RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost consecutive games following a 4-2 start to the road trip and a streak of three straight series wins from Aug 7-16 vs. BAL, at TOR/NYY...they would need a win today to avoid ending the day with a .500 record for the 13th time this season...the Rays are 6-8 in their last 14 games since Aug 3 at CWS and 13-14 in 27 games since the All-Star break...today the Rays conclude a 9-game trip against three AL East teams: Toronto (2-1), New York (2-1) and Boston (0-2)...tomorrow they begin a 7-game homestand against the Royals (4 games) and Red Sox (3).

- + The Rays have allowed 12 runs through the first 2 games of this series, compared to 9 runs in their previous 6 games combined.
- + The Rays have trailed at the end of 14 consecutive innings, as they fell behind 4-3 in the 5th inning on Fri at BOS and last night fell behind 4-0 in the 1st inning...last night the Rays allowed 4 runs, 2 hits and 3 BB in the 1st inn., and 1 run, 2 hits and 0 BB after that.
- + Last night was the fifth time this season the Rays lost when yielding 4 hits or fewer, 2nd-most in the majors...it was their 20th loss when outhitting their opponent, compared to 12 losses in 2017.
- + With last night's loss, the Rays are a season-high 25.5 GB in the AL East...it is only the second time in the Rays era they have faced a divisional deficit that large—in 2016, they were as many as 27 GB.

NO BROOMS ALLOWED—38.5 pct. (15 of 39) of the club's series this season have ended in a sweep, as the Rays have swept eight series and been swept seven times...they have been swept three times in a 2-game series and four times in a 3-game series...they were last swept from Aug 3-5 vs. CWS (0-3), and they were last swept on the road from June 5-6 at WAS (0-2), and last in a 3-game series on the road from June 1-3 at SEA (0-3)...the Rays were swept three times in five series within the first 2½ weeks of the season, and they have been swept four times in 34 series since.

- + Today the Rays are attempting to avoid being swept by the Red Sox for the second time this season (April 5-8 at BOS)...a loss would mark the third time in franchise history they were swept multiple times at Fenway Park in the same season (2008, 2005).

HOT AND COLD—Since the All-Star break, the Rays have neither won nor lost more than 3 games in a row...in comparison, in the first half the Rays went on five separate winning streaks of 5 games or more and three separate losing streaks of 5 games or more...the Rays have held a .500 record or better at the conclusion of their last 36 games...the Rays reached a season-high 4 games over .500 with a win on July 11 vs. DET, but since then have been between .500 and 3 games over for 31 consecutive games...six times over that span they've had the chance to match their high-water mark of the season, and they have dropped all 6 games...they have also won five times over that stretch to avoid falling under .500.

RAYS vs. RED SOX—The Rays are 4-11 against the Red Sox this season (2-5 at home, 2-6 on the road)...seven of the 15 games have been decided by 1 run (1-6) and nine have been decided by 2 runs or fewer (2-7)...it is their third consecutive losing series against the Red Sox, the first time doing that since 2005-07...the Rays host the Red Sox next weekend to wrap up the season series and conclude a stretch of 6 games in a 10-day span against them...the Rays would need to go 3-1 or better in the remaining 4 games against the Red Sox to avoid matching their most losses against any opponent in the Rays era (6-13 against the Orioles in 2016).

- + **Xander Bogaerts** has 11 2B in the season series, tied with **NYD Derek Jeter** in 2004 for the most ever against the Rays, and his 14 XBH are two shy of the single-season record against them.

ROSTER MAKEOVER—While the Rays played the Red Sox in 13 of their first 48 games, the series opener was the first meeting between the clubs since May 24 at Tropicana Field...fourteen of the 25 players on the active roster weren't on it for the series finale of the last Red Sox-Rays series...three were on the disabled list (**Yonny Chirinos**, **Carlos Gómez**, **Kevin Kiermaier**) and **Joey Wendle** was on the paternity list...five were acquired via trade (**Jalen Beeks**, **Ji-Man Choi**, **Tyler Glasnow**, **Michael Perez**, **Tommy Pham**) and five were promoted from the minor leagues (**Jake Bauers**, **Diego Castillo**, **Adam Kolarek**, **Brandon Lowe**, **Hunter Wood**).

- + Only 15 of the 41 players (36.6 pct.) from last year's season-ending active roster or disabled list remain in the Rays organization, and

only three of the 36 players (8.3 pct.) from the 2016 season-ending roster or disabled list remain in the organization: **Matt Duffy**, **Kevin Kiermaier** and **Blake Snell**...Kiermaier is the only player who was on the roster for **Kevin Cash's** managerial debut in 2015.

- + Only four players have been on the club's active roster all season, without a stint on the disabled list or in the minors: **C.J. Cron**, **Sergio Romo**, **Mallex Smith** and **Jesús Sucre**.

RAYS vs. ROYALS—The Rays are 79-77 all-time against the Royals (47-35 at home, 32-42 on the road)...they swept a 3-game series at Kauffman Stadium from May 14-16, all 1-run wins, and it was their first sweep of the Royals since Aug 8-11, 2011 at home (4-0) and first on the road since July 17-19, 2009 (3-0)...the Rays are 6-4 against them since the start of last season, compared to 8-25 from 2012-16...the Rays have won consecutive series over the Royals after going 0-9-1 in their previous 10 series.

