MEDICAL MATTERS—LH Vidal Nuño (right hamstring strain) is scheduled to go 2 IP in a rehab appearance for Class-A Charlotte tonight vs. Palm Beach (Cardinals)...Nuño has been on the disabled list since July 4 after suffering the hamstring injury in a 16-inning win on July 3 at MIA.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have won consecutive games, are 5-2 in their last 7 games and 9-6 in their last 15 games to improve to 62-59, one game shy of matching their high-water mark of the season (48-44 at the end of play on July 11 vs. DET)...five times previously the Rays have gone into a game with a chance to return to 4 games over .500, and they have lost each of those games...with a win today, it would be the *latest date* they've been at least 4 games over .500 since finishing the 2013 season at 92-71.

- + With yesterday's win, the Rays have won back-to-back road series for the first time since May 17-20 at LAA (3-1) and May 28-31 at OAK (3-1)...they entered this road trip with only one road series victory in their last eight attempts...this is the last series of a 9-game trip against three AL East teams: Toronto (2-1), New York (2-1) and Boston...it is their fifth of six three-city road trips this season.
- + Last year through 121 games, the Rays were 60-61 but only 1.5 GB of the second Wild Card...they are two games ahead of last season's record but are 10.0 GB of the Athletics for the second Wild Card.
- + Yesterday was the 20th time this season the Rays won without the benefit of a home run, tied with the Cubs for most in the majors...it gave the Rays their first series win at Yankee Stadium since June 30-July 2, 2014 and snapped a streak of 12 consecutive series losses there, the longest streak ever by any team in the current building.

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays have allowed 9 runs through 6 games of this road trip, including 2 runs or fewer five times and 1 run or fewer four times...they have allowed 1 run or fewer in back-to-back games for the second time this road trip and sixth time this season...the Rays allowed 3 runs against the Blue Jays, their fewest allowed in a 3-game series (or more) since Sep 29-Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL (3) and fewest on the road since June 19-21, 2015 at CLE (3)...the 6 runs allowed last series were their fewest allowed in a 3-game series (or more) against the Yankees since Sep 15-17, 2014 at home (4) and fewest at Yankee Stadium since Sep 24-26, 2013 (3)...they achieved this despite the Yankees entering the series having scored 5 runs or more in 15 consecutive home games.

HOUDINI ACT—Yesterday at NYY, Adam Kolarek inherited the bases loaded with no outs in the 9th and retired all 3 BF for his first career save...according to Stats LLC, he became the first pitcher in club history to enter with no outs in the 9th inn. or later and the bases loaded, strand all 3 IR and record the save...he was the first pitcher to do that in the majors since STL Jason Motte on May 9, 2012 at ARI, and the first pitcher to do that for his first career save since NYY Todd Erdos on April 17, 2000 at TEX.

- + Kolarek became the seventh Rays pitcher to record a save this season, tied for 3rd-most in the majors behind the Phillies (9) and White Sox (9)...only twice in franchise history have more pitchers recorded a save in a single season: 2009 (9) and 2015 (8).
- + Sergio Romo's next save will be the 100th of his career.

UP NEXT: RED SOX—Starting tonight, the Rays and Red Sox will meet six times in the next 10 days (Aug 24-26 at home) to wrap up the season series...while the Rays played the Red Sox in 13 of their first 48 games, tonight is the first meeting since May 24 at home, going 73 games in between...the Rays are 4-9 against them this season (2-5 at home, 2-4 on the road), but have only been outscored, 55-49...seven games have been decided by 1 run (1-6) and nine have been decided by 2 runs or fewer (2-7).

- + The Rays went 8-11 against the Red Sox last season and 7-12 against them in 2016...their next loss would mark a third straight losing season against the Red Sox for the first time since 2005-07.
- + The Rays will face three left-handed Red Sox starting pitchers in this series, the second time this season they will face all lefties in a series of 3 games (or more), following April 16-18 vs. TEX.
- + Xander Bogaerts has recorded 9 2B in 12 games this season against the Rays, only two shy of the single-season record against them.

ROSTER MAKEOVER—Fourteen of the 25 players on tonight's active roster weren't on it the last time the Rays played the Red Sox on May 24 at home...three were on the disabled list (Yonny Chirinos, Carlos Gómez,

Kevin Kiermaier) and Joey Wendle was on the paternity list...five were acquired via trade (Jalen Beeks, Ji-Man Choi, Tyler Glasnow, Michael Perez, Tommy Pham) and five were promoted from the minors (Jake Bauers, Diego Castillo, Adam Kolarek, Brandon Lowe, Hunter Wood).

