THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-4 through eight games on their 10-game roadtrip, going 0-3 in Kansas City, 3-0 in Toronto and 1-1 in Boston...tonight they will play the third of four at Fenway Park...the Twins have gone 13-6 in their last 19.

TWINS SUFFER WALK-OFF IN FENWAY: The Twins lost to the Red Sox last night by a score of 4-3 in 10 innings, suffering their 10th walk-off loss this season, seventh via home run... Lance Lynn was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing two runs on six hits in 6.0 innings pitched...the offense recorded just six hits, two from both Jorge Polanco and Eddie Rosario.

SHELTY IN RELIEF: Manager Paul Molitor left the club to attend MLB's Hall of Fame ceremonies in Cooperstown, NY...bench coach Derek Shelton is filling in...2018 marks his first in the Twins organization and 14th in some capacity at the major league level...he was previously Toronto's quality control coach in 2017, Tampa Bay's hitting coach from 2010-16 and Cleveland's hitting coach from 2005-09.

☞ Molitor was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2004 (along with Dennis Eckersley) and is one of two players to be depicted on their plaque with a Brewers cap, Robin Yount the other.

TODAY'S ROSTER MOVE: The have recalled third baseman Miguel Sanó and left-handed pitcher Gabriel Moya from Triple-A Rochester...Sanó hit .309 (29-for-94) with three doubles, four home runs, 17 RBI, 19 walks and a .425 on-base percentage in 28 games between Single-A Ft. Myers and Triple-A Rochester since being optioned by Minnesota to Ft. Myers on June 14...Moya, who appeared in six games for the Twins over two stints earlier this season, recently appeared in six games for the Red Wings, posting a 2.79 ERA (9.2 IP, 3 ER) with three walks and 12 strikeouts.

THANK YOU, ESCOBAR: The Twins traded infielder Eduardo Escobar yesterday to Arizona for three minor leaguers...below is how Escobar got to Minnesota's organization: C A.J. Pierzynski drafted by Minnesota in 1994 >>> Pierzynski traded to San Francisco for P's Joe Nathan, Francisco Liriano & Boof Bonser in off-season of 2003 >>> Liriano was traded to Chicago-AL for Escobar and P Pedro Hernandez.

☞ On April 18 while the Twins were in San Juan to play the Indians, Escobar became the first Twin in club history to meet and take a picture with Actor Nicolas Cage...Cage was on the patio at the team hotel in Puerto Rico, Escobar asked him for a picture and explained how he is a fan of The Rock and Face/Off and that watching those movies helped him learn English.

TWINS THEN LATER TRADE PRESSLY: Ryan Pressly was acquired by the Twins in the Rule 5 Draft in 2013 from the Boston Red Sox...the Dallas, Texas native went 1-1 with a 3.40 ERA (47.2 IP, 18 ER), 19 walks and 69 strikeouts in a team-leading 51 games for the Twins this season.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: For Escobar, the Twins received right-handed pitcher Jhoan Duran, and outfielders Gabriel Maciel and Ernie De La Trinidad from Arizona...for Pressly the Twins received right-handed pitcher Jorge Alcalá and outfielder Gilberto Celestino from Houston.

☞ Duran, 20, made 15 starts for Arizona's Low-A affiliate Kane County this season, going 5-4 with a 4.73 ERA (64.2 IP, 34 ER), 28 walks and 71 strikeouts...Duran was named Arizona's mid-season 19th best prospect by MLB.com last off-season and 10th best by Baseball America.

☞ Maciel, 19, hit .287 (80-for-279) with 10 doubles, one home run, 16 RBI, 44 runs scored and 14 stolen bases...Maciel was named Arizona's 11th best prospect by MLB.com last off-season and was named as a Pioneer League Midseason All-Star in 2017.

☞ Trinidad, 22, has played two seasons in the Diamondbacks system, hitting .306 (154-for-504) with 23 doubles, 10 triples, 13 home runs, 81 RBI, 10 stolen bases and a .396 OBP.

☞ Alcalá, who turns 23 today, went 3-7 with a 3.29 ERA (79.1 IP, 29 ER), 35 walks, 82 strikeouts and three saves in 19 games (12 starts) between High-A Buies Creek and Double-A Corpus Christi...Alcalá was named as the eighth best prospect in Houston's organization this off-season by Baseball America and 10th best by MLB.com.

☞ Celestino, 19, played 36 games between Single-A Tri City and Double-A Corpus Christi, combining to hit .299 (40-for-134) with eight doubles, four home runs, 21 RBI and 14 stolen bases in 36 games...he was named 15th best prospect in the Astros organization by MLB.com.

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and Red Sox are playing the sixth of seven scheduled meetings this season...they are just 6-11 in Fenway Park since the start of 2014...a win tonight would give the Twins the season-series, their first since 2015 when they went 5-2...the Twins are 311-311 all-time against the Sox, including a record of 132-180 at Fenway Park and 179-131 in Minnesota.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1998, Todd Walker tied a club record with his ninth consecutive hit, in a 3-0 victory over Kansas City...he also matched a club record by reaching base safely 11 straight times...in 2012, the Twins acquired infielder Eduardo Escobar along with left-handed pitcher Pedro Hernandez from the White Sox, in exchange for Francisco Liriano.

