** has never gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...**68 walks** are most in Angels' history through 79 games.

**DRAFT UPDATE:** With last Tuesday's signing of first round pick **Jordyn Adams** (17<sup>th</sup> overall) and **Jeremiah Jackson** (2<sup>nd</sup> round), **LAA has inked 26 of 40 2018 draft picks, including each of first 10 selections**...**On June 21, Jackson (.644, 15 HRs) was named the Perfect Game/Rawlings National HS Player of the Year.**

**JUNE BUG:** **Trout's .354 (204/576) career average in June** is highest among active players in any month (min. 400 PA)...This month, he boasts a slash line of .387/.505/.640 with 15 runs, five HRs & 12 RBI (18 BB/ 6 IBB)...**His top average for any month is .392 (10 HR, 23 RBI) in July of 2012, his first full season in MLB.**

**MINOR MINUTE:** Angels' top prospect **OF Jo Adell** with **Inland Empire** was named **Cal League Player of the Week for June 11-17**...During the span, he hit .536 (15/28) with 4 HRs & 11 RBI...Local product **Griffin Canning** (Santa Margarita HS, UCLA) made his first appearance with **triple-A Salt Lake** last Thursday (4 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 6 K)...**At three levels this season (High A - AAA), Canning boasts a 1.54 ERA (58.1 IP – 10 ER) with 67 Ks in 13 combined starts**...In 18 games since his promotion to **Salt Lake, Taylor Ward** has slashed to .333/.398/.577 and is batting a combined .333 with 10 HRs & 38 RBI in 62 games with **Mobile (AA) and Salt Lake.**

**SHELVED:** Angels currently have 12 players on the D.L...**On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)**...**48 players have appeared for Angels this season, most in MLB (Club record is 55 in 2017)**...**27 pitchers have played for LAA, most in team history thru 79 games (STATS).**

**MVP x 3?** Two-time A.L. MVP **Mike Trout** leads MLB in several offensive categories, including HRs (23), times on base (160), walks (68), OBP (.461), OPS (1.118) & OPS+ (209.5)...**Trout has more games where he has reached base 4+ times (13) than games he hasn't at all (11).**

**GLOVE STORY:** LAA has gone errorless in 52 of 79 games...**Club has 33 errors thru 79 G (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .989 fielding pct**...**Outfielders rank tied for third in A.L. with 15 assists**...**Catchers own a 50.0 caught stealing percentage, tops in A.L. (2<sup>nd</sup> in MLB)**...**Trout is one of four MLB CFs with a 1.000 fielding pct.**

**BATS ARE BETTER:** LAA offense held to three runs or less 16 times in May...**LAA has posted 4+ runs in eight of last 11 and in 13 of 22 games in June**...**Club's 33 HRs this month rank fifth in A.L.**...LAA totaled 36 HRs in May.

**PITCHING POINTS:** LAA pitchers have 38 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 79 affairs (LAA ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in A.L. with 723 Ks)...**Have issued 274 walks, third-most in A.L.**...Angels' bullpen has logged 292.1 IP, second in A.L. to TB... **15 blown saves are tied for most in MLB.**

**HOT HALOS:** **David Fletcher** has multi-hit games in three of his first four MLB starts (3 hits in MLB debut)...Over his last 25 contests, **Ian Kinsler** has 18 runs, seven doubles, eight HRs and 14 RBI...**Jose Briceño** has opened his big league career batting .375 (9/24) in eight games with an AB...**Martin Maldonado** is batting .290 (40/138) over his last 36 games to lift his batting average from .156 to .248...**Maldonado is fourth in A.L. batting .385 (20/52) with RISP**...**Andrew Heaney** has limited opponents to two-or-fewer earned runs in eight of last 11 starts with a 2.60 ERA (69.1 IP – 20 ER)...**Luis Valbuena** has three home runs and five RBI his last five games...**In his return from the D.L., Kole Calhoun has hit safely in five of seven starts batting .318 (7/22), with five runs, a double, two HRs and five RBI.**

**A BIT ON ALBERT:** **Albert Pujols** is 40 RBI shy of 2,000 – only two other players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – **Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez.**

**NO-K GUYS:** **A. Simmons** has struck out twice in last four games – had gone a span of 90 PA (4<sup>th</sup> longest in LAA history) without a K before the last four contests...He has struck out just four times since May 1 (179 PA)...He Leads MLB in PA per SO with 23.33 (280 PA/12 K) while teammate **Ian Kinsler** ranks third in MLB in PA per SO (10.56).

**ALBERT ALERT:** **Albert Pujols** is 27<sup>th</sup> all-time with 3,040 hits...**Rod Carew** is 26<sup>th</sup> at 3,053...His 3,000<sup>th</sup> hit came May 4<sup>th</sup> at **Seattle** to become fourth player with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (**Aaron, Mays & A. Rodriguez**)...**AP is seventh all-time with 1,960 RBI (BBREF)**...**L. Gehrig** is sixth with 1,995 RBI.

