THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-3 through seven games on their 10-game roadtrip, going 0-3 in Kansas City, 3-0 in Toronto and 1-0 in Boston...tonight they will play the second of four at Fenway Park...the Twins have gone 13-5 in their last 18...their current streak of four road wins is the second longest road-winning streak of the season (longest, 5 games from May 4-8).

GIBBY GOES GREAT: The Twins beat the Red Sox last night by a score of 2-1 at Fenway Park... Kyle Gibson (5-7) was the starter and winner, allowing one run on four hits in 8.0 innings pitched...Fernando Rodney earned his 22nd save with a scoreless ninth...the offense recorded eight hits as Mitch Garver drove in the winning run with an eighth inning double...Gibson's 8.0 innings pitched marked the second time in three starts he has gone 8.0 innings.

THE RUNNING MAN: Brian Dozier stole his 97th career base last night, passing Matt Lawton and moving into sole possession of eighth place on the Twins all-time list (since 1961):

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and Red Sox are playing for the fifth of seven scheduled meetings this season...Minnesota hosted Boston from June 19-21 at Target Field, taking two of three games...the Twins last series at Fenway Park came in four games June 26-29, 2017, going 1-3...they are just 6-10 in Fenway Park since the start of 2014.

- ☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .306 (19-for-62) with three doubles, two triples, one home run and four RBI in 19 career games vs. the Red Sox.
- ☞ Sox with Twins ties: Eduardo Nuñez was acquired by the Twins via trade with New York-AL in April of 2014 in exchange for left-handed minor league pitcher Miguel Sulbarán; Nuñez was traded at the deadline in 2016 for minor league pitcher Adalberto Mejía...J.D. Martinez was originally drafted by the Twins in the 36th round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft...Steve Pearce was originally drafted by the Twins in the 45th round of the 2003 First-Year Player Draft...he returned to play in spring training with the Twins in 2012 but was released at the end of March.

SINCE JULY 5: The Twins have gone 13-5 in their last 18 games...below are numbers from that stretch:

- ☞ Out-scored opponents 111-84 and out-hit 184-170.
- ☞ They are hitting .290 (184-for-635) with 37 doubles, 18 home runs, 111 runs scored, a .357 on-base percentage, .452 slugging percentage and a .809 OPS.
- ☞ In games since July 5, they rank first in baseball in runs and hits and average, tied-second in doubles, second in on-base percentage, and fifth in OPS...their 13 wins ranks them tied for first with and Oakland and Pittsburgh.
- ☞ Twins starting pitchers have tossed 102.2 innings across 18 games, tied-first with Pittsburgh for most in baseball...since July 5 Twins pitchers have been supplied with 111 runs of support, most in the baseball.
- ☞ On the road have allowed just four home runs since July 5, fewest in the American league and tied-third fewest in baseball...have the second lowest road ERA as a staff (3.48) to just Boston (3.47) in the AL.

GARVER IN A GROOVE: Mitch Garver is hitting .351 (27-for-77) with five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks and a .438 on-base percentage in his last 28 games, dating back to June 10...among AL players with at least 70 plate appearances since that date, he ranks fourth in batting average and sixth in on-base percentage.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1978, Mike Cabbage went 4-for-4 and became the fifth Twin to ever hit for the cycle (10 now) in a 6-3 win over Toronto...in 1991, Dan Gladden hit a walk-off three-run homer in the ninth inning to give the Twins a 7-4 win over Milwaukee...it was in the middle of a five-game stretch in which Gladden drove in 12 runs (4, 3, 3, 1 & 1).

HOF WEEKEND: This weekend former Twins Jim Thome and Jack Morris will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame...Morris, the St. Paul native, played one season for the Twins in 1991, going 18-12, 3.43 ERA (246.2 IP, 94 ER), including a World Series record that Fall of 2-0, 1.17 ERA (23.0 IP, 3 ER) in three starts against Atlanta earning World Series MVP honors...he pitched a Game 7 complete game 10-inning shutout with seven hits allowed, two walks and eight strikeouts opposite Hall of Famer John Smoltz...Thome, who played parts of two seasons with the Twins from 2010-11, hit 37 home runs in 179 games in a Twins uniform, including his 600th and 601st homers at Comerica Park on August 15, 2011, off Rick Porcello and Daniel Schlereth.