HOF WEEKEND: This weekend former Twins Jim Thome and Jack Morris will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame...Morris, the St. Paul native, played one season for the Twins in 1991, going 18-12, 3.43 ERA (246.2 IP, 94 ER), including a World Series record that Fall of 2-0, 1.17 ERA (23.0 IP, 3 ER) in three starts against Atlanta earning World Series MVP honors...he pitched a Game 7 complete game 10-inning shutout with seven hits allowed, two walks and eight strikeouts opposite Hall of Famer John Smoltz...Thome, who played parts of two seasons with the Twins from 2010-11, hit 37 home runs in 179 games in a Twins uniform, including his 600th and 601st homers at Comerica Park on August 15, 2011, off Rick Porcello and Daniel Schlereth.

LAST START: Odorizzi did not factor in his second straight decision and his 11th no decision of the season...went 6.0 innings and allowed just two runs on six hits, walking one and striking out eight...marked his seventh quality start of the season and first this month...has recorded eight-or-more strikeouts five times this season...walked just one batter for his third consecutive start after walking four on July 3 at Milwaukee...has yet to record a win in the division despite eight starts.

AGAINST BOSTON: Is 4-5 in 17 career starts against the Red Sox with a 4.45 ERA (85.0 IP, 42 ER), 29 walks and 71 strikeouts...at Fenway is 1-3 with a 5.93 ERA (41.0 IP, 27 ER) across nine career starts...last start against Boston came on September 17, 2017 where he earned the win after going 6.0 innings and allowed two runs on one hit, one home run, two walks and six strikeouts...last start at Fenway came April 15, 2017, lasting 1.0 inning, exiting early with a hamstring strain...last win at Fenway came May 4, 2015 (5 starts since, 4 ND's, 1 L)...has allowed two-or-fewer runs 10 times to Boston and has only gone past the fifth inning eight times.

ON THE FIRST PITCH: Through his 21 starts this season, Odorizzi has allowed a .462 (18-for-42) average on the first pitch against a batter...on the 0-0 count, four of the 14 hits have been home runs and seven have been doubles...his .462 average is the highest of any full season in his career.

- On the contrary, when Odorizzi gets two strikes on a batter he is holding hitters to a .184 (45-for-244) average.

QUALITY NOT QUANTITY: Over his 21 starts this season, Odorizzi has averaged just over 5.1 innings/start...of starters with at least 21 starts, his 107.0 innings ranks as the fewest in MLB...his 18.9 pitches/inning ranks highest in MLB...he averages 4.34 pitches/batter faced which is most in MLB...though his starts have been on the short side, his 51 earned runs allowed ranks tied for 10th fewest in the American League among qualified pitchers who have started at least 21 games.

PROBLEMS WITH THE LONG BALL: Last season Odorizzi gave up 30 homers in 143.1 IP...in his 28 starts he had only five outings where he did not give up at least one home run...his 1.88 HR/9.0 IP ranked fourth highest in the AL and sixth in MLB...of the 30 HR, 15 were solo shots, eight were two-run shot five three-run homers, and two grand-slams...had five multi-homer games, four of which were at home (Tropicana Field)...he was slightly better on the road than at home last season, giving up 11 homers on the road as compared to 19 at home.

STILL NEED HELP: In Odorizzi's 21 starts in 2018, the Twins offense has supplied 49 total runs, good for a run support average of 4.12 runs per game...his run support average is lowest on the team among starters with at least 18 starts...the 49 runs of support rank fifth fewest in baseball and second fewest in the American League among starters with at least 21 starts.

FLY AWAY: In 2017 Odorizzi ranked fourth among all major league pitchers in Fly Ball Percentage (min. 140.0 IP) with a rate of 47.3%...he trailed Ariel Miranda of Seattle (52.2%), Marco Estrada of Toronto (50.3%), and Ian Kennedy of Kansas City (47.7%)...since 2014 Odorizzi has ranked in the top-10 in fly ball percentage every season: 2014 (2nd, 48.7%), 2015 (10th, 40.6%), and 2016 (9th, 44.4%)...in 2018, Odorizzi has allowed 128 fly balls, tied for sixth most in baseball.

A BRIGHT START: Odorizzi pitched in his first career Opening Day start and first career start for the Twins...he went 6.0 innings and allowed just two hits, while not allowing a run and striking out seven...only five other times in his career has he notched seven or more strikeouts while not allowing a run in 6.0-plus innings, the first since April 8, 2015 vs. Baltimore...he became the eighth different pitcher to start Opening Day for the Twins in the last 12 seasons.

2017 RECAP:

- In his fourth full professional season, Odorizzi started 28 games and tossed 143.1 innings...with a 10-8 record, this marked his third season of a .500 or better record
- His 7.97 K/9.0 IP ranked T-2nd best in his career (other, 2015 and best, 2014 with 9.32).
- On September 23, Odorizzi recorded nine strikeouts, a season high, while allowing just one run on three hits in 6.0 innings.
- Odorizzi held right-handed batters to a .228 average and lefties to a .210 average against.