- + Eight players on the active roster have never played at Fenway Park: Adames, Bauers, Castillo, Glasnow, Kolarek, Lowe, Perez, Wood.
- + Only 15 of the 41 players (36.6 pct.) from last year's season-ending active roster or disabled list remain in the Rays organization, and only three of the 36 players (8.3 pct.) from the 2016 season-ending roster or disabled list remain in the organization: Matt Duffy, Kevin Kiermaier and Blake Snell...Kiermaier is the only player who was on the roster for Kevin Cash's managerial debut in 2015.
- + Only four players have been on the club's active roster all season, without a stint on the disabled list or in the minors: C.J. Cron, Sergio Romo, Mallex Smith and Jesús Sucre.

PITCHING PLANS—Tonight's game will be started by Ryne Stanek, the 33rd time the Rays will use an opener and 20th time using Stanek in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of Chris Archer, Blake Snell, Nathan Eovaldi and Jake Faria...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 60 of 121 games (49.6 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 3rd in the majors and 2nd in the AL with a 3.41 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays are 36-32 with traditional starters and 26-27 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 46 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 37 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

REDEFINING RELIEF—The Rays bullpen has thrown 590 IP, most in the majors, ahead of the Padres (477.2 IP), and is on pace for 790 IP, which would be a major league record by more than 100 IP, ahead of the 2012 Rockies (657 IP)...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 43 apps of at least 50 pitches, most since the 1988 Yankees (43);
- + 19 apps of at least 70 pitches, most since the 1953 Dodgers (22) and most in the AL since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 107 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 2003 Devil Rays (112);
- + 50 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1995 Tigers (53);
- + 32 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1983 Athletics (32);
- + 21 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1982 Red Sox (21).

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH—Yesterday's game was the second time this road trip the Rays started rookies at catcher and all four infield positions—the only two times in club history they have done so...the Rays have used 20 different rookies this season, a club record and 3rd-most in the majors behind the Angels (21) and Marlins (21)...Rays rookies have combined for 503 games, most in the majors ahead of the Phillies (463)...Rays rookie pitchers have combined for 400.2 IP, most in the AL...the Rays have used a rookie starting pitcher in 15 of their 25 games since the All-Star break.

- + 12 of the 25 players on the active roster are rookies, including seven of the 12 pitchers and five of 13 hitters...nine of the 12 pitchers have less than 2 years of service time, as do six of the 13 hitters.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 22-28 (.440) in 1-run games, leading the majors in 1-run games (Mariners, 46) and 1-run losses (Mets/Orioles/Royals, 22)...the single-season club records are 56 1-run games (2010, 2015) and 30 1-run losses (2015)...41.3 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.8 pct. of games in the majors...47.5 pct. of their losses have come by 1 run, highest in the majors...their 50 1-run games are the most for a team through 121 games since the 2005 Nationals (50) and most for an AL team since the 1993 Royals (53), and their 28 1-run losses are most for an AL team through 121 games since the 1969 White Sox (28).

BUNDLE OF JOY—Rays President Matt Silverman and his wife, Andrea, welcomed daughter Casey Hannah Silverman into the world yesterday, weighing 6 lb, 7 oz...Casey joins sisters Alexa and Samantha.

LAST OUTING—Yesterday at NYY, entered with a 3-0 lead in the 8th inning and allowed an unearned run...yielded a 1-out single, then got a potential double play grounder that resulted in only one out on a E6 (throwing)...allowed a 2-out RBI double to **Giancarlo Stanton**, overturned from a home run following crew chief review...last started on Sat at TOR, going 1.2 IP—a perfect 1st inning and was replaced with 2-on, 1-out in the 2nd inning with neither run coming in to score.

- + This will be the fourth time in franchise history a pitcher starts on 0 days' rest, following Stanek on July 10 vs. DET, **Sergio Romo** on May 20 at LAA and **Erasmus Ramirez** on May 29, 2017 at TEX.

A NEW LOOK—Has made 19 starts, all since May 26 vs. BAL, four more than any other pitcher in the majors over that span...with tonight's start, he will become the first pitcher to total 20 starts and 20 relief apps in a season since TOR **Esmil Rogers** (20 starts, 24 relief apps) in 2013, and the first rookie to do this since MIN **Joe Mays** (20 starts, 29 relief apps) in 1999...before Mays, the last rookie to do it was LAD **Orel Hershiser** (20 starts, 25 relief apps) in 1984...this will be the 33rd time the Rays use an opener, all since May 19...he is 0-2 with a 2.51 ERA (28.2-IP, 8-ER) in his 19 starts.