LAST START: Lynn suffered his eighth loss of the season after going 5.0 innings and allowing three runs on three hits, one home run and six walks...his six walks tied his season high, done once before in his first start of the season at Pittsburgh...has now allowed at least one home run in three of his last four starts after allowing just one from May 16-June 26 (8 starts)...his three hits allowed were his fewest of the month and fewest since June 20, also three.

AGAINST BOSTON: Lynn is making his second start of the season against the Red Sox and fifth of his career...is 1-1 with a 1.50 ERA (24.0 IP, 4 ER) with 10 walks and 13 strikeouts across his previous four starts...his last start against Boston came on June 20 at Target Field where he went 5.0 innings and allowed one run (unearned) on three hits, walking five and striking out two...has allowed four earned runs across four starts against Boston but nine runs have scored, marking five unearned runs and at least one in each start.

ROAD WOES: Lynn is 5-2 over nine starts with a 2.83 ERA (47.2 IP, 15 ER) and a .222 average against at home this season, allowing just four home runs...in 10 road starts, he is 2-6 with a 7.58 ERA (48.2 IP, 41 ER) and a .302 average against...his road ERA ranks highest in baseball among starters with at least nine road starts and his .302 average against ranks sixth highest in MLB and third highest in the American League.

JAMMIN' JUNE: In five starts in June, Lynn went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA (28.2 IP, 9 ER) with 14 walks and 31 strikeouts...among AL starters, ranked 14th in the AL in ERA and was tied for 15th in strikeouts...his nine earned runs allowed in the month were eighth fewest in the AL...opponents are only hitting .210 off Lynn this month, 11th best in the AL.

LYNN ON TARGET: Lynn has made nine start at Target Field this season...he has gone 5-2, 2.83 ERA (47.2 IP, 15 ER) with 31 walks, 45 strikeouts and four home runs allowed at home this season...after starting the season, going 0-2, 6.23 ERA (13.0 IP, 9 ER) in three starts, he has since gone 5-0, 1.56 ERA (34.2 IP, 6 ER) in six home starts...he has allowed more than one run in only one of those starts and has thrown at least 5.0 innings in each.

MR. 1,000: Lynn eclipsed the 1000.0 inning mark for his career in his start on April 30 against Toronto...there are 71 active players in MLB that have 1,000-or-more innings, 12 of those have 2,000+ IP and just two have 3,000 IP or more...Lynn ranks 71st in innings among actives with 1064.0 innings.

- First pitcher in Twins uniform to reach 1,000.0 innings pitched since Phil Hughes in April of 2015.
- Lynn also eclipsed the 1000 strikeout mark, now with 1020 strikeouts...there are 53 active players who have accomplished this.

WALK-A-LOT: Lynn is among the league leaders in walks in 2018, yielding 61 free passes in 19 starts, which is second most in the AL and third most in MLB...in 2017 Lynn ranked second in MLB and in the NL for most BB/9 (3.77) behind Arizona's Robbie Ray who had a 3.94 BB/9...his 3.77 mark was the highest of his career (2015 - 3.49, 2014 - 3.18, 2013 - 3.39, and 2012 - 3.27)...in his first season back from "Tommy John" surgery Lynn issued 78 walks in 186.1 innings...Lynn issued 44 walks on the road vs. 34 walks at home and of his 78 walks last season, 53 came against left-handed batters.

2017 RECAP:

- Lynn ranked tied for first in the NL in games started (33) sixth in AVG (.223), sixth in fewest H/9 (7.29), and seventh in ERA (3.43).
- Lynn had five starts of 7.0 or-more innings and 19 starts of 6.0 or-more innings, going 9-2 across those starts with 92 strikeouts.
- On May 5 against Los Angeles-NL, Lynn went 8.0 innings pitched while allowing just two hits, one run and 10 strikeouts.
- From April 17-May 5 Lynn had a season-high four-game win-streak posting a 0.72 ERA (25.0 IP, 2 ER) while striking out 23.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JAKE ODOORIZZI [SEASON: 4-6, 4.37 ERA ; CAREER: 44-44, 3.90 ERA]

Odorizzi finished the first half of the season 4-6, 4.54 ERA (101.0 IP, 51 ER) with 45 walks and 105 strikeouts...last start was against Tampa Bay on July 13, allowed six runs (five earned) on eight hits and one walk with three strikeouts over 4.1 innings. Odorizzi will be making his 18th career start against the Red Sox, having previously gone 4-5, 4.45 ERA (85.0 IP, 42 ER) with 29 walks and 71 strikeouts in 17 starts vs. Boston.
