AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 0-3 so far on their seven-game road trip...includes 4G at Boston (0-3) and 3G at Chicago-AL (Mon.-Wed.)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand (3-1 vs. Kansas City, 1-1 vs. Baltimore).

- ▶ At 68-41 (.624), have the Majors' third-most wins and third-best record behind Boston (78-34, .696) and Houston (71-41, .634)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 84 of the last 94 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 27G over .500...are 0-4 since reaching their season high watermark of 31G over at the end of play on Tuesday...had not reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ Are a season-high 8.5G behind first-place Boston in the AL East...is the farthest back they have been in the AL East since finishing the 2016 season 9.0G behind Boston.
- ▶ Have still lost just five of their last 32 series (incl. this series), going 21-5-6 since 4/19...are 59-32 in their last 91G...are 6-9 in their last 15 games.
- ▶ Are 50-9 (.847) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 42-6 (.875) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Are 1-4 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days (7/31-8/19).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees lost a season-high fourth consecutive game with a 4-1 defeat on Saturday at Boston...**RHP Chance Adams** (5.0IP, 3H, 3ER, 1BB, 2K, 2HR) made his Major League debut and took the loss...scored their lone run with two outs in the ninth inning on an RBI double by **SS Didi Gregorius** (1-for-4)...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 1R) had a pair of doubles...**CF Aaron Hicks** (0-for-2) had 2BB...put the potential tying run on base in the ninth.

- ▶ In RHP Nathan Eovaldi, faced a former Yankee starting for the Red Sox for the first time since 10/1/15 (Rich Hill).

ONE CHANCE AT A FIRST IMPRESSION: **RHP Chance Adams** made his Major League debut on Sat. at Boston, allowing 3ER in 5.0IP (3H, 1BB, 2K).

- ▶ Became the fourth Yankee since 1994 to debut as a starting pitcher and allow fewer than one base runner per inning...joined Luis Severino (8/5/15 vs. Boston), Chase Whitley (5/15/14 at the Mets) and Matt DeSalvo (5/7/07 vs. Seattle).
- ▶ Was the fourth Yankee pitcher since 1965 to draw a start vs. Boston for his Major League debut, joining RHP Luis Severino (8/5/15), LHP Randy Keisler (9/10/00) and RHP Sam Militello (8/9/92).
- ▶ Was the second player from the Yankees' 2015 draft class to reach the Majors, and the first to make it as a Yankee (also Baltimore RHP Cody Carroll).

WALK WITH ME: **CF Aaron Hicks** drew 2BB on Saturday at Boston and has at least 1BB in 11 of his last 12 starts (15BB total)...had a streak of 10 consecutive starts with at least 1BB from 7/15-8/2, the second-longest streak in the Majors this season (Joey Votto-11 starts from 6/15-26).

- ▶ Has reached safely in 20-of-36 plate appearances in his last 9G, batting .375/.556/.667 (9-for-24) with 9R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI and 11BB.
- ▶ His career-high 55BB are tied for eighth in the AL...ranks ninth in the Majors with a 14.8% walk rate.
- ▶ Has also set career highs with 18HR and 34 extra-base hits (14 doubles, 2 triples).
- ▶ Ranks ninth among Major League outfielders (and third among center fielders) with a career-high-tying 3.3 WAR (FanGraphs).

ROUGH PATCH: The Yankees have lost a season-high four straight games...is their longest losing streak in exactly one year, since they went 0-4 from 8/1-4/17.

- ▶ The Yankees were the 29th different team to lose four straight games in 2018 (only Boston has not done it).

ALL THAT'S LEFT: The Yankees are 12-2 in games vs. left-handed starting pitchers since 5/25...are a Major League-best 24-7 (.774) when they face a left-handed starter in 2018.

- ▶ Have faced just two left-handed starters in their last 22 games since 7/9 (lost to Brian Johnson on Thurs. at Boston, defeated Steven Matz on 7/21 vs. the Mets).
- ▶ **Yankees batters** are hitting .263/.350/.494 vs. left-handers in 2018...their .845 OPS vs. southpaws leads the Majors...are the only team at .800-or-better.

PRICE CHECK: In his last start vs. the Yankees on 7/1 at Yankee Stadium, Red Sox starter David Price set a career high by allowing 5HR and tied a career high with 8ER (in 3.1IP)...was the 12th time in Yankees history that they hit at least 5HR off a single pitcher...three of the last four are Red Sox (also Clay Buchholz on 4/20/12 and Josh Beckett on 8/23/09).

- ▶ Price has a 24.92 ERA (4.1IP, 12ER) in two starts vs. the Yankees this season.
- ▶ **Yankees batters** have scored at least 5R in 7-of-9G vs. Price since the start of 2016, batting .361 (74-for-205) with 13HR against him...over the same span, Price has gone 2-6 with an 8.43 ERA (47.0IP, 44ER) in his nine starts against the Yankees.
- ▶ Nine of his 19 career starts with at least 6ER allowed have come vs. the Yankees...three of his five career starts with 8ER allowed have come vs. the Yankees.

BEASTLY EAST: After starting 18-9 against the AL East (through 6/16), are 8-14 in their last 22G vs. the division...are 26-23 in divisional play and 42-18 outside the division.

- ▶ Are 14-8 at home and 12-15 on the road.
- ▶ Are 2-8 in their last 10 games at Fenway Park (since 7/16/17-G2)...have lost four straight here, matching their longest skid in Boston since dropping seven straight from 9/28/08-6/11/09.