PITCHING PLANS—Today's game will be started by **Diego Castillo**, the 34th time the Rays will use an opener and their first time using Castillo in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 62 of 123 games (50.4 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 3rd in the majors and 2nd in the AL with a 3.47 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays are 36-33 with traditional starters and 26-28 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 47 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 38 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

REDEFINING RELIEF—The Rays bullpen has thrown 598.1 IP, most in the majors, ahead of the Padres (486.2 IP), and is on pace for 788 IP, which would be a major league record by more than 100 IP, ahead of the 2012 Rockies (657 IP)...so far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 44 apps of at least 50 pitches, most since the 1952 Dodgers (47) and most in the AL since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 20 apps of at least 70 pitches, most since the 1953 Dodgers (22) and most in the AL since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 108 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 2003 Devil Rays (112);
- + 51 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1995 Tigers (53);
- + 33 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1982 Red Sox (40);
- + 22 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1979 Mariners (22).

CRON ZONE—The Rays scored 2 runs in last night's loss, both coming on **C.J. Cron's** 6th-inning homer, his first since July 29 at BAL...it went 464 feet, according to StatCast, matching the longest by a Ray since StatCast started tracking them in 2015...it was also the 5th-longest hit at Fenway Park over that span and 3rd-longest by a visiting player, behind BAL **Manny Machado** on May 4, 2017 (466 feet) and SEA **Nelson Cruz** on June 22 this season (465 feet)...it was his 23rd HR, extending his career high.

ODDS & ENDS—Last night **Tyler Glasnow** went a career-long 6.2 IP despite allowing 4 runs in the 1st inning...it was the longest start by a Ray since **Yonny Chirinos** on July 24 vs. NYY (6.2 IP) and the longest on the road since **Nathan Eovaldi** on July 8 at NYM (7 IP)...it was the first time a Rays starter went more than 5 IP since **Chris Archer** on July 27 at BAL.

- + **Sergio Romo's** next save will be the 100th of his career.

TODAY'S START

- + Will be making his first career start (30th app)...will become the 16th different starting pitcher used by the Rays this season, extending the club record (14 in 2003 and 2004) and major league lead (Angels, 14)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 16 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17)...is one of a club-record 31 different pitchers used by the Rays this season, tied for 4th-most in the majors and tied for 2nd-most in the AL behind the Angels (34).
- + Made 1 career start in the minors, going 1 IP on July 25, 2017 at Triple-A Buffalo.
- + On Fri at BOS, pitched a perfect 8th inning on 11 pitches, retiring the Red Sox 8-9-1 batters, including a strikeout of **Blake Swihart** to start the inning.
- + His last 4 apps and six of his last 7 apps have been scoreless after allowing multiple runs in four of his previous 5 apps from July 15-29.
- + Has gone 1.1 IP or longer 10 times this season, and 2 IP or longer seven times...has entered with the Rays tied or up by 1-2 runs in 18 of 29 apps.
- + His avg. fastball velocity this season is 97.0 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 99.1 mph in his outing on July 2 at MIA.
- + Recalled from Triple-A Durham on June 5...went 0-1 with a 1.03 ERA (26.1-IP, 3-ER), 4 saves, 32 SO and .167 opp avg. in 19 apps for the Bulls.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- + On July 1 vs. HOU, inherited the bases loaded with 1 out in the 8th inning...struck out **José Altuve** in a 10-pitch at-bat a got a groundout for the third out.
- + Recorded multiple strikeouts in the first 5 apps of his career, all as a reliever, the first reliever to do that since LAD **Grant Dayton** in 2016, and first AL reliever to do it since TEX **Neftalí Feliz** in 2009, according to Baseball Reference...was the only Rays reliever to begin his career in this fashion.
- + On June 13 vs. TOR, recorded his first career win in his fourth career app...his only baserunner allowed in 2 IP was a 8th-inning, 2-out single.
- + On June 6 at WAS, made his major league debut and pitched a perfect 7th inning, including strikeouts of **Brian Goodwin** and **Trea Turner**.

2017 SEASON

- + Split the season between Double-A Montgomery and Triple-A Durham, earning a June 3 promotion...marked the third straight year he received an in-season promotion...combined to go 4-5 with a 2.76 ERA (71.2-IP, 22-ER) and 15 saves in 51 apps (1 start) between the two levels.
- + Named Minor League Reliever of the Year by the Rays Baseball Operations dept. ...led the Rays system in saves (15) for a second consecutive year.
- + Recorded the save in the Governors' Cup clinching win over Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (Yankees) and the Triple-A National Championship Game over Memphis (Cardinals)...did not allow a run in 4 apps in the IL postseason spanning 5 IP (1-H, 0-BB, 8-SO).

- + Diego is one of 10 children—and all of them are married...he has six brothers and three sisters.
- + Diego is known to cook for his teammates...he learned to cook as a 10-year-old by watching his mother in the kitchen...he once shared his special family recipe of chicken, rice and plantains in a November 2016 cooking video on the Rays Twitter account.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