**AT BOSTON:** Red Sox swept Angels in Anaheim in first meeting (April 17-19)...**LAA is 8-5 in last 13 games at Fenway Park**...Halos claimed 2017 season series 4-2...**Since 2012, Halos are 26-16 overall vs. Red Sox**...**Albert Pujols** is batting .313 (56/179) with 10 HRs and 37 RBI in 46 career tilts vs. Boston...He owns a .323 (10/31; 2 HRs) career clip vs. **David Price**...**This series features top three in slugging in A.L. – Betts (.680), Trout (.657) and Martinez (.636).**

### THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

June 26

(1970) The Angels recorded their first triple play in Club history at Kansas City – "around the horn" on a ground ball hit by **Amos Otis** which was fielded by **Chico Ruiz**, who stepped on third base, then threw over to **Sandy Alomar** at second, who then flipped over to **Billy Cowan** at first; (2005) **Garret Anderson's** two-run, 8<sup>th</sup> inning double is the difference in a 5-3 win and series sweep of Dodgers... The two RBI push his career total to an even 1,000; (2012) Rookie **Mike Trout** makes a leaping, over the wall grab of a potential HR off the bat of **JJ Hardy** in the first inning at Baltimore...**Catch** is praised as one of the best of 2012.

June 27

(1978) **Joe Rudi** connected for a pinch-hit grand slam off **Steve Mingori** in the 7<sup>th</sup> inning vs. Kansas City in an Angels' 5-4 win.

**0-0, 5.40 ERA**

*First career start vs. Red Sox*

- **BACK IN THE BIGS:** Making third start of the season and second on the road for Angels...Was recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to start on June 16...**Is seeking first Major League win since June 1, 2016 for Reds at Colorado.**
- **ANGELS DEBUT:** Made Angels debut on June 16 at Oakland, which marked first Major League appearance since July 16, 2016 for Cincinnati (vs. Milwaukee)...Did not factor in decision after tossing five innings and allowing two earned runs on three hits with one walk and five strikeouts...Two of three hits allowed were solo HR (by **Chad Pinder** and **Marcus Semien**).
- **WITH THE BEES:** In 13 starts this season with Triple-A Salt Lake, is 1-0 with a 3.44 ERA (49.2 IP – 19 ER)...Recorded 54 strikeouts with 15 walks...**Bees were 13-0 in his starts this season...**In last four starts for Salt Lake, pitched to a 1.88 ERA (14.1 IP – 3 ER) with 13 strikeouts.
- **LEFT ON LEFT:** Held left-handers to a .234 (15/64) average this season for Salt Lake with one home run allowed (.266 average and six HR allowed vs. righties)...Lefties are 0-for-2 against him this season in the Majors.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in last start on Thursday vs. Toronto after working 3.1 innings and allowing three earned runs on six hits with one walk and four strikeouts in his Angel Stadium debut.
- **LOCAL PRODUCT:** Native of La Palma, CA and attended Laguna Hills HS...Is the first Angels starting pitcher from an Orange County HS since **David Huff** (Edison HS – Huntington Beach) in 2016.
- **VS. BOSTON:** Tonight marks first career appearance vs. Red Sox.
- **AT FENWAY PARK:** Tonight marks first career appearance at Fenway Park.
- **STARTER #10:** With his first start of the year on June 16, became 10<sup>th</sup> different starting pitcher for Angels this season...Halos have now used 11 different starters, which is tied for second most in the Majors this season.
- **FAMILY TIES:** Is the grandson of longtime Los Angeles public address announcer **John Ramsey**, who worked for the Angels for three seasons in the 1960s and again from 1979-84...His career included work for the Dodgers, Kings, Lakers, Rams, Raiders and USC football.
- **MAJOR LEAGUE EXPERIENCE:** Pitched parts of two seasons with the Reds (2015-16), going 2-12 with a 6.17 ERA (119.2 IP – 82 ER)...Recorded 116 strikeouts while walking 50).
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** Made six appearances (two starts) for Angels this Spring, going 1-3 with a 5.28 ERA (15.1 IP – 9 ER) with 16 strikeouts and six walks.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally drafted by Kansas City in fifth round of 2008 First-Year Player Draft out of Laguna Hills HS (20 miles from Angel Stadium)...Was traded by Royals with LHP **Brandon Finnegan** and LHP **Cody Reed** to Cincinnati on July 26, 2015 for RHP **Johnny Cueto**...Signed with Angels as a minor league free agent on Nov. 30, 2016 and resigned with Angels as minor league free agent on Jan. 22, 2018.