DOUBLE DUTCH: **SS Didi Gregorius** hit an RBI double in the ninth inning on Sat. at Boston, providing the Yankees' lone run...has 13RBI in 14 games since the All-Star break.

- ▶ Has at least 20HR in each of the last three seasons (20HR in 2018, 25HR in 2017, 20HR in 2016)...is the only Yankees shortstop ever to hit 20HR in consecutive seasons (min. 50% of G at SS)...tied Derek Jeter (1999, 2001, '04) for the most 20HR seasons by a Yankees shortstop...joins Colorado's Trevor Story as the only shortstops to hit at least 20HR in each of the last three seasons.
- ▶ Is batting .433 (13-for-30) in his career vs. David Price.

STANTON ISLAND: **OF Giancarlo Stanton** hit a pair of doubles on Sat. at Boston.

- ▶ Is batting .409 (18-for-44) with 11R, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR, 9RBI, 3BB, 2HP and 2SB in 12 games vs. Boston this season...has hit safely in 10-of-12 games.

JUST DÚ IT: **3B Miguel Andújar** has hit safely in 24-of-28 games since the start of July, batting .324/.367/.451 (33-for-102) with 14R, 7 doubles, 2HR, 10RBI, 6BB and 1HP.

- ▶ Leads all rookies in BA (.292), doubles (30), extra-base hits (46), total bases (184) and slugging (.497), and is second in hits (108) and runs (50) and third in RBI (48).

DELLIN DONUTS: **RHP Dellin Betances** has allowed just 1R in 24.0IP (8H, 13BB, 41K, 3HP) over 25 appearances since 5/27...opponents are hitting .104 (8-for-77) in that span.

- ▶ His current streak of 24 consecutive relief appearances with at least 1K (since 5/29) is the second-longest in Yankees history, behind Andrew Miller's streak of 28G from 5/6-7/17/16...has at least 1K in 42-of-44 appearances this season.

GREAT BRITTON: **LHP Zach Britton** allowed 1H over 0.2IP on Thursday at Boston...in 30 career *relief appearances* vs. Boston, has posted a 0.99 ERA (36.1IP, 30H, 6R/4ER, 13BB, 34K, 2HR).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 5, 2001: Former Yankee Dave Winfield is inducted into the Hall of Fame. Though he dons a Padres cap on his plaque, Winfield played with the Yankees from 1981-90, hitting 205HR in pinstripes.

Aug. 5, 1939: Red Ruffing earns the win in a 6-1 victory vs. Cleveland. It is his 169th win as a Yankee, surpassing Bob Shawkey for tops on the all-time franchise list among right-handed pitchers -- a mark Ruffing still holds today with 231 wins in pinstripes.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 6, 1979: After delivering a eulogy at Thurman Munson's funeral earlier that morning in Canton, Ohio, Bobby Murcer hits a three-run home run in the seventh inning and a two-run single in the ninth, driving in all five Yankee runs in an emotional 5-4 comeback win vs. Baltimore.

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 5-7 vs. the Red Sox in 2018...will play the 13th of 19 games tonight (9G in the Bronx, 10G at Boston)...are 19-15 in 34G vs. Boston since 9/27/16...**SEASON SERIES:** Have won four of the last six season series (2012-17)...have lost just four of 17 season series between the clubs since 2000, going 11-4-3 over the span...**AT FENWAY PARK:** Are 1-5 at Fenway Park in 2018...went 5-4 at Fenway Park in 2017...are just 8-17 at Fenway Park since the start of 2016, but are 31-30 there since the start of 2012...have won 8-of-14 series at Fenway Park since the start of 2014 (8-5-1)...are 498-481-4 (.508) all-time at Fenway Park, the only visiting AL team with a winning record there.

RHP Masahiro Tanaka will make his 18th start of the season in tonight's finale at Boston...the 29-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...has an 17.1-inning scoreless streak, 0.1IP shy of his career high (17.2IP)...tossed his third career complete-game shutout on 7/24 at Tampa Bay (3H, 1BB, 9K)...was on the 10-day D.L. from 6/9-7/10 with mild strains of left and right hamstring (missed 29 team games)...is undefeated in his last 13 starts, going 7-0 with a 3.20 ERA (76.0IP, 27ER) and 77K...has 160 career wins between MLB (61) and NPB (99)...went 13-12 with a 4.74 ERA (178.1IP, 180H, 100R/94ER, 41BB, 194K, 35HR) in 30 starts in 2017...recorded his 700th career strikeout on 6/2/18 at Baltimore, becoming the sixth Japanese pitcher to record at least 700 Major League strikeouts...was only the second Yankee to record at least 700K through his first five Major League seasons (Andy Pettitte-709K through five seasons)...the 2014 AL All-Star was acquired by the club via the posting system from the Rakuten Golden Eagles of Japan and signed to a seven-year contract on 1/22/14...his contract runs through the 2020 season.

LAST START: Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings (3H, 2BB, 8K, 1HP, 1WP) on Tuesday vs. Baltimore to earn his ninth win of the season...extended his scoreless streak to 17.1 innings (since the fifth inning on 7/15 at Cleveland)...O's batters were 0-for-7 with RISP.

ON DECK: With his next win, would become the second pitcher in Yankees history to reach double-digit wins in each of his first five Major League seasons, joining Andy Pettitte, who did it in each of his first nine campaigns (1995-2003).