- + Fifteen of his 19 starts this season have been scoreless...hasn't gone more than 2 IP or thrown more than 40 pitches (as a starter or reliever).
- + Has pitched to a 0.95 ERA (19-IP, 2-ER) in the 1st inning.

MAKING THE LEAP—Has allowed multiple runs in two of his last 8 apps (5 starts), but has pitched to a 1.86 ERA (38.2-IP, 8-ER) in 31 apps (17 starts) since the beginning of June to lower his season ERA from 4.66 to 2.42 and his career ERA from 6.08 to 3.42...min. 30 IP, his 1.86 ERA since June 1 ranks 6th in the AL.

- + Min. 40 IP, ranks 7th in the AL with a .174 opp avg. (30-for-172), and has held lefties to a .115 avg. (7-for-61) with 1 XBH (MIN **Jorge Polanco** double).
- + Has a 3.86 ERA (23.1-IP, 10-ER) in 19 apps (7 starts) on the road, while his 1.08 ERA at home is 8th-best in the AL (min. 15 IP).

THE LONG BALL—Has allowed 6 HR this season and five have come against the Orioles—and twice they went back-to-back off him...the other was a 2-run homer by **Mike Trout** on May 19 at LAA, his fourth app of the season...has allowed 4 HR in his last 8 apps (5 starts) spanning 9.2 IP, on the heels of a 36 IP homerless streak...has allowed 12 HR in 68.1 IP in his career for a 1.58 HR/9 IP ratio.

BRINGING THE HEAT—His avg. fastball velocity this season is 97.9 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL...last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and he made 14 pitches of 100 mph or more, the most by a Ray since **Fernando Rodney** (23) in 2013...entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the Best Fastball in the organization for a second consecutive season.

QUIRKS OF THE OPENER—He has made 5 starts this season without allowing a hit, most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)...according to Stats LLC, his 10 scoreless starts before the All-Star break were a major league record, passing STL **Adam Wainwright** (9) in 2014 and LAD **Sandy Koufax** (9) in 1963...from June 7–July 10, made nine consecutive scoreless starts to set a major league record—though he totaled only 13.2 IP over this span—passing LAD **Zack Greinke** (6, 43.2 IP), LAD **Orel Hershiser** (6, 55 IP) and LAD **Don Drysdale** (6, 54 IP).

FROM THE OTHER SIDE—Is winless in all 19 starts, passing **Jason Hammel** (17) in 2006-07 for the longest winless streak in club history...his 19 starts of 2 IP or fewer are the most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)—no other pitcher has made more than 8 starts of this type in a season...his 6 starts of 1 IP or fewer are one shy of tying the record held by PIT **Max Butcher** in 1940.

ELITE COMPANY—Named after Hall of Famer **Ryne Sandberg** despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher **Ryne Duren**...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, **Jared Sandberg**.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RH TYLER GLASNOW (1-2, 3.97 ERA)

LAST START—On Sun at TOR, made his third start with the Rays and his only run allowed came after a leadoff walk to the No. 9 hitter in the 6th inning, his only batter faced in the frame...went 5 IP and threw 79 pitches, both his most since June 3, 2017 at NYM (with PIT; 5 IP, 89 pit)...left in line for the win, before a 6th-inning RBI single from **Devon Travis** tied the game...his line: ND, 5 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 6 SO, 79 pit, 48 str.

EARLY RETURNS—Is the first pitcher in franchise history to begin his Rays career with three consecutive starts of 2 hits or fewer and 1 run or fewer...in fact, excluding openers, the only other Rays starter to do this at any point in his career was **Matt Moore** spanning two seasons from Sep

29, 2012–April 10, 2013 (3)...is 0-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12-IP, 3-ER) since the trade, and his 15.00 SO/9 IP ratio since Aug 1 is 2nd in the majors behind HOU **Justin Verlander** (15.51)...has allowed fewer walks (3) in 3 starts with the Rays than he did in his last relief app with the Pirates (4).

- + 66.0 pct. of his pitches with the Rays have been strikes, compared to 59.4 pct. with the Pirates...min. 150 pitches, since the start of August he ranks 18th out of 158 pitchers in pct. of pitches in the zone, according to StatCast, and he is 4th in swing-and-miss pct. (18.1) to **Hunter Wood** (21.3), **David Price** (18.8) and **Verlander** (18.2).
- + His max velocity with the Rays is 100.2 mph.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
